The Attack on the White Australia Policy

It Suits Tojo—What About You?

The "White Australia Policy" is the latest target for attacks by our leading Planners. "When these Planners and the powerful groups behind them start to attack any traditional policy of the people, it is time to examine closely what is proposed and consider its probable effects.

The White Australia Policy is based

The White Australia Policy is based on the belief that the entrance of Asiatics or other coloured peoples into this country would mean the elimination of the present predominantly Anglo-Saxon population and our way of life.

The Communists have always been opposed to the White Australia Policy, and, judging by recent statements, will probably attempt to have pressure brought to bear through the International Trade Union Conference to be held in London in June, significantly enough, the Australian Workers Union, which so far has resisted Communist control, and is outspoken in its support of the White Australia Policy, has refused to send delegates to the London Conference.

Conference.

Not only are the Socialistic Planners Not only are the Socialistic Planners advocating the abolition of the White Australia Policy; their friends controlling the —ier Financial Policy in this country are also in favour of extending internationalism here. It is alarming to note that Mr. Curtin has failed to rebuke some of his own appointees, such as Dr. Lloyd Ross, when they officially attack our basic immigration policy. There appears to be no doubt that the pressure is being applied by those internationalists who love to talk about "the masses." To them, the "masses," apparently the bigger the number, are only regarded as raw material to be planned, pushed around, and experimented upon.

Considerable evidence has, from time to time been brought forward in these columns, proving that this war was produced for the purpose of destroying British culture and permanently enthroning the International Jewish groups, who believe and say they are destined to rule the world, as controllers of the new "World Order."

It is significant that, while the

It is significant that, while the International Jewish Oligarchy and those groups permeated with the Jewish philosophy advocate the mixing of races as part of the programme of internationalism, the Jews themselves endeavour to keep their own race free from outside influence as the result of mixed marriages. There is no doubt that the population question is one of Australia's big problems. But an idea is being encouraged, by certain people, that there are some peculiar inherent virtues in big populations. Writing about this notion in "The Big Idea," C. H. Douglas says:—

"Now the first point to observe is that it finds no support in history. . . . Greece, Rome, Venice, Spain, Holland, England, all of them small, have all, in their turn, set the fashion to civilisation, and, in every case, their eminence has

and, in every case, their eminence has not only been in the midst of far greater, and in many cases, opposing populations, but has, for the most part, been most clearly marked at a period when the disperity in many cases.

when the disparity in numbers was greatest."

Shakespeare's England had a population not greatly in excess of Victoria's present population. The biggest tragedy concerning our population is the fact that artificial exceptions, and a content out. resulted in the frustration of one of the most fundamental human desires; to have children. This frustration must be overcome; but it is not going to be overcome; as some suggest, by encouraging millions of European immigrants whose birth-

of European immigrants whose birthrate is in most cases as low as our own.

From the point of view of developing a real political and economic democracy in this country, the entrance of large numbers of politically inexperienced or "fascist"-conditioned refugees from war-torn Europe would be a terribly grave liability. It has been hard enough to educate our fellow Australians!

The rate at which our population could thoroughly absorb even small numbers of

thoroughly absorb even small numbers of such Europeans would be very slow. We already have the example of the Italians in North Queensland and elsewhere. One

have absorbed into our community people from European countries in very small numbers. But one strongly suspects that certain power-lusting Planners would be delighted to have several millions of politically inexperienced and "fascist"-conditioned Europeans to push around, and to make it easy to push US around. And one suspects that that is why they would like to see millions of Oriental immigrants here.

It is rank hypocrisy to suggest that bringing even IQQQQQQ Asiatics into this country would relieve, to any appreciable extent, the alleged "population pressure" in Eastern countries.

The standard of living in every Eastern country could be raised immeasurably by the application of modern scientific production methods. But a sane financial policy is required. Well there is little we can do about other countries, but we can put our own house in order. By so doing we could set a practical example for other countries. This is the greatest contribution we can make to the saving of contribution we can make to the saving of civilisation and the solving of the problems of Eastern countries. But to allow our sympathies for the Indians or other Orientals to be used to let them in here, and reduce us to the standards of Oriental countries is criminal properties.

