Another portion of his address reads as follows: —

"An immense and difficult task was involved in the building of a better world. This required fearless handling. A most important plank in post-war reconstruction was full employment. To achieve that demanded a national unity and national effort quite as great as we had put into the war. People must be told the truth, that there were immense difficulties in reconciling full employment and individual freeciling full employment and individual freedom."

It seems incredible that a man of Sir Edmund's standing could allow himself to be drawn into the role of a parrot. I would like to put this simple question directly to him: "Do you conscientiously believe that full employment IS a necessary postwar objective and if so, did you arrive at that conviction after a disinterested study of our actual and potential productive capacour actual and potential productive capac-

ity?" In view of the FACTS in this regard, one can be pardoned for thinking that Sir Edmund has said it merely because it is being put forward as a settled part of Government policy. No citizen is obliged to be a yes-man in any public matter, and if an idea is put forward which, on examination, is found to be absurd, then within Constitutional limits it is the then, within Constitutional limits, it is the duty of every citizen to oppose it regardless of what the "government" might think.

And who, precisely, wants to "reconcile full employment and individual freedom?

Who, precisely, concocted the slogan "full employment," and why? As full employment is quite unnecessary, so far as productive capacity is concerned, it must have some other purpose, and that purpose is to maintain the swindling position that a man must not have any money unless he WORKS for it. So long as he has to WORK for it, so long is a job his main aim in life, and so long must he be a slave labourer, or starve. Therefore the only purpose of "full employment" is to keep the multitude in subjection, and deny them the benefits of their inheritance. How sad to have the spectacle of Sir Edmund Herring allying himself with the tyrants who are working for regimentation.

Seeing that this "full employment" absurdity is being put forward by the leaders in all countries, it is obvious that if such a condition comes into being there will not only be surplus production in every country, but the "costs" of producing it will be beyond the financial ability of the people to meet; and so the bonds of debt will become tighter and the holders of the bonds. come tighter and the holders of the bonds more powerful. NOTES on the NEWS

Commenting on the organised Communist plot to seize power in the Balkans, the Melbourne "Herald," of May 23 states: "The strength of the Party seizing power is then increased by the adhesion of people prompted to join from fear or opportunism. This process has been carried out in Bulgaria, where public life today is under complete Communist sway. In this connection, the 'Times' correspondent says, 'The real ruler of Bulgaria is not the head of the Government, Georghiev, but a woman, Tsolo Dragoitcheve, secretary of the Communist Party, whose orders are final and undisputed. First step is the extermination of political opponents through trials in the people's courts and other means.'" And so, a new scourge has arisen which has to be eradicated before peace reigns in Europe.

CONSCRIPTION CONTINUANCE: Although England has played the major role in liberating foreign countries, and has removed a few totalitarian wartime regulations from her own people, conscription is to be retained. Oddly enough, Mr. Chur-chill and the Labour Leaders agree on perpetuating this form of Hitlerism in oncefree Britain. It is understood that the reason given for retaining this alien form of slavery is to enable Britain to meet her obligations to the new international organisation, which presumably is to determine British policy irrespective of the wishes of British people. So the Mother of Parliaments is to be a flunkey for the absentee Government over which the people will have no control. Will Britons lower their flag to a foreign Government after all their blood and tears? And will we?

HOUSING HAPPENINGS: According to answers to a questionnaire, 80 per cent, of soldiers wanted their own home after demobilisation, said Mr. Eric Chapman (Chairman of the War Service Homes and Housing Committee of the Returned Soldiers League) at a meeting of the Hawthorn subbranch of the League. Various speakers also declared, "Nothing less than a fierce campaign by returned soldiers would achieve any result." Scathing references to Mr. Dedman and bureaucrat Dr. Lloyd Ross were applauded. WHAT IS THE TRUTH ABOUT INDIA?

Beverley Nichols' new book, "Verdict on India," is the result of a recently completed tour by one of England's most provocative journalists. It presents conclusions in striking contrast to some current views on the fateful problem of Indian independence. The following extracts are interesting:

MUMBO JUMBO.

If the average British or American citizen were told that syphilis could be cured by drinking a cup of tea, he would be sceptical if he were told further that this same cup of tea would also cure tuber-culosis, brain fever, malaria, gonorrhea, and bronchitis — he would be inclined to throw the cup of tea into the face of its inventor.

