

Which candidate will deserve your vote?

Use this easy “Test Kit”.

Your chance to play an important role in the coming election is at hand.

The best opportunity for getting the attention of your sitting Member or any candidate for election is prior to the poll when they are seeking your vote. Don't let this opportunity slip away.

It has been made easy for you. Just send the questionnaire to the sitting Member and as many as possible of the other candidates offering to represent you. Discover which one is worth your vote!

The Kit contains a copy of a covering letter and questionnaire to post to candidates.

What you need to do:

1. Get several copies made of the questionnaire and covering letter so you will have a copy to send to all candidates. Keep one for your record.
2. Watch the local press for names of candidates contesting the seat. Maybe ring the Party office for the **private postal address** of the candidate. Avoid sending the questionnaire to Party Head Offices because you want the actual candidate to reply.
3. Promptly post to the candidates; the questionnaire, together with the covering letter (see separate page) and a self-addressed envelope for their convenience.
4. Keep all replies on file.
5. Spread the message - email copies of the Kit to your contacts.