Oriental countries, is criminal nonsense.

The philosophy behind that idea is the same philosophy which has given rise to the pernicious policy that, because some of our people live in slums, others should not be allowed to live in nice houses. Those with a little economic independence

must preserve it if they are going to save themselves and their less fortunate fellows. And that is the attitude we must adopt towards the suggestions that we abolish our White Australia Policy.

Apart from the economic and political aspects of our present immigration policy, there is not be a solition to the solitic transfer of the solitic

Apart from the economic and political aspects of our present immigration policy, there is another point just as important C. H. Douglas deals with it in "Programme For The Third World War":—
"Such ideas as 'fairness,' 'decency' and what we might call the realistic Christian virtues convey nothing to the Oriental as such. Perhaps I may with advantage observe at this juncture that many Orientals compare very favourably with many Europeans on every ground. That does not invalidate the main contention, which is that the Oriental has virtues of his own, but they are not in the main the same virtues as those of the European..."

Most thinking Australians are not snobbish or insulting when they uphold the White Australia Policy; they don't look down on the Indians or the Chinese or others because they have differently coloured skins: but they honestly face the FACT that the Oriental way of life is not our way of life.

our way of life.

Australians must realise that we can only preserve and develop our British culture in this country by a natural increase from our own stock. To do this we must de-

velop full control of our own institutions and make Australia a real functioning democracy; ensure that economic conditions do not prevent young Australians from getting married and having children when (Continued on page 4.)

NOTES on the NEWS

As a result of the people's pressure on their political representatives, the Federal Government has been compelled to release for housing purposes some materials and manpower which they insisted was not available. However, the Government has yet to realise that what the public demands is the removal of all such restrictions on manpower and materials; in other words, that the Government stand aside and let the people get on with the job. The paltry sop offered, of 300 homes in Victoria, merely to quieten some of the homeless, will not be accepted as sufficient. The politicians must learn that their job is to obey their electors, and electors must learn that their job is to instruct their paid servants.

COMMUNISTS CHALLENGED: A correspondent in the Melbourne "Herald" of February 16 endorsed a broadcaster's suggestion that "provision should be made to send members of the Communist Party to Russia to fight for that country." The correspondent made the point that "this would be a splendid opportunity for Communist leaders and 'second-fronters' to come into the open and display their sincerity by organising a Communist Brigade." So far the Communists have failed to adopt the suggestion; it's a wonder they failed to think of such an excellent method of demonstrating their sincerity. ing their sincerity.

POWERS PLOT: The Melbourne "Age" of March 17 devoted its leading article to advocating a betrayal of the people: urging the State Premiers to surrender the "powers" without consulting the people through a referendum. In the same issue it heavily featured Drs. Coombs and Lloyd Ross (both Planners) and others at the Heidelberg Town Hall, who were extolling the benefits of the totalitarian way of life made possible by the transfer of power over the people's lives to the Planners. Now we know where the "Age" stands.

MANAGED MARRIAGES: The Press of February 21 informs us that the U.S. authorities are now empowered to carry out certain investigations regarding impending marriages between U.S. servicemen and Australian girls. Home conditions of both parties may be examined to see that there parties may be examined to see that there is not too great a disparity between the couples, and to make sure that the "buddy" will be able to support a wife after the war. From this it seems that the authorities. ties (whoever they are) do not overrate the "nous" of the Yanks; they evidently can trust them to fight, but not to marry. Maybe after this, the famous Statue of Liberty will be fitted with a shroud.

GESTAPO GIRLS: Mr. Archie Cameron's charges against the Government of employing "Gestapo Girls" to tap civilian 'phone calls indicate that Hitler might even have something to learn from our Labor champions. Of course, there may not be anything sinister about this practice; it may merely be part of the post-war "employment for all" plan, and the girls may be undergoing training as intelligence squads to detect inefficient 'phone conversations. In any case, is it not written of the "New Order" in "Protocol" No. 17: "In our programme, one-third of our subjects will keep the rest under observation from a sense of duty to the State. It will then be no disgrace to be a spy and informer."

"He has freedom from want, for his food is provided for him every day regularly, and he has a nice shelter and sufficient warmth; things which are to form a great part of our Brave New World.