The cup of tea — or rather, a small tin of it — stands before me as I write. It has just come back from the analyst's. It is quite harmless, and, of course, utterly use-less for any of the diseases for which it is recommended. Its basis is an herb that resembles the South American Mate; it also contains thyme, cardamoms, cloves and the dried petals of a few common flowers. It might perhaps have slight digestive properties, but that is all.

gestive properties, but that is all.

This stuff was presented to me by one of the leading lights of Hindu medicine, a system of Mumbo Jumbo, which goes under the name of Ayurveda. The Ayurvedic system, with its blend of astrology, witchcraft, and religion, and its claims to have rediscovered ancient secrets which are far in advance of Western medicine, is spreading throughout modern India; students are being enrolled by the thousands: in many parts of India the number of Ayurvedic doctors is between 20 and 30 per cent, greater than the number of allopathic or "Western" doctors.

The main impetus for the growth of this

The main impetus for the growth of this gigantic quackery is, quite simply, Hindu nationalism, of which it is the medical expression.

The things Ayurveda does not attempt to do are even more significant than the things it does. It disdains the microscope and ignores the whole field of bacteriology. and ignores the whole field of bacteriology. It rejects surgery, and gives the cancer patient a pill. It has no disinfectants adequate to deal with any but the simplest cases of sepsis; to prevent the spread of cholera it hangs a bunch of flowers over the doorway. It deliberately rejects countless remedies that have unquestionably proved their worth in Western medicine, such as sulphonamide preparations for pneumonia or insulin for diabetes.

On the other hand, one branch of this

monia or insulin for diabetes.

On the other hand, one branch of this "science" has shown remarkable progress. In the manufacture of aphrodisiacs, Ayurveda reigns supreme; Firms of Ayurvedic chemists are legion; they have a huge mail-order business with catalogues setting forth in lurid language their claims to stimulate the sexual appetite.

Such is the system, which in the name of nationalism is attempting to assume responsibility for the health of nearly one-fifth of the human race.

THE OTHER INDIA

It has always seemed to me quite futile to plunge into Indian politics before making any attempt to understand the Indian people. The lack of factual and atmospheric background is the cause of the unreality of so many debates about India, whether they are in the House of Commons or the columns of the American process. columns of the American press.

columns of the American press.

A number of commentators, for example, write as though the India of the Princes did not exist. Actually, of course, the Princes exist to the extent of ruling over nearly two-fifths of the entire territory of India, and their subjects number no less than 80 millions. Moreover, their States, which number over 600, are sewn so firmly into the main fabric by the threads of history and of self-interest that any attempt to tear them out might cause the whole thing to fall apart. Some of these States, of course, are very small: they shine on India's quilt like tiny specks of gold; but others are nearly the size of France, governed by rulers with wide powers and lusty ambitions, who have not the faintest intention of retiring. tion of retiring.

THE ELUSIVE INDIAN

"Have you ever met an Indian?"

This startling question was put to me by a friend when I had been in India for nearly a year, and had travelled thousands of miles — from the snows of the Northwest Frontier to the markets of Madras.

Met an Indian?
What did the man mean? I had, of course, met many. To speak to a thousand. But supposing we looked at India from a more general viewpoint?

HOUSING CAMPAIGNS

The demand for "more housing," if implying the release of more men for attachto bureaucratic organisations, including the Housing Commission, plays directly into the hands of the Totalitarian designers.

It is refreshing to find that speakers at meetings of service men have shown that in response to a plebiscite, 80 per cent, of the service men have indicated that they want "their own" private homes.

An important point, which should be borne in mind by all servicemen, is that "interest-free loans for servicemen's homes" can only be obtained when it is demanded by them through their parliamentary representatives. Their prospects of gaining their "own" homes will so be considerably enhanced.

First, the 180 million caste Hindus. They were Indians all right, the very core of India. But wait a minute . . . were they? What about the 60 million non-caste Hindus. dus who were groveling in their dust? Were they Indians, too? According to the caste Hindus, they were not even men and women! They were "untouchable." To drink from the same cup would be spiritual poison; their shadow was pollution. Could these 60 million—regarded by their own brethren as a good deal lower than the lowest animals—be described, by a Westerner, as "Indians"?

Or, if the Hindus were "Indians," what of this Muslims—nearly 92 million of them—with their dream of Pakistan, a separate Indian empire of their own? These vast bodies of men, the Hindus and the Muslim, are so acutely conscious of their differences that they not only refuse to eat together or think together, or pray together, they refuse even to live in the same unit of territory. same unit of territory.

