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Dependent States Lose Self-Government!

Independence for Tasmania Urged

Broadcasting on Sunday last from 7HO Hobart, a well-known social crediter, Mr. James Guthrie, B.Sc., gave some excellent and urgent advice in a talk entitled "Independence for Tasmania." Of course, his talk was addressed to Tasmanians, and contained some special references to Tasmania and circumstances in that State; but in general, Mr. Guthrie's advice applies equally to other Australian States, and we fervently hope that our readers on the mainland, as well as those in Tasmania, will take it to heart— and ACT accordingly. Hereunder we publish the full text of Mr. Guthrie's talk:

Since tomorrow has been officially designated Peace Day, some remarks seem called for. Considering the very unsettled state, not to say the very dangerous state, of the world, talk about peace seems a trifle fatuous. Let us honour those who bore the brunt of the fighting in this war, and let us do everything in our power to see that the returned men get a fair deal; but the celebration of peace seems a trifle out of place.

The whole situation was neatly summed up by an English paper, which said: "Since up by an English paper, which said: Since the idea of celebrating peace is not very popular in this country, we suggest that the victory parade take place in the land of the victors (that is, in America); after all, we have did the fighting and the paying." Here only did the fighting and the paying." Here we shall let that matter lie for the time

There is, however, a big job waiting to be done, a job, which will require some hard thinking and some hard fighting.

The question we have to ask ourselves is: What can we do in this tight little island of Tasmania to build up a stronghold which will help to arrest the march towards the Totalitarian State, and which may, when the time comes, join with other States to build up a strong Australia; and in building up a strong Australia, help to build up a strong British Commonwealth as a bulwark against world tyranny?

We in Tasmania have got to build up a strong and compact State out of sheer self-protection; we cannot afford to be dependent on people in Sydney for the essentials of existence. No groups of people on the

mainland should be given the power or the opportunity to hold this State up to ransom, either politically or economically.

The English people per person contributed vastly more than any others in the dour vastly more than any others in the dour fighting, and in contributions to the great inventions of this war. But the English people, who could not be beaten by war, have been beaten to their knees by gangs who have held up England's food supplies since the fighting was over. This should be a lesson to all of us.

Again, the crowds in the big cities have had a very much worse time during the various shortages than have the people in the country.

the country.

It is gross stupidity not to realise that one should not rely on others for more than is necessary, and, when he does, one should rely on people one can trust. That is sheer common sense. It is more; it is the instinct of mere survival. Consider the position Tasmania would have been in if she had had to rely on coal supplies from the mainland to righ her electrical power.

the mainland to rely on coal supplies from the mainland to give her electrical power. South Africa had her supplies of artificial manures cut off during the war. What did she do? She used the refuse of the cities and put it back into the soil. Never again will she be dependent on outsiders for the right to cultivate her own soil, and inciright to cultivate her own soil—and, incidentally, her soil will be vastly superior to what it has been for many years.

The free exchange of goods from one country to another is a useful and beneficial

practice, but the export of wealth can be overdone. England lost thousands of millions of pounds in that game, and she would have been very much better off now if she had used those resources to build up her own country. This is now freely recog-

own country. This is now freely recognised.

When the Premier, Mr. Cosgrove, and Senator McKenna sold Tasmania to the Canberra Bureaucracy, they struck a deadly blow at Tasmania, the State they were supposed to represent. If Tasmanians had been alive to what happened when the Premiers agreed to operate the Uniform Taxation Scheme these two men would never have seen political life again.

These two men owe political allegiance

These two men owe political allegiance to a political Party on the mainland; they have two loyalties, and so the loyalty to the people whom they pretended to represent went by the board. This should never be went by the board. This should never be permitted to happen again. The political parties are dominated by mainland gangs. We don't know what these gangs are up to, and they won't tell us; but if they do anything for the good of Tasmania, or for the good of Australia, it will only be by a very strange accident.

We have got to face the fact squarely that we are being run by gangsters, and

that we are being run by gangsters, and we have got to take some elementary precautions to protect ourselves from continually being held up by gangsters. That is the political position today. What, then, do we do about it?

I have said sufficient for men to devise means to protect themselves at least more than they have done. There is a great deal of talent in Tasmania, which could be used — a great deal more than is being used now. — a great deal more man is using used form. We have to get rid of the stupid Socialist idea that nothing can be done except on a vast scale. There is no truth in this idea, but much money behind it.

Politically, we have got to take the position in our own hands and break with the domination of the mainland political parties. We have got to see that INDEPENDENT

men and women are encouraged to stand for the next State elections, and when they stand they must be given strong and vigorous support. The ancient habit of tossing our vote to one or other of two Yes men has been played out; it has made a farce of democratic government everywhere There is a revolt against it in Tasmania, also in other States. Now is the time to prepare for the next elections.