"He has freedom from fear, for no one is going to shoot at him with a gun or

is going to shoot at him with a gun or set nasty traps for him.

"He has freedom of speech, for he can growl all day long and all night, if he likes, without any interference from any-

"He has freedom of conscience. Whatever a bear's religion may be, he can practise it without the risk of persecution.
"Thus he has all Four Freedoms, and yet,

since he goes on rattling the bars of his cage, he does not seem to think he is free. Is he?"

OPEN LETTER TO MR. CHIFLEY, M.H.R.

Dear Mr. Chifley,—The following statement, attributed to you, was published in the Melbourne "Sun" of March 15: —

If some regimentation is necessary to ensure social security in preference to the economic individualism of the old order, then I am for regimentation, and I make no bones about it.

The same news item reported you as saying, in the course of a reply to remarks by Opposition members regarding the principle of freedom to change jobs, that, prior to the war, in your own electorate, you had seen 2000 men trying to get one job.

The foregoing statements were made during the debate on the Constitution Alteration Bill. You also declared your "one regret" to be that "the powers do not go far enough or last long enough.

Of course, the mental attitude revealed by those statements is indicative of what, to be charitable, I should term the wideto be charitable, I should term the wide-spread confusion of thought to be found even among "our leaders," resulting in the misstatement of what is involved in a par-ticular problem. Did one not wish to be charitable, it would be quite legitimate and no more than just, to make mention of the frequency with which the facts of a given situation are misrepresented in order to divert attention from realities to abstractions. The individuals guilty of such acts—and they are many, and are to be found in places high, and not so high thus aid and abet the perpetuation of what has aptly been termed the root of the tragedy of our age, namely, the perversion and exaltation of MEANS' into ENDS IN THEMSELVES.

Your statement, "IF some regimentation is necessary to ensure social security, etc.," implies that such regimentation IS necessary. It further implies that social security security that the constitution with the decrease cannot be co-existent with the degree of individual liberty hitherto enjoyed; that "economic individualism" is the cause of social insecurity; and, that regimentation is the only remedy for the scourge of insecurity and the many evils which are the by-products thereof products thereof.

Such a viewpoint is entirely fallacious. REGIMENTATION CAN BE PRODUCTIVE ONLY OF GREATER INSECURITY. Why? Because it will result in the destruction of individual initiative and personal independence, which are the very foundations of social security and progress

In communities supplied with modern in-dustrial plant and organisation capable of durnishing a super-abundance of the material things upon which man is dependent, it is utterly false to say that "social security" can be had only by the surrender of individual freedom. No. Mr. Chifley. Such speciousness will mislead only the mentally indolent or mesmerised. Social security CAN be ensured—if your Government REALLY wants to ensure it—by distributing to every individual, unconditionally, as an inalienable right, a regular basic INCOME.

In view of surveys of productive capacity carried out by competent technicians, there is no longer any need to doubt the practicability of making such a distribution. But, of course, to do so would not be in keeping with the declared policy of your Government, which is the imposition of the Slave State—euphemistically referred to as "full employment."

In order more fully to apprehend the great threat to personal liberty which is involved in the proposal to grant wider powers over the individual either to your proposal to grant with the components it is own or future Governments, it desirable to consider your own statements quoted herein in conjunction with those made by Dr. Evatt during the debate on the Bill on February 11, 1944:—

GUARD AUSTRALIA'S INDEPENDENCE!

In view of the all-too-obvious fact that the Japanese and their allies are not the only dangers to the freedom of the Australian people to govern themselves, even to the customary extent, without overseas dictation, we strongly urge all Australian democrats to write, while there is yet time, to their respective representatives in the Federal Parliament. A sample letter is reproduced hereunder, and copies of it, printed in large, clear type, are available from the "New Times" office at 1/6 per 120, post free:—

Parliament House, Canberra, A.C.T.

Dear Sir,—I respectfully request you as my representative in the Commonwealth Parliament, to OPPOSE by all means in your power, ANY move that might, in the slightest degree, hand over Australia's sovereignty, freedom-of-action and independence, in regard to financial or other matters, domestic or external, to ANY sort of international authority.