To begin at the other end, with India's smallest community, the Parsees, was no better. Although there are less than 115,000 of them, judged by their achievements the-Parsees assume a position of importance out of all proportion to their numbers. Wherever there are riches in India you will find the Parsees. To give only one example the vast network of Tata industries is entirely Parsee, in conception, in execution, and in present-day direction. The firm of Tata's is industrial India. Its steel works at Jamshedpur, employing 30,000 people, are the largest in the British Empire. Its hydroelectric system is the largest unit in the country. Its aircraft industry in unit in the country. Its aircraft industry in time may challenge the biggest combines of the West

India without the Parsees would be like

an egg without salt. And without a good deal of its yolk too.

But—and it is a very big "but"—we cannot really call them "Indians." Even if they themselves claimed the title—(and a large number of them do not, preferring to regard themselves as a separate community, living on tolerance)—the vast majority of Indians would deny it to them. They say that the Parsees are really Persians, as their name implies. And they say it in terms, which are by no means polite. For the Parsees have aroused great envy; thousands of fingers are itching to get at their

Then there are still other large communities, running into many millions—the Sikhs, the Jains, the Buddhists.

The five million Sikhs, for example, are among the true aristocrats of India; they are virile and clean living, swift of brain and body. They are also implacable enemies of the Muslims. If the Muslim dream of Pakistan should ever be realised, the Sikhs, who nearly all live in the Punjab, where the Muslims hopelessly outnumber them, threaten to set up a separate Sikh State of their own and call it Khalistan.

Where, then, is the man who can say with real sincerity, without hypocrisy and without any thought of self-interest, "I am or Indian"?

When Eric Johnston, President of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce, was invited to visit Russia last year, his parry included William L. White, one of the war's most realistic and entertaining reporters. Mr. White here recounts his observations of the way of life of the Soviet people and their masters:

The next day we visit a factory which manufactures dive-bomber motors. Eric mentions the fact that he also owns a factory, and the Russians are immediately curious. How many men does he employ?

"Two thousand," he tells them.

"And how are they paid?"
"Mostly on an hourly wage basis."
"Why not on a piece-work basis?"

"Because our labour unions do not like piece work." The Russian staff is puzzled by this. They are too young to know that from 1917 to 1934 "piece work" was denounced as a cunning device to exploit the workers. Later, when it was adopted with much ballyhoo under the name of "the Stakhanov system," it was presented to Russians as a socialist invention, unknown in the capitalist world. But these young men have grown up behind the veil.

When the sum is translated into roubles for them, they nod politely, but you can see they suspect that Eric is exaggerating.

We glance into a workers' lunchroom.

The meal consists of a buckwheat porridge, black bread, and borsch—a rich meat ridge, black bread, and borsch—a rich meat and cabbage soup. Beyond this is the foremen's dining room. They get the same dishes plus black pressed caviar. Further on is the engineers' dining room. They eat like the foremen except that they may have white bread as well as black, a generous portion of butter, and their caviar is the more expensive, loose unsalted kind.

Now we proceed to the director's dining room, where I jot down the menu's main items: vodka, red wine, white wine, cham-

pagne; caviar, butter, smoked sturgeon, salted cucumbers, coleslaw, cold veal, salami, smoked beef tongue, pastry and fine-textured chocolate-layer cake.

I marvel at how well Eric handles the

toasts. Every Russian meal means that he must produce, on the spur of the moment, at least half a dozen little two-minute speeches. He makes them friendly and sprightly, avoids giving any offence, and thinks fast on his feet. But, of course, it is abbusting

it is exhausting.

We learn (not from our Russian hosts) that the caste system, which we have seen in the dining rooms, goes all through their factories.

They have developed enormous white-collar clerical and engineering staffs. But once a man becomes an engineer, he loses prestige if, as all American engineers do, he slips into a suit of overalls and goes down to a factory bench to show the workers how it should be done, or to iron out difficulties on the assembly line.

Until the 1917 Revolution, Russia for 1000 years was a caste-ridden State, and 25 years can no more wipe this out than it can abolish Russian food habits or Russian verbs. So this new socialist bureau-cracy, raised up out of the proletariat, in-

cracy, raised up out of the proletariat, instinctively stratifies itself into castes.

Although this factory's floors and lighting are better than most and its director's hospitable table far better than any American corporation president's private dining room, its production record is, by American standards, pretty sad. It requires here about 1000 man-days of work to produce this Soviet motor. (An American motor duce this Soviet motor. (An American motor of comparable horse-power requires a little less than 200 man-days of work.) Fifteen thousand workers equipped with Pratt and Whitney machine tools (also some excellent German and Swiss ones), turn out only about 15 motors a day. (To be continued.)