The Australian Federation was designed to be a federation of strong independent States who joined together for certain pur-poses such as defence, free trade, post and telegraphs, and a common coinage. It was never designed to be a collection of conquered provinces, controlled by an army of occupation, and run by a central bureaucracy who treated the natives as an inferior people. Rut that is what has hap-

If a few of the Australian States had kept themselves more independent, the Can-berra Bureaucracy would never have be-come so arrogant and so contemptuous of the rights of the States; they would never have dared to do it. But the Canberra Bureaucracy has been able, through the Party organisations, to force the State politicians to sell out without a fight. This must stop.

Either a man represents the people of Tasmania, or he doesn't. If he doesn't, heis taking money under false pretences, and the people will have to establish a law in this State whereby any politician is criminally liable if he is found guilty of handing powers over this State to any men outside this State.

The position has become so serious that if something is not done quickly the political position of this State will be so helpless that we won't be able to help ourselves, or anybody else.

The scheme to centralise municipal power in the Melbourne City Council was furthered at a conference between Labor members of the Fitzroy and City Councils, held in the Melbourne Town Hall on June 4. This little clique approved the principle of amalgamation; but they evidently feel that their complete scheme of a Greater Melbourne will not be acceptable, and so they propose to achieve their end by degrees. that is, one victim at a time.

Fitzroy citizens should get busy and mobilise pressure on their local Councillors if they wish to escape being engulfed in the City Council debt trap, which would, of course, mean higher rates. They should tell their Councillors that they can manage Fitzroy affairs without the aid of City Councillors, who have not been able to manage City affairs without a huge debt.

The Melbourne "Herald," which some innocent people think supports genuine private enterprise, published in its issue of May 18 a special article on the editorial page, entitled "Free Medical Scheme Not Revolutionary.

The article started thus: "Australia is going to have a National Medical Service, free to every citizen who needs medical attention, whether it wants it or not.'

The arrogance of the local Hitlers becomes more pronounced every day. They have decided what is good for the people, irrespective of whether the people think it good or not.

The proposed National Madical "Same"

The proposed National Medical "Service will NOT be free; it will be paid for by

the people themselves through taxation.

The bureaucracy will regiment both the people and the doctors and chemists. This State serfdom is insidiously encouraged by such articles as the one in the Melbourne "Herald" mentioned above.

The worldwide campaign to destroy the British Empire continues, with the local "Capitalist" press lending a hand.

The Sydney "Sunday Telegraph" of May 26 published the following headline on page: 2: "British Empire's 'Quiet Dissolution'."

This was the heading of an article by Godfrey Blunden, in which it is suggested, "Australia may become a dependency of USA"

It is to be hoped that an increasing number of people are starting to notice how the Monopoly Press is placed at the disposal of the Socialists to conduct their anti-Brit-

Many people uncritically accept the superficial argument that, because there are now more Russians who can read and write than there were before the Revolution, there must be considerable "progress" in Soviet

Russia.

In order to test the accuracy of this argument it is necessary to know (among other things) whether the Russians have freedom to read and write as they desire.

The Russian writer, Kuzmichev, in his "Problems of Journalism," says: "All dissertations on 'objective and complete information' are liberal hypocrisy. The aim of information does not consist in commercialising news, but in educating the great masses of workers in organising them, under the exclusive direction of the Party

for clearly-defined tasks. This objective will not be attained by objective reporting of events. Liberty and objectivity of the press—these are fictions. Information is the means of the class struggle, not a mirror to reflect events objectively."

Professor Portus, of the Adelaide University, is the latest open advocate of the idea that we can only avoid another world war by creating world serfdom.

war by creating world serfdom.

He recently said in Adelaide (vide Adelaide "Advertiser" of May 17), that the sovereign State idea must be abolished.

Hitler and his backers also had that idea. Professor Portus said: "We cannot dismiss this idea of controlling the sovereign State, as being merely Utopian. The choice may well be one between the sovereign State and the extinction of civilisation.

A sovereign State is one in which the

A sovereign State is one in which the people can have effective control over their own policies. Because Hitler wanted to impose his policies on the entire world, we had a long and devastating war to maintain the right to frame our own policies. But now men such as Professor Portus tell us that our fight to preserve our sovereignty was a waste of time.

The powerful international groups who used Hitler and a highly centralised Germany to start a Second World War are now exploiting the natural reaction against war.

They are suggesting that, in order to avoid further war, we should hand over control of our affairs to an international organisation over which we will have, and can have, no control.