I have in mind, particularly, recently-announced proposals for an "international currency" (possibly based on gold), proposals for an international government or 'Federal Union," and proposals for an international "police force."

I am very alarmed at the possibility that we may have been already partly committed, without the consent of Parliament or the people, to something of the kind. I shall be obliged if you will find out, as soon as possible, whether this is so, and let me know without delay.

Yours faithfully.....

'Many powers could be abused, as I in-Many powers could be abused, as I indicated earlier. I want the House to consider these powers, irrespective of the possible abuses of them and of the political policy that may be carried out by, any particular Parliament that happens to be constituted over a period of years." "Hansard," page 149.

"The powers," which, to your regret, "do not go far enough or last long enough," include power to send anyone wherever some bureaucrat may think fit, with or without the consent of the individual, power to do the same things in peace as in war (at present, in war, THERE IS POWER TO IMPRISON PERSONS WITHOUT TRIAL, and Dr. Evatt admits the possibility of powers. Dr. Evatt admits the possibility of powers being abused by Governments) and power to restrict production. (This last should be to restrict production. (l'his last should be a really valuable contribution toward the ensuring of social security. With its corollary, the destruction of production, it proved of inestimable benefit to millions of under-nourished and UNPAID people during the depression years!) When regard is had to the powers mentioned in the preceding sentence, one is amazed by the monumental moderation of your Government in being content—for the time beernment in being content—for the time being—with the acquisition of those powers. Yes, Mr. Chifley, why not arrogate powers which go further and last longer? Why not, for instance, obtain power to re-establish the Inquisition, power not merely to im-prison without trial, but to "liquidate" prison without trial, but to "liquidate" political opponents in a like manner? The Beveridge Plot is a promising beginning toward the revival of the Inquisition, and Dr. Blunt, Bishop of Bradford, could probably supply some helpful advice regarding the "liquidation" idea. In a foreword to a publication entitled "Christians in the Class Struggle," Dr. Blunt wrote the following: — "Is it not obvious that if we are to have Socialism—real and permanent Socialism— Socialism—real and permanent Socialism—all the fundamental opposition must be liquidated (i.e., rendered politically inactive) by disfranchisement, and, if necessary, by imprisonment."

In view of your ambition to acquire powers which go further and last longer, you might be glad to co-opt Dr. Blunt, though possibly a "Christian leader" who subscribes to his great Christian ideals might be found among Dr. Blunt's local brethren! Incidentally, Adolf Hitler appears to be gaining converts in the most unlikely of all places. Judging by utterances such as that of Dr. Blunt, Hitler's gospel of totalitarianism has won him more disciples than he imagines. However, just as Saul of Tarsus became Paul, so, it seems, can the modern Pauls be transformed into

I suppose I am occupying myself with matters which are "too high" to be comprehended by my undeveloped mind? And I should be highly softened by my undeveloped mind? should be humbly content to leave such things to potentates, politicians, and directors-general, etc.? I do wish, however, that some one of these great men could explain in unambiguous terms why it is that man's increasingly complete conquest over the natural forces of the universe, by means of which it has been made physically possible which it has been made physically possible to abolish economic insecurity, has resulted in a correspondingly greater degree of insecurity. The 2000 men you saw trying to get one The 2000 men you saw trying to get one job were a symptom of maladjustment They were not really looking for a JOB. They were looking for an INCOME. Given the income, they knew quite well that the goods they needed were available. Those goods, moreover, had been produced without the assistance of your 2000 men, They were in the unfortunate plight in which you found them—and millions of others you found them—and millions of others here and elsewhere were similarly placed—because power production had rendered their services unnecessary. Upon this great principle hangs the issue as to whether our civilisation shall be regenerated or shall be allowed to drift on to complete extinction. Where does your Government stand in relation to this overshadowing issue?

"EXTERMINATION" OF JEWS INEUROPE

(An extract from DOUGLAS REED'S latest book, "Lest We Regret.")

The other evidence of "extermination" consisted of two documents. The first was a Note sent in December, 1942, by the Polish Government to the Allied Governments. According to the newspapers if began by drawing attention to "the methods employed by the Germans in order to reduce the population to virtual slavery and ultimately to exterminate THE POLISH NATION," (The Jews of Poland refuse to consider themselves part of the Polish nation; but this Note was published under such headlines as "Persecution of the Jews."