"In a word, to sum up our system of keeping the governments of the goyim in Europe in check, we shall show our strength to one of them by terrorist attempts, and to all, if we allow the possibility of a general rising against us, we shall respond with the guns of America or China or Japan.

COMMENT: -

The author or authors of the "Protocols" evidently believed that organised world Jewry is not very concerned about which country it uses for its own ends. It is a matter of history that throughout the centuries the leaders of the Jews have made use of one country after another in their fervent desire to accomplish their Messianic mission. The authoritative Jewish writer. Mr. F. R. Bienenfeld, sums up the matter clearly in his book "The Germans and The Jews." He says: —

"That is why a Babylonian, Alexandrian, Arabian, Spanish, Dutch and German period may clearly be distinguished in Jewish history. . . . THE GERMAN PERIOD OF JEWRY HAS NOW COME TO AN END; THE ANGLO-AMERICAN PERIOD HAS BEGUN."

Mr. Bienenfeld's emphasis should be carefully noted, particularly in view of the great influx of Jews into America and British countries as a result of Hitler's persecution.

As Australians have felt the effect of the guns of Japan, it will be of interest if we learn a little concerning Jewish influence on and through that country. It can be stated beyond dispute that Mr. Jacob H. Schiff, head of Kuhn, Loeb and Co., Wall Street, New York, probably the most influential financial institution in the world, was primarily responsible for a polworld, was primarily responsible for a policy which set Japan on the road to becoming a major military power and coming under the control of the Japanese military junta. The story starts before the Russo-Japanese war of the early years of this century.

There is abundant evidence that Schiff and his group has played a subtle but important part in the affairs of Russia, at least since they first financed Japan in the Russo-Japanese conflict back in 1904-5. Revolutionary activities of a serious nature, financed by Schiff, were constantly taking place in Russia during and after the Russo-Japanese war.

Russia eventually accepted the mediation of America in connection with this reign of terror, and Count Witte was the Russian representative. Now, as Count Witte had married a Jewess, he could hardly be termed "anti-Semitic." Jacob Schiff attended in person with the official American representative at this conference of mediation, and made it quite clear that the cause of the internal trouble in Russia was the status of his fellow-Jews. Count Witte tried to point out that most of the reports about the treatment of Jews in Russia

rather exaggerated, whereupon Schiff said:

"If the Czar will not accord our people these desired liberties, then A REVOLUTION WILL BRING ABOUT A REPUBLIC WHICH WILL ASSURE US OUR RIGHTS."

These facts about the incident were made public in Count Witte's "Memoirs" (Berlin, 1932; Vol. I, pp. 394-395).

Schiff apparently started to carry his threat into operation, and an intensification of terrorist activities in Russia, mainly by Jewish Nihilists, took place. Furthermore, many of these Russian Jews obtained the protection of the United States by making a trip to that country, becoming nationalised, and then returning to Russia as American citizens. The Russian Government next decided that Russian Jews, whether they had obtained American nationality or not, were to be subject to de-portation, while a number were refused

after a long campaign of exposing the International Jewish Financiers. He wrote;

"It was war, indeed! From the next day every Jewish newspaper in the States, as well as the big dailies, subventioned by Kuhn, Loeb and Co., started their attack on Taft in accusing him of 'having allowed an Oriental Despot to humiliate

American citizens.' Committees were formed, public meetings were held, and every politician who could be got at was enlisted. The Senate and the While House vere filled with motions of protest. Though short, this campaign seems to have cost Jacob Schiff three million dollars. President Taft had not foreseen what consequence his refusal would have for him. Ten months later, December 13, 1911. Taft gave in. The two Houses of Congress, like an orchestra to the baton of Jacob Schiff, had just invited the President to inform Russia that the Treaty of Commerce between the two countries was cancelled as an act of refusal over the Jewish passports affair, Kuhn, Loeb and Co.'s victory was complete." complete.