Both World Wars were merely incidents in a much bigger war, a war to destroy the British Empire as a prelude to the establishment of a World Tyranny. New readers of the "New Times" can make no greater mistake than to dismiss this statement as nonsense; there is overwhelming first-hand evidence to support it. BENITO BARRY: Aping Benito the Sawdust Caesar, Victorian housing dictator Barry, commenting on objections to the "Beaufort" building bungle, said the Government would have to see "that no little tin-God of a municipality was allowed to hold-up the erection of new types of homes." Presumably a very little "tin-God" (Barry) is to prevent local councillors from maintaining a reasonable standard of housing, and to compel them to accept Housing Commission hovels and tin-pot houses. Local councillors and citizens have themselves to blame for allowing their State Members to arm for allowing their State Members to arm the Housing Commission with such Gestapo powers. It's not too late to demand amendment of the Act from which the Housing Bureaucrats derive their powers. This course of action is more likely to succeed than Court actions than Court actions.

PRODUCERS' PLIGHT: A message to Victorian egg producers, published in the "Age" of May 25, warns against the move of the Egg Board to dispense with its agents and to take over the handling of eggs completely. Many agents and producers fell into the Egg Board trap, believing they would be beneficiaries. They were used to entice others into the trap, but now the Board is intensifying the centralisation, and has no further use for these dupes—and so they are to be liquidated, so to speak. However, these cast-offs and others are now organising a campaign to combat this move; they are sponsoring a petition as a protest, tney are sponsoring a petition as a protest, but it was not reported to whom the petition is directed. The sponsors of this move are H. Barnes of Blackburn, John S. Muir of Ringwood, Styles Bros, of Wallan, and Duggan Bros, of Broadmeadows. Maybe Electoral Campaigners in these districts could be of service to them.

DISASTER DESIGNS: U.S. finance experts say that the cost-of-living for millions has risen 100% or more, and predict that America is nearing disaster; the Government's estimate of 50% living-cost increase is regarded as hooey, which does not take into account the disappearance from

stores of hundreds of low-cost materials or the terrific deterioration in quality—any American housewife could tell a story which would make a mockery of the official cost-of-living index. The same conditions exist in nearly all countries, especially since exist in nearly all countries, especially since price-fixing became the vogue. As a matter of plain fact, big monopolies and semi-monopolies are using the price-fixing machinery to prevent small competitors from under-selling them. We have already seen this illustrated in such cases as that of bread baking in Melbourne. More similar rackets will doubtless soon appear.

POLES' PERIL: General Komorowski, known as General Bor, who led the unsuccessful uprising of Polish patriots against successful uprising of Polish patriots against the Germans when they thought the Russians were going to support them, only to be left to their fate by Russia, is reported thus: "Every aspect of Polish life is now controlled by a small group representing a very small proportion of Poles and maintained in power by Soviet bayonets... Russian secret police control the country." He also appeals to America and Britain to make Russia get out of Poland. Once more make Russia get out of Poland. Once more the shame of the betrayal of Poland must be remembered, and it is clear there will be no worthwhile peace in Europe while Poland remains enslaved by Russia (that also goes for all other one-time free na-tions which have been surrendered to the successors of Hitlerism).

WARD'S WILY WORDS: Word-spinner Eddy Ward has featured in yet another outburst against the High Court and its, Judges; he accuses the Court of impeding "Labor's" objectives. This abuse looks like tactics designed to divert attention from the Labor Partty's failure to improve the lot of Labor Party's failure to improve the lot of the workers; in other words, it is simply a Red Herring. WHAT SOCIAL CREDITERS ARE ABOUT

An Explanation Especially for New Readers

By ERIC D. BUTLER

One is often asked to "put Social Credit in a nut-shell." Those who ask for this nutshell explanation of Social Credit apparently believe that Social Crediters have a set of rigid blueprints for a society in which every detail of the individual's existence has been prescribed. Nothing could be further from the truth.

Social Credit has been defined as the belief by individuals that in association they

can get the results they desire.

Now, what results can be obtained in association?

When man worked separately as an individual, he was a slave to his economic circumstances; his entire waking time was taken up in getting food, clothing and shelter for himself and his family. But, as he learnt to associate with his fellows, and pool the knowledge of how to make and grow things much more efficiently, he found that he became less of a slave to economic circumstances; and today it is an irrefutable fact that knowledge has made to the physically possible for decreasing it physically possible for a decreasing number of people, working very short hours, to supply an abundance of the requirements of a civilised life for the entire population. **Economic slavery could be abolished.**

Some idea of our productive capacity in Australia may be gained from the fact that, although 800,000 of the most physically able persons were out of the production system for the duration of the war, the greatly increased. There is surely no argument that, with most of the 800,000 persons back in the production system, and with people free to associate to produce the results THEY desire, they should soon be enjoying an increasing standard of living with increasing leisure.