The second document was published in December, 1942 by the "Inter-Allied Information Committee"; it gave "a general picture of the persecution of the Jews by the Germans." (This is seemingly not on public sale, and I rely on newspaper summaries, published under such headings as "The Foulest Crime on Farth")

In respect of this document, and without disrespect to it, I must mention again that verification is impossible in war-time. Its contents were published throughout the press without any word of editorial cautions. Here are two of its statements:—

"Of the 86,000 Jews living in Yugoslavia April 6, 1941 (the day of the German invasion of that country) only 1000 remain alive; the rest have been brutally murdered" (a Sunday newspaper). I hope to recall that statement in a few years' time when facts can be ascertained.

'On May 15, this year, the German Governor of Belgium published a decree tanta-mount to an order of extermination of all Jews residing in Belgium. Men from the age of 18 to 60 and women from 20 to 55 were obliged, on pain of removal to a German concentration camp, to accept any form of work offered them by the Labour Exchange, no matter what their health family obligations, or business" (severa newspapers).

If that is "extermination" WE are being exterminated in this country [Great Britain] by our Labour Minister, who wields similar powers! All NON-JEWISH Germans, Belpowers! All NON-JEWISH Germans, Belgians, Frenchmen and the rest are subject to exactly that German compulsion. If THAT is "extermination," the Belgians were exterminated in the last war by a German Jew, Walther Rathenau, later Foreign Minister, who on September 16, 1916, wrote to propose to General Ludendorff "the solution of the Belgian labour problem, which can be achieved only if the 700,000 workers there are brought on to our domestic labour

Among other reports were these:-The "Daily Herald" of December 16, 1942, ave an extract from a speech by the Chief Rabbi "as copied from the manuscript." It was to the effect that on July 27, 1942, 500 Jewish women of a town near Kieff were ordered with their babies to a stadium where ("an eye-witness declares") German soldiers dressed in football clothes snatched the infants from their mothers' arms and used fants from their mothers' arms and used them as footballs, bouncing and kicking them around the arena. Of this report, Mr. Hannen Swaffer said: "Never since the days of the martyrdom of Christians in the Colosseum by Nero has such a story been told." A correspondent of the "New States-

man," who signed a Jewish name, remarked:
"May I, with a full sense of responsibility
"I the possible opprobrium involved, and of the possible opprobrium involved, say that I do not believe this story, and regard it as a fabrication from beginning to end. AUSTRALIA'S GREAT POST-WAR PERIL

(A letter to the editor from BRUCE H BROWN. CONTINUED FROM LAST ISSUE.)

Sir, --It was quite true that in 1938 "either by accident or design a Jew had come to a position of foremost importance" in France, Russia and Britain, and that "in the hands of these non-Aryans lay the very lives of millions." This statement appeared in "The American Hebrew" of June 3, 1938. And what an eloquent commentary. It was on our simple belief that in each of the countries mentioned it was the will of the PEOPLE that prevailed!

It was also true that certain other Jews (e.g., Bernard Baruch, Felix Warburg, Mortimer Schiff, Henry Morgenthau, Felix Frankfurter) had come, either by accident or design, to positions of foremost importance in the United States, and it is well to remember that in the same year there was consternation in certain circles in that country when Mr. Chamberlain, as a result of the Munich discussions, succeeded in obtaining a little breathing

There is evidence which suggests that ship between himself and Felix Frankfurter Britain was intended to be at war a year in these words: earlier than was actually the case, and that she was to be defeated. That part of the plot failed, and those who know the facts appreciate the role played at that time by the British Prime Minister. These facts will become better known as the years pass.

THE MONEY SYSTEM OF THE U.S.S.R.

"Would it meet our needs?" asks the Canadian weekly paper, "To-day To-morrow" (Edmonton), from which this informative review is reprinted:-

It has been generally known that the Soviet Government in Russia, in common with the Governments of most other nations, have centralised their money system by establishing a central bank. Because they have somewhat deviated from certain conventions, it has been sometimes assumed that "Social Credit and Communist, or Socialist ideas on money are practically alike." But, are they? It is true that like Social Credit proposals contain some fundamental changes in financial policy, but that does not mean to say that ANY set of changes in banking and finance can be associated with Social Credit. can be associated with Social Credit. There have been many instances of this faulty reasoning, and the assumption that Social Credit; has anything in common with Communist finance is one of them.