Schiff later boasted of his victory and of his deep interest in causing trouble in Russia. When criticised by some of his fellow Jews for having added to the growth low Jews for having added to the growth of "anti-Semitism" in Russia (here again, we have an example of Jewish leaders using "anti-Semitism" for their own ends) by his financing of such a revolutionary groups as the Nihilists, Schiff replied through the "New York Times" of 5/6/16, and he used these words:—

"To think that I should be accused of such a crime! I who began the struggle 25 years ago, and have continued it to this day! Who but myself started the agitation which finally compelled the President of the U.S., as you may well remember, to give up Russia?'' our commercial treaty with

As to the "order of priority," the demands of the people, through their ability to buy, will be the most powerful influence, and when that demand is demonstrated there will be no failure on the part of producers to meet it. The best way to defeat monopolies and combines is to put the individual entrepreneur in the position to withstand financial squeezing, and that can easily be done by ensuring him availability of finance and constant public demand through sustained ability to buy. This has nothing whatever to do with spiritual revival. It merely requires a little intelligence and understanding of simple real-

The very fact that full employment cannot be reconciled with individual freedom not be reconciled with individual freedom is the clearest indication that full employment is NOT the thing to strive for. Indeed, it is the thing that will inevitably hasten another war. In this regard Mr. Churchill's ideas about the fruits of victory are much better than Professor Giblin's, and I respectfully commend his remarks to Sir Edmund Herring as follows:—

"I warn the people not to throw away the fruits of victory. These fruits were not the acquisition of territory or the right to dominate other people; they were the right to carry through the great principles of freedom, the right to take a place in the van of nations, and to carry on a policy which would give a solid foundation of peace to the world.

To defend the just rights of owner-occupier and tenant farmers, their employees and all other persons engaged in agricul-

To procure reinstatement on their farms, or full compensation as an alternative, for those who have been dispossessed or evicted through the dictatorial or unjust actions of the Minister of Agriculture, War Agricultural Executive Committees, or other executive bodies or officials; and to ensure that full compensation be given for session or other actions of such officials or bodies.

To restore in full the constitutional right of the people of Great Britain to appeal to their sovereign through his Majesty's judges for justice and relief from oppression; and to restore the right of trial by

jury.

To procure the abolition of all despotic officials; and to procure that the Courts be empowered to inflict punishment upon persons found guilty of abuse of such powers.

To oppose any policy which is detrimental to good husbandry; and to represent generally the best interests of those who are engaged in agricultural pursuits.

Miss Ellen Wilkinson, who takes the Chair at the T.U.C. when Professor Laski doesn't want it, says we shall just be able to scrape a modest living after the war, if we are all controlled.

There is no doubt that this passion for control is the mainspring of Socialism. It is becoming so obvious that Mr. Attlee, the Socialist Deputy Prime Minister, has been constrained to deny it. In saying this, we do not suggest that the will-to-power is the attribute either of one political party or one economic or social class. It is more or less universal.

But the distinctive feature of Socialism But the distinctive feature of Socialism is the pursuit of power divorced either from experience or responsibility. Just as Mr. H. G. Wells failed to run a collar-andtie shop, but felt competent to plan the Universe, so, we have little doubt, Miss Wilkinson would paralyse any one of the many activities she would like to control, if she was actually and personally forced to manage it, instead of saying how it should be managed. be managed.

Under the disappearing system of free enterprise, the march to Carey Street [Bankruptcy Court] of the man who sat in his office and played at remote control of his business are supported to the control of the state of the control o his business was punctuated by the de-parture of his employees as well as his money. But when that happens in Socialism it's just too bad. It's not the Socialist's money, and the employees haven't anywhere else to go to. So let's all be Socialists and controllers!

NOTE ON WAR CRIMINALS

It would be difficult to find a more repellent type than the Prussian Junker, and the Great German General Staff, as well as the higher ranks of the Civil Service, derive their character from a class of which Bismarck was an outstanding representa-tive. Nevertheless, we think that the greattive. Nevertheless, we think that the greatest caution is required in respect of the evident attempt to isolate them—an attempt having the same intention as that which placed the blame of the First World War on the Kaiser. War as a national industry is very vocal in Junkerdom, but it was not principally the Junkers who profited by either the Franco-Prussian, or the 1914-18 War. It was the international and predominantly ex-German-Jew bankers, and the big industrial cartelists who benefited. The Junkers did the fighting. As Mr. Bernard Baruch said, "Yes, probably I did have more power than anyone else in the war." more power than anyone else in the war." Mr. James Byrnes, who is said to represent Mr. Baruch in this war, is not exactly

insignificant.
So far, however, the location of the current revolution, which will provide the post-war boom equivalent to the exploitation of Russia, does not appear. Of course the British people are being exploited without a revolution.

It is instructive to note that the Vehme It is instructive to note that the Vehme cultivated the same technique as modern Socialism and Communism, posing as the protector of the poor. In order to do this in the fifteenth century it also had to masquerade as a Christian Order. It was, in fact, Satanistic, and, like Socialism and Communism, atavistic, reactionary, and anti-Christian, having the single object of keeping the general population enslaved.