NOT MERE MONEY REFORMERS

And this, broadly, is what Social Crediters desire: that the individual shall have liberty and security, the right to pursue his own individual policies so long as he does not interfere with other individuals.

Social Credit has nothing to do with pre-scribing what the individual shall do with his leisure and security. Social Credit is based firmly on the Christian philosophy that the individual should have freedom to exercise the power of self-development.

In spite of the fact that it has been proved physically possible for the individual, in association, to increase both security and leisure, it is becoming obvious that he is at present being restricted or discouraged from associating to get those results.

Those who regard Social Credit as merely

Inose who regard Social Credit as merely a monetary reform scheme will at this stage say: "But it is no use social crediters telling us that a shortage of money is responsible for the present conditions; the people have more money than ever before." And the Social Crediter will not deny this statement. Today he is pointing out that a system of centralised Bureaucratic Socialism, operating the Taxation Monopoly and innumerable other methods of controlling innumerable other methods of controlling the individual, is being used to cause chaos in the community. He goes further. He is proving that the controllers of the international financial system have introduced Bureaucratic Socialism under cover of a war, which they arranged. They had a reason for doing this, and we must briefly examine some recent history in order to understand this reason.

CREDIT AND DEPRESSIONS

Just prior to the end of the 1914-1918 war, an outstanding British engineer, Major C. H. Douglas, made certain discoveries concerning the financial system and its relation-ship to the production system. There is no snip to the production system. There is no need in this article to go into the details of Douglas's technical discoveries, as there is available literature, which deals with the subject. But the first important result of Douglas's work was the publicity given to the facts that the functioning of industry and distribution depends upon the money

system, and that the money system is operated by the banking system, which manufactures nearly all money used in modern communities, this being done by the proportion of what is now constally called creation of what is now generally called bank credit.

Now, the policy of credit creation is largely controlled by international financiers, who have used local banks in the various countries to administer their policies.

There soon developed, as the result of publication of Major Douglas's ideas, a Social Credit movement which, naturally enough, devoted an enormous amount of time and energy to attacking the financial system and its controllers. The truth of system and its controllers. The truth of some of the Social Crediters' basic contentions was graphically demonstrated by the Great Depression, when a policy of creditrestriction (decided by the international controllers of the financial system, with headquarters in New York), brought chaos and suffering all over the world. "Poverty amidst plenty" became familiar words. There can be no doubt that the Great Depression was a deliberate policy, designed to produce certain results. We will return to this aspect later.

to this aspect later.

During the Depression, the Social Credit movements made considerable progress in their attacks on the financial system, and in 1935 a Government bearing the Social Credit label was elected in Alberta, a province of Canada

THE ALBERTA EXPERIMENT

The fury with which this Government was attacked, by the agents of the financial controllers, proved beyond all doubt that they were not ignorant of what they were doing. Major Douglas writes as follows in one of his books, "The Big Idea":

"If the Social Credit Government of Alberta had done nothing—and it has done many things—to justify its extence, the

many things—to justify its existence, the demonstration afforded by its enemies of one fundamental factor in the world situation would still have made it a landmark in human history.

"That factor, completely demonstrated by the actions of the Canadian Federal Government in disallowing every Act of the Provincial Legislature directed to the inauguration of Social Credit, is that the Secret Government is determined to keep the world in turmoil until its own rule is supreme, so that one uninformed mob may be mobilised against another, should either become dangerous. I do not think that anyone who will take the trouble to consider the actions of the Canadian Federal Government, can fail to appreciate exactly why centralisation. Federal Union (now called the United Nations) and other 'Bigger and Better' Governments are the most

deadly menace with which humanity is faced today."

In spite of obstacles, the Social Credit Government of Alberta has done things, which no other Government in the world

In the two elections since 1935, one in In the two elections since 1935, one in 1940 and the last in 1944, the electors of Alberta have given increased support to Social Credit. But the monopoly press of the world has deliberately maintained a conspiracy of silence on the Albertan Experiment. Apart from forcing the controllers of the international financial system to show their body that Albertan Experi to show their hands, the Albertan Experiment has also demonstrated the bitter opposition of the international Socialists and Communists to Social Credit. In fact, it soon became obvious to the Social Crediters that the Communists, Socialists and various other groups were being backed by the international financiers.

BIG FINANCE AND SOCIALISM

In 1945, Rothschild, one of the most influential of the international financiers, became leader of the British "Labour" (Socialist) Party in the House of Lords and helped to have ratified the financial scheme by which the British Empire was scheme by which the British Empire was to be virtually taken over by his New York friends. The scheme referred to is the Bretton Woods Monetary Agreement, foisted on Great Britain after she had been exhausted by a long war. Another influ-ential financier, Mr. James Warburg, of New York, has openly proclaimed himself in favour of Socialism

or Communism is that it is Monopoly imposed on the people and backed by force: the Police State.

the Police State.