The author has written a number of books upholding the activities of the present Government of Russia, as he does in this one, and claims a first hand knowledge of the facts from his own observations, besides having them observations, besides having them confirmed by recognised authorities. In any case, we can assume that his statements are prepared for the purpose of putting these matters in the best light from the point of view of advocates of the existing regime in

Russia.

The following are among some of the

Russia.

The following are among some of the statements which the author makes in endeavouring to show what a. splendid banking system Russia possesses:—

Page 156—"In both countries (Russia and U.S.A.), banks cash cheques, float loans for the Government, grant credit."

Page 157—"To begin with, their money system is secured by precious metals, largely because the outside world uses gold as a standard of value."

Of course, the writer goes on to state that, besides the reserves of gold and silver behind their currency, there are _the tremendous stocks of commodities which have been produced by the community. But, cannot the same be said of any nation's currency?

However, it will be noted that the bulk of the money for Government expenditure in Russia comes from the well-known method of "sound" "orthodox" finance—that of taxation—indicated as follows:—

Page 160-"The great bulk of the revenue, about 75 per cent., is derived from the State-owned industries and trade. It comes mainly from, first, the TURNOVER TAX which is a markup on the cost of production; and secondly, a TAX ON THE PROFITS of State enterprises.

On the same page we learn the extreme rates of TURNOVER TAX levied: "... the rates rise to 13 per cent, on articles such as sickles and toys, to 40 per cent, on sausage and soap. These are doubled on luxury articles. luxury articles . . . 83 per cent, is levied on vodka." As to TAX ON PROFITS "from 10 to 80 per cent." is taken for Government services.

Part of the remainder of Government income comes from imposing a number of direct taxes:

direct taxes:—

"AGRICULTURAL TAX . . . 4 to 8 per cent . . . from the sale of products of farms";
"INCOME TAX . . . from persons earning more than 150 roubles (about 30 dollars) a month"; "INHERITANCE TAX . . . steeply graduated . . . 90 per cent, over halt a million rubles (about 100,000 dollars)." Then we have "MASS LOANS . . bring in about 10 billion rubles a year . . Vivid posters of the long-bayoneted Red Army guarding arrays of smoke-belching mills, summon the workers to subscribe at least a month's wages paid in instalments . . They bear interest at 4 per cent. They are tax "free."

The list is completed with the mention, of a "stamp tax" and "export and import duties."

With respect to their central bank, "gosbank," on page 164 we find it is "the most important nerve centre of the financial system . . . the only agency granting short-term credit . . . the bank of issue . . floats Government loans." It is true that some "non-repayable" advances of credit are made to certain industries which the Government wishes to subsidise to meet urgent demands but it must be remembered that demands, but it must be remembered that these are State-owned enterprises, and, as shown above, the greater portion of the profits accruing are immediately withdrawn by taxation. It is also mentioned that, besides a policy of rationing necessities to prevent inflation, they have a system of fixed prices."

... It will be observed that the financial system of the U.S.S.R. retains the worst features of orthodox finance, including public horrowing at interest over-hurdening

lic borrowing at interest, over-burdening taxation, tax-free bond issues, complete centralisation of financial policy, gold recentralisation of financial policy, gold reserves as a basis of monetary control, etc.—all of which are so dear to the fraternity of international bankers. And, it is well to note that many of these features are upheld by socialist politicians in this, and other countries, who advocate the "nationalisation" of the banking system. Conversely, we don't know of an international banker who has not publicly professed his support of some form of State socialism. As Montagu Norman stated, "Nationalisation? Why, I would welcome it."

In conclusion, it would be well to point out that, since Russia is still in the age of scarcity as far as providing a high standard of living for her population is concerned, she is likely to have less difficulty in using methods of orthodox finance. It is a recognised fact that there is a greater need for Social Credit principles in a country which

Social Credit principles in a country which has reached the age of plenty with respect to productive capacity. Obviously, Canada

is in the latter category.