Although continuation of the present system of debt-finance means that the assets of the entire world inevitably become the property of the controllers of the international financial system, any attempt to actually take over the property at present would probably lead to revolt, particularly in the British countries. To prevent such revolt there first must be the destruction of private property by Socialism and the of private property by Socialism and the establishment of the Police State a la Rus-

There is little doubt that it was confidently expected that the Great Depression would create conditions for the furtherance of socialistic legislation. There is adequate evidence of how such socialistic groups as P.E.P. (Political and Economic Planning) in Great Britain were backed

by such institutions as the Bank "of England." In 1938 the official journal of P.E.P. made a most illuminating statement.

It said that it was only in war or under the threat of war that the British people

would submit to large-scale planning as in Soviet Russia.

This statement was a clear admission that the Great Depression had not produced the complete regimented State in British countries; that in fact it produced a growing revolt against financial domination which, if unchecked, would result in financial re-forms which would remove the crises neces-sary for the growth of Socialism or Communism; and that a war was necessary to bring the British Empire under effective control. To have a war there must be an aggressor. The aggressor was at hand in the form of Hitler and the centralised Ger-

An enormous amount of first-hand evidence has been produced to show that in-ternational financiers brought Hitler to power and financed his rearmament programme.

THE NEW CONTROLLERS

As soon as the military war started, it became obvious that the Plotters had their specially trained key men all ready to take charge of the enormous bureaucracies that were quickly established in British countries. Most of these specially trained key men came from an institution known as the London School of Economics, established by the German-inspired Fabian Socialists in England and heavily endowed by at least one powerful interretional financier. one powerful international financier, a German-Jew named Cassel. This London School of Economics has been staffed largely

by alien Communists and Socialists.

It is interesting to note that a Federal
"Labor" Government in Australia, advised
by a London School of Economics product, Dr. Coombs, is imposing on Australians the same bureaucratic socialism that a Federal "Liberal" Government in Canada, advised by another London School of Economics product, Dr. Marsh, is imposing on Cana-

It is becoming more and more obvious every day that the centralised bureaucra-cies established during the war are going to be continued permanently—unless vigor-ous action is taken to defeat them. Before the war the major instrument of control was the money system. Money was a licence to live. The international controllers of the money system therefore controlled the licences. But, as already seen, this control wasn't sufficient. The number of licences necessary to live had to be extended. And the war has allowed this to be accomplished. Poverty amidst plenty has been "solved" by destroying the plenty, creating shortages and making it necessary for people not only to have a money licence, but also coupons and other licences. By maintaining high taxation and destruc-

By maintaining high taxation and destructive regulations, it is no doubt expected that permanent shortages necessitating permanent rationing, with an increasing staff of controllers, can be maintained.

Bearing in mind our original definition of Social Credit—that people in association can get the results they desire—it now becomes apparent why Social Crediters are at present devoting more attention to mobilising public opinion against centralised bureaucratic control and the Taxation Monopoly than to talking about the financial system. cial system.

cial system.

It is true of course, that the banking system is still one of the major instruments of control, but it is now strongly buttressed with other instruments, if not being replaced by them.

THE BRITISH EMPIRE

Broadly speaking, it appears that the international groups who seek complete domination of the entire world hope to use their present systems of control to intensify the crisis in British countries to the stage where the revolutionary elements can break down all opposition to complete serfdom. The two World Wars and the Great Depression were all designed to eliminate the British Empire, because it is in this Empire that the greatest progress has been made to-wards a society in which the individual has learnt to control his institutions for his own

If the present crisis, which must continue to be intensified while the policies which caused the crisis continue to be pursued, is to be resolved in a victory for individual security AND liberty, it is urgently essential that there be a complete exposure of the nature of the plot against civilisation.

the nature of the plot against civilisation.

If British publicists such as Mr. Douglas Reed had been allowed to tell the British public the truth about Germany's preparation for war as a result of the policies of Adolf Hitler and his backers, the Second World War might have been averted. But the powerful interests who expected to further their aims as a result of war made certain that the British people knew little of what was happening.

of what was happening.

Social Crediters are endeavouring to remove the secrecy, which surrounds the policies and identity of these interests. It is foolish for people to say that the policy for every people where the people was a surrounded to the people where the people was a surrounded to the people where the people was a surrounded to the peop of exposure being conscientiously pursued in the "New Times" is merely a policy of "destructive criticism." It is only by making public the real objectives and methods of the Plotters that sufficient opposition can be mobilised to take correct action to defeat them.

CURRENT COMMENT

A glance through the latest balance-sheets of the main Appetral; of the main Australian companies reveals the important fact that stocks-in-hand at the end of the financial year are in most cases far in excess of previous

That is to say that many companies are deliberately refraining from selling more than a restricted quantity, because any increase in sales is penalised by an excessive increase in taxation rates, which automatically puts their business on an un-economic basis.

Now this restriction of effort is not confined to companies. The practice is universal. The coal-miner who only works four days a week is operating on the same principle. And so is the dairy farmer who is only milking forty cows instead of a possible sixty. All extra effort, instead of being rewarded, is being heavily penalised,

with disastrous consequences.

It seems obvious and beyond dispute that TAXATION IS CRIPPLING and reducing the people of this country (not to mention the rest of the world) to a state of complete chaos. This is no accident.

In 1936 an eminent American lawyer, Malcolm McDermott, spent a considerable time in Germany endeavouring to discover the progressive steps by which German Nazism was introduced. "Economically the people must be kept down by high taxes which under one pretext or another they are called upon to pay. Thus they are brought to a common level, and all income above a meagre level is taken from them.

"In this manner economic independence is kept to a minimum, and the citizen is forced to rely more and more upon the Government that controls him...."

And the high taxation policy, which is being imposed upon the Australian people, is simply part of a deliberate policy, which aims at Australian Nazism as a step to World Nazism. The immediate answer is for the Australian people to demand a reduction in taxation of at least 50% in order that the production system can operate to full capacity. system can operate to full capacity.

TRUTH ABOUT NATIONAL INSURANCE **SUPPRESSED**

The "Hampstead Parliament" in England is a debating society, which debates the current topics of the day according to Parliamentary rules. It meets in the Hampstead Town Hall, and claims to be the oldest society of its kind in the country. A local paper, the "Hampstead News," makes a special weekly feature of reporting the debates, usually to the length of a column and a half.

Every debate during the recent session, which closed on March 27, was reported at some length in the issue of the following week, except the debate, which occurred on March 13, when the motion was allotted to the Independent members. All mention of this debate was absent from the usual column, which was filled with heterogeneous matter of no obvious urgency instead.

The Order of the Day was as follows: — Mr. C. G. Dobbs (Croydon South), Ind. (Social Credit), to move:

"That in the opinion of this House the right to contract out from National Insurance (including Health Insurance) is fundamental to the maintenance of freedom and should be the prerogative of every citizen, irrespective of income."

Seconder: Capt. Arthur Rogers (Honiton), Independent.

The following is a brief resume of the opening speech, a copy of which was sent to the "Hampstead News": —

"Insurance is a contract undertaken for fear of lack of money. This fear is, in general, justified or not according to the monetary policy pursued by those who control the Nation's credit. Since the nationalisation of the Bank ["of England"], the Government at Westminster claims to be in control of the Nation's credit and its intended policy can be judged by the fact tended policy can be judged by the fact that compulsory insurance against poverty is to be imposed on everybody except those who are already very poor (those with incomes under £75 per year).

"Compulsory State Insurance was first year by Bismers (1883) as a means of re-

used by Bismarck (1883) as a means of reducing the common people to a state of subservience to the Government.

"It was first applied to the poorest and most helpless class in this country by a "Liberal" Government in 1911, and the income limit raised twice thereafter to include those whom debasement of the currency had reduced to a similar state of poverty. In 1942, at a critical stage of the War, the Government launched a huge progrands company in fover of the paganda campaign in favour of the Beveridge Report, which recommended universal State Insurance, and in the 1945 election no opportunity was given to the electors of voting against it.

"All members of the governmental class, of all Parties, are agreed that compulsory national insurance is a progressive measure conferring freedom from want upon the poor whose burdens will be lightened by the inclusion of the higher income groups. As one has come to expect, this is the reverse of the truth, as may be judged by anyone who will give honest answers to the following who will give honest answers to the following

"(1.) Who suffers more from a levy of 4/7 or 5/9 a week—the rich or the poor?
"(2.) Who suffers more from having to comply with the innumerable and unlimited conditions attached to the receipt of bene-fits—the rich, who can afford to forego them, or the poor, who cannot?

"(3.) Who suffers more from a fine of £10, and £10 per day after a first conviction, for failure to comply with any of the regulations or conditions, especially those attached to the receipt of benefit—the rich

or the poor?
"(4.) Who suffers more from having to limit earnings to £1 a week, or have them deducted from a pension of 26/-, those who have to live on the State retirement pen-sion, or those who have savings or a civil

"(5.) Who needs most the benefits of such an Insurance Scheme if they are to escape the extremes of want? Obviously, the very poorest, those with under £75 per year, who by reason of their poverty are exempted from participation. empted from participation.