Let us hope that this brief review will help to dispel any illusion that Soviet Russia has a financial system even remotely similar to that advocated by Social Crediters. Actually, the financial orthodoxy to which they cling is about the only feature of their social structure which survived the Revolution, notwithstanding the survived the Revolution, notwithstanding the fact that it was the greatest evil of pre-Lenin Russia; yet all that should have been preserved was swept away in the annihilation of some twenty million men, women and children—the price paid by the Russian people in twenty years for a change in their way of life.

WORLD CURRENCY BASED ON GOLD?

(From a Speech by NORMAN JAQUES, Canadian House of Commons, July 24, 1943.)

I wish to add a few words to those of the hon, member who has just taken his seat He has made one of his valuable criticisms of financial matters. I should like to tackle this question from a different angle and I want to assure you, Mr. Chairman, that even though I may seem to, I am not wandering from the subject. This is a world proposal, and one cannot very well discuss a world proposal unless he uses a world wide approach. I should like to go back a few months to April 1, when an article was published in the Ottawa "Citizen" headed, "New Authority To Guide Affairs." It went on to state:

"A supra-national authority with power to settle questions of immigration, natural resources, treatment of minorities, repudiation of debts, finance and other questions was predicted by B. K. Sandwell of Toronto in an address before the Ottawa branch of the League of Nations Society."

At that time I brought those remarks to the attention of this House and of the Government, and I asked if they were not seditious in the opinion of the Government. At once I was assailed in the press as a Fascist, as a moron, as a Jewbaiter, as one who filled his mind with such rubbish as the "Protocols of Zion" and the A plus B theorem of Major Douglas, and they even went so far as to couple the two together. I was to couple the two together. I was surprised at the notoriety which I had achieved, shall I say so easily, on that occasion, until a few days later when the "Citizen." The despatch is dated "Washington" and says is part:—
"Secretary Henry Morgenthau disclosed

to-day comprehensive Administration plans to stabilise post-war currencies AND FIX THEIRVALUE IN TERMS OF GOLD. The plans involve:-

1. Creation of an international stabilisation fund by the United Nations and their associates.

"2. Fixing the value of currencies in terms of gold.

"3. An agreement among participating countries not to devalue their currencies without consulting other members of the stabilisation fund.

"Both plans entail the establishment of a stabilisation fund to be managed by an international bank, vitally important because it would mean that participating countries would LOSE CONTROL OVER THE VALUE OF THEIR CURRENCIES for world trade purposes. This control would THE VALUE OF THEIR CURRENCIES for world trade purposes. This control would be vested in the bank, NOT IN A PARLIAMENT OR A CONGRESS, and if a country wanted the rate lowered or increased IT COULD ONLY APPEAL TO THE BANK, not taken action itself."

When we speak in terms of gold it is well perhaps to ask ourselves who are the owners of these gold reserves the greater part of which are piled up underground at Fort Knox. I suppose the vast majority of the people of this country, and perhaps of the members of this House, fondly imagine that that gold belongs to the people or, if you like, to the Government of the United States, but I am informed on the highest authority that eighty-five per cent, of that gold is owned and controlled by private interests. I will go farther and say that it is those Interests that are behind this scheme to stabilise world finance in terms of gold.

Mr. Ilsley (Finance Minister): May I ask who is the highest authority?

Mr. Jaques: I am not going to give names. I make that statement and I stand by it.

Mr. Isnor: That is no good.

Mr. Jaques: I am told by well-informed Americans that anybody in the United States who understands finance understands that as well as they understand anything.

Mr. Jaques: When I brought to the attention of the House this policy of encouraging Canadians to surrender their loyalty to the Crown and give it to this supra-national authority, at once I was accused of indulging in such foolishness as reading the "Protocols of Zion," which were described as absolute nonsense. I am going to read two of them to see how far they are absurd when applied to this matter

under discussion.

Mr. Ilsley: I must rise to a point of order. When an hon, member gets so far afield as to read the "Protocols of Zion" must take exception. That is more than latitude allows.