NOTE ON MAGNA CARTA

The following letter to the editor was published in the "A.B.C. Weekly," Sydney, on April 20, 1946: —

Mr. Peter Coleman's letter (29/9/45) confirms what I said about the attitude of some people today towards Magna Carta. What such critics fail to see is that they judge events and personalities of the past by pr day standards instead of by the light of contemporary history.

No one claims Magna Carta was a full and complete charter of freedom—a sheet anchor is not the whole ship—neither do we deny that vassalage or villenage existed in England, as throughout Europe (in countries where actual slavery did not exist), but what other country in Europe produced anything approaching Magna Carta nearly 250 years before the first glimmerings of the Renaissance (1453)?

No doubt Mr. Coleman recollects the case No doubt Mr. Coleman recollects lie case of the slave Somerset in 1772, when the Court of the King's Bench declared: "Slavery could not exist in Great Britain." That was nearly a century before the serfs in Russia (1863-64) and the slaves in the U.S.A. (1862-64) were freed.

Living on an island, I have no easy access to reference libraries or encyclopedias
—children's or otherwise—but I have by
me two pronouncements on Magna Carta:

"It protected every individual of the nation in the free enjoyment of his life, his

liberty, and his property, unless declared forfeited by the judgment of his peers or by the law of the land."—Sir William Blackstone (not unknown to the legal fra-

ternity even today!).

"It is still the keystone of English liberty. All that has since been obtained is little better than a confirmation or commentary; and even if every subsequent law were to be swept away, there would still remain the bold features that distinguish

remain the bold features that distinguish a free from a despotic monarchy."—Hallam's "Middle Ages," chapter 8.

Had the Axis won the war Mr. Coleman would have very quickly learned how precious was the Charter that I dared to "boost," when the freedom founded on it had slipped away from us through "our vanity and short-sightedness."

the unnecessary and iniquitous sales-tax, the unnecessary and iniquitous sales-tax, etc., which so greatly increase living costs. The High Court does not prevent "Labor" from stopping monopoly zoning, and other forms of Fascism practised by "Labor" stalwarts; nor does it prevent "Labor" from introducing a National Production Bonus which would ensure that workers had full financial access to the wealth they produce. Until "Labor" leaders attend to these basic matters, they are hypocritical to seek scapegoats for their own failure.

"BEAUFORT" BUILDING: After all the ballyhoo about the low cost of pre-fabricated houses, a first specimen of the Government's "Beaufort" steel-fibroplaster dwelling has been put on show. It is expected to sell at between £1100 and £1500. This price does not include land or any additional costs involved in water and sewerage connections: taking a reasonably sewerage connections; taking a reasonably priced outer-suburban block of land at £100 and sewerage at £50, the cheapest of these chicken-coops will cost £1250. British-built metal two-storey pairs of maisonettes have also been offered at £2500—if admitted duty free. On a price basis, such houses, for purchase or rent, seem well above the reach of wage earners, which means that real incomes must be increased—or housing standards must be reduced to packing-case

LABOR LOGIC: Appointment of a Royal Commission to determine a living standard commensurate with Australia's productive wealth is urged by a Labor regional conference, representing Reid, Parramatta and Lang A.L.P. Federal Electorate Councils. Here we observe a faint but encouraging flicker of light. It has been repeatedly pointed out to Laborites that, if workers are to have greater access to the wealth are to have greater access to the wealth Australia can produce, they must receive additional income in such a way that it does not go through industry as a cost. At the present time many employers pay bonuses on extra production; this production-bonus idea is what is required on a national scale, with the important difference that a national bonus must not go through industry, but must be provided from new money (not from taxation, which would be foolish and useless). This is the result that workers must demand from their so-called leaders

NUREMBERG NOTIONS: The Nuremberg war criminals' trial has approached its fifth month, with every appearance of lasting another five months, and is arousing criticism as to its usefulness; the cost of the trial is estimated at £5000 a week. Commenting on this, a Melbourne "Herald" correspondent Trayer Smith surgests the correspondent, Trevor Smith, suggests that many regard the trial "as an immense piece of propaganda hocus-pocus on the part of the Allies." ELECTORS, BEWARE OF R. G. CASEY!

(A Letter to the Editor from Bruce H. Brown. Concluded from last issue.)

Sir, —Apart from the harm already done to the great bulk of the people of Australia through the agency of Richard Gardiner Casey, the portents for the future are even more ominous, for he has openly joined the gang who profess loyalty to His Majesty the King while actually working to undermine the King's sovereignty.

During the time he was political head of the Commonwealth Treasury, Mr. Casey went abroad for consultation with the spokesmen of the Secret Power controlling all governments, and, as previously men-tioned, actually tried to have the Comtioned, actually tried to have the Commonwealth Bank handed over to them. Subsequent to that, he went to Washington as Australian Minister, where he had the opportunity to increase his personal acquaintance with the Hierarchy of Jewish international policy, headed by the actual, though unofficial, Jewish President of the United States, Bernard M. Baruch. One of the main features of this Jewish policy is of the main features of this Jewish policy is to secure the surrender by Governments the world over of their national sovereignty and have it transferred to a World "Board" or "Fund" under Jewish control. Among or rund under Jewish control. Among other prominent Jews actively working for the same end are Felix Frankfurter (personal friend of Dr. Evatt), Sol Bloom, Henry Morgenthau, Israel Moses Sieff, and Professor Harold Laski. Like Dr. Evatt, Mr. Casey is reported to have met most of them

them.

Perhaps his own public remarks are the best possible indication of the real purpose of Mr. Casey's return to Australia. "I believe," he said, "that the day of unrestricted Nationalism is on the wane, believe that within the next ten years, if the world is to survive, a lot of edges of national sovereignty will have to be smoothed off by greater international co-operation." (Melbourne "Argus," 8/5/46.) From this it looks as though he has heard of the ten year plan under which the con-

of the ten-year plan under which the con-trollers of Wall and Pine Streets expect the assets of the British Empire to be sur-rendered to them because of the physical impossibility of complying with the requirements of the latest loan conditions and the Bretton Woods "Agreement." Lord Beaverbrook spoke the literal truth when he said that this "agreement", if put into effect, will destroy the British Empire. It is thus obvious that any person owing allegiance to His Majesty the King who assists to bring about such a surrender of British assets is a traitor and should be arraigned as such.

To avoid placing himself in the position in which he could be classed as a traitor, Mr. Casey should dissociate himself at once from Casey should dissociate himself at once from all activity connected with what he has called "smoothing off of a lot of edges of national sovereignty." That so-called smoothing-off process is already proceeding at an alarming rate, and if continued consequences will be disastrous. Only two classes of people are advocating interference with national sovereignty—Firstly, those with Sinister design seeking centralisation of power, and secondly, those who have not taken the trouble to understand this plot and have been mesmerised into believing that wars arise from people minding their own business in their own homes. Mr. Casey's reported utterances at the Australian-American gathering on May 7 are further examples of loose talk by men who should know better. What, for in stance, is this "nationalism" about which he snoke and where has there been unrespoke, and where has there been unre-

stricted practice of it? I have been unable to find evidence of any country of international importance

whose people in the last fifty years have lived entirely to themselves or of them-selves. Not even Germany under Herr Hitler and his National Socialism! Treference to "unrestricted nationalism" just as absurd as the irresponsible talk of supposedly responsible men of the R. G. Casey type about "unlimited credit" whenever the fraudulence of the present financial system is mentioned.

Even Germany, the country reported to have been the greatest advocate of "nationalism," never at any time refused all relationships with others or to exchange goods with them. It is true that conflicting reports are in circulation about conditions in Germany prior to the war; but there is a lot of evidence to support the claim that the German economic authorities found a way of conducting international trade without having to depend on the international financiers at all—and thereby committed an unpardonable sin, in the opinion of the international financiers. I have been wondering whether that is the real reason why we have been so assiduously taught by all the international news-collecting agencies and all "national" broadcasting stations that the Germans sought to intensify their nationalism at the expense of someone else's internationalism.

Who but the few concerned in the World-Power Plot would have the hardihood to say that internationalism would be more beneficial to ordinary men and women than nationalism has been found to be?

nationalism has been found to be?

If Mr. Casey is in favour of our British Australasian citizenship being submerged in
some other form of citizenship to be arranged by alien usurpers, then let him say
so in plain English instead of posing as a
patriot while seeking our surrender. If he
thinks others have a greater right and are
better qualified to manage our local affairs
than gamine Australians themselves then than genuine Australians themselves, then let him say so instead of indulging in so much palaver; but if his real purpose is to deceive us into surrendering our birthright while he makes out that he is helping us to keep it, then he obviously is in the same class as Dr. Arnold Toynbee, who confessed that he denies with his lips what he does with his hands.

Hundreds of thousands of responsible citizens are now aware that for many years past there has been a well-organised and heavily financed group of internationalists working feverishly to undermine the sovereignty of people generally over their own affairs. This group has included men under solemn oath of allegiance to His Majesty the King, men who, despite this oath of fealty have thus been conspiring oath of fealty, have thus been conspiring against the Sovereign and working to under-

mine his sovereignty in his own Realm,
This question of national sovereignty is of vital importance, and those who seek to weaken it are subversive. By his own admissions, Mr. Casey has put himself in alignment with these subversive people, and has thereby made himself a greater menace than he was before. Beware of