Having said that, perhaps I may be allowed to quote from a speech which was made in the Congress of the United States by Mr. Smith, one of the congressmen from Ohio. Speaking on Monday, April 12, 1943, on this United States plan for stabilisation of currency, he said:—

"We are apt to be led to believe from the newspaper, radio and other reports the newspaper, radio and other reports that this scheme emanates from a few individuals. Mr. Harry B. White, special assistant to the Secretary of the Treasury, is being credited as the prime mover of the United States contribution to the plan. Professor Maynard Keynes is being credited as the prime mover of the British contribution to this plan.

"Now, of course, we would be naive indeed if we were to believe that the officials of our Treasury had undertaken this task on their own initiative, or that Professor Keynes, and perhaps a few of his associates, had inaugurated their part of the scheme on their own accord.

"We may rest assured that back of this move are the most powerful international moneyed interests and financiers of world. Furthermore, we may be certain that world power-politics are playing a prominent role in promoting this move-

Upon first sight the Keynes plan and Upon first sight the Regies plan and that of Mr. Morgenthau may appear to be quite different from each other. It would not be surprising if this impression had been received by many from reading the brief news despatches describing the two proposals.

Then there will be no need to worry about our population. There will be a healthy increase in accordance with individual

Unless we can re-discover our own culture we are certainly on the road to a Planned Death in which people will continue increasingly to refuse to create new life because they lack faith in themselves and the future.

If we passively allow pressure to be used to force Australia to surrender the White Australia Policy, we are doomed. No time should be lost in informing parliamentary representatives of our opposition, and stressing a determination to preserve our national sovereignty against all plots and plans to destroy it.

Then came the crisis. The Government took powers of wrongful arrest. It suspended the Habeas Corpus Act and introduced the Regulation ISB of its day. Cobbett the chief prey, escaped to

America.

He returned a popular hero, and until he died maintained his robust and independent criticism of public affairs, when he thought this necessary. When he was nearly seventy, the Government tried once more to break him, by bringing him before the Court of King's Bench on a charge of inciting rural disorders. He defended himself and the charge collapsed, covering the Government with ignominy. During his last years, when he was an Independent Member of Parliament for Oldharn, they abandoned hope of Oldharn, they abandoned hope of intimidating this honest and turbulent Englishman, who would not suppress the fears he felt for England as he saw the seeds of decay being planted.

But for such a man, and his like, we would not for so long have kept our peerless right of freedom from arrest

and wrongful imprisonment.

To-day Cobbetts fight has to be again, if we are to check the retreat from freedom and win the battle IN England. [and Australia!—Ed., "N.T."].

WANTED: MODERN WILLIAM COBBETTS

Consider William Cobbett, who for forty-five years strove, with raging anger against the things which were to be done to England between 1809 and 1943. He saw them all before they happened. With Enclosure going on around him, he rode his Rural Rides and clamoured against the spoliation of the countryside which he foresaw

as clearly as if the future opened to him, against the human hives which were being allowed to sprawl and straggle over the land, and particularly against "The Wen," his prophetic name for London. His was a lone voice; but he never ceased to cry, and was heard. But for him, we might have lost the greater half of freedom a century ago.

(An extract from DOUGLAS REED's latest book, "Lest We Regret.")

This man, the son of a small farmer ("who, when a little boy, drove the plough for twopence a day, and these, his earnings, were appropriated to the expenses of an evening school"), became a great master of the English language, wrote incessantly and insuppressibly, and commanded a huge audience.

When he was twenty he enlisted in a regiment of foot, and before he was thirty, jumping over many heads, became its sergeant-major during service in Nova Scotia. On his disabase besides the service of Scotia. On his discharge, having gained knowledge of what went on in the regiment he accused some officers of peculation, from regimental funds, but then, suspecting the court of connivance, fled to France, and afterwards to America.

When he returned, eight years later he was famous, through his writings; he was wooed by a Tory Government and offered the editorship of a government newspaper so that he might, for a comfortable salary laud all that was done by authority and lampoon all who protested.

He refused, and began to publish the weekly "Political Register," the most famous independent journal of the next thirty-five years. Sometimes the politicians, sometimes the mob, attached him. He was fined for criticising the Government's treatment of Ireland. His windows
