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Bureaucracy and Taxes **Restrict**

Why Houses Are Scarce and Dear

Again and again in these columns we have emphasised that the housing problem is artificial, and that its solution is seriously hampered and retarded by Government action such as the imposition of bureaucratic restrictions and taxes which inflate prices or kill the incentive of workers and employers alike.

Further revealing information on this subject is provided in the following article written specially for the "New Times" by J. M. At-kinson, President of the Victorian Builders' and Allied Trades' Association: -

The belief is held generally that the war is solely responsible for Australia's housing shortage, but that is not the case. The war involved some five years of Government controls over and above all its other con-trols that made houses scarce and dear for years past.

To get a complete picture of the political lunacy that blights the land, we must ap-preciate the fact that practically all legis-lation is of a negative character: "Thou shalt not," etc. Some 3000 National Se-curity Regulations all began with the "Thou shalt not" effect shalf not" effect.

PRIVATE ENTERPRISE

For the past twenty years, at least, Gov-ernments of all Parties have imposed heavy eroments of all Parties have imposed heavy burdens on the home-builder, and when their cumulative efforts make house-building unprofitable the cry goes forth that "Private Enterprise has failed," the heavy hand of Government takes further negative action and a Bill to control "Building Operations and Building Materials" passes rapidly through both Houses of the Vic-torian Parliament, and Mr. Barry becomes the High Priest of everything used in home construction and the Act provides a penalty or gaol and a £500 fine for any otherwise respectable citizen who dares to infringe any one of its bureaucratic Fascist decrees.

Let us examine the charge that Private Enterprise has failed. Between 1920 and 1939, including depression years, private home builders (apart from thousands of factories and shops) built 98,703 homes or enough, allowing an average of four persons

to each home, to house 400,000 people, or nearly half the people in the metropolitan area of Melbourne.

In 1928 homes built in and around Mel-bourne numbered 10,060, or twice the ave-rage yearly number erected in the period 1920-1939.

This clearly shows that the present housing problem can be rapidly solved if ma-terials are made available, and that 100,000 homes could be erected by private builders in the next five years.

THE TIMBER HOLD-UP

The Victorian Railways have ordered 14,000,000 super feet of Red Gum timber, practically the whole Victorian output, almost preventing the use of this necessary material for the stumps upon which wooden house are created.

material for the stumps upon which wooden houses are erected. Queensland and New South Wales have practically prevented all timber exports into Victoria, despite Section 92 of the Federal Constitution, which says that trade between the States shall be free.

Before the war, Murray pine came into Victoria at 12/6 per 100 lineal feet. New South Wales tries to prevent its export to-day, but it is "black-marketed" across the Murray and sold at 30/- per 100 feet. Tasmanian King William Pine, Celery and other pines and other Tasmanian timbers

are practically unobtainable in Victoria, and only "off cuts" (waste shorts and narrows) only reach the Victorian market.

EFFECT OF PRICE CONTROL

Price Control has a disastrous effect on several articles used in home construction,

Significant Political Pointers

these two essential commodities, as the fol-lowing facts so eloquently prove: Kiln-dried hardwood, 6 in. x 1 in, is priced at $29/10\frac{1}{2}d$ per 100 lineal feet. Now, it must be understood that this is the hard-wood now material from which flooring is produced. When this material, 6 in. x 1 in, is dressed and milled to $5\frac{1}{4}$ in. x $\frac{3}{4}$ in cost-ing anything up to $4\frac{1}{2}$ per 100 lineal feet in the process, it must then be sold at the fixed price of $29\frac{1}{2}$, or $10\frac{1}{2}d$ less than in the rough. the rough.

The case of weatherboards is similarly stupid, and material that costs 29/5 per 100 lineal feet to produce must, by the order of the Federal Price Fixers, be sold at 25/3, with the result that millers, who must make profits to remain in business, cannot, and will not cut flooring or weatherboards at will not, cut flooring or weatherboards at a loss. Moreover, up to 25 per cent, of the usable portion of a log goes in sawdust.

IMPORT RESTRICTIONS

The position with Oregon timber is de-plorable, and the State Government should make an immediate approach to the Federal Government to allow the import of quanti-

ties of Canadian Oregon and allow importers to import duty-free for at least five years. In 1939, oregon cost 31/6 per 100 super feet, while to-day it costs 92/- or/ 97/- for selected lots, or three times the pre-war price.

Just prior to the war, ships bringing ex-Just prior to the war, ships bringing ex-plosives to Australia from England used large amounts of oregon in the packing of the explosives. One vessel, between Mel-bourne and Sydney, dumped 200,000 lineal feet of 4 in. x 3 in. and 100,000 lineal feet of 3 in. x 2 in. oregon into the ocean, be-cause Australia's tariff policy would mean heavy costs and delays in landing it. Apart from "go slow" tactics, which also reduce production, endless tariff duties

The plot to re-impose the bread-zoning monopoly in Melbourne is to be furthered by the creation of a committee of five, appointed by State Cabinet; this is the sequel to the deputation last Easter from vested interests to Mr. Cain.

An interesting move this time is to appoint representatives of the Housewives' Association who will, of course, be in a minority, and therefore quite useless.

This is the usual way to silence opponents, especially if they are given a lucrative job on any Board that is set up. Readers will remember that this is what happened to so-called leaders of the egg and wheat industries.

In these circumstances, housewives should object to having minority representation for the purpose of fooling consumers. There is no need for this committee and no need for another control Board. Housewives' Association members should act NOW to nip this plot in the bud.

MEAT MONOPOLY: The monopoly powers of the Meat Board bureaucrats are in danger of being declared invalid. In this connection, Mr. Justice Roper of the Equity Court granted an injunction against the meat grabs by the Board until August 6 on the grounds that "the regulations were to secure the defence of Australia and the effective prosecution of the war." Thus it is clear they were not intended as an in-strument for imposing rationing "to feed starving Europe." There is reason to bestarving Europe." There is reason to be-lieve that the meat bureaucrats realise they were acting illegally in this matter, because the Melbourne "Sun" of July 4 tells us that two Bills are to be brought down to reconstruct the Meat Board and to extend its powers. This is similar to the plot to extend the Egg Board monopoly, and it illustrates how these bureaucratic leeches are determined to hang on-with the assistance of the politicians.

Housing levied on everything that goes into the pro-duction and the fittings of a home increase the final cost to the purchaser.

RESULT AND REMEDY

Politicians give endless lip service to the "increased standard of living," but their endless political follies double the price of a home

Any young couple about to marry should be able to pay for a decent house in, say, 15 years at £1 or 25/- a week, but because of the taxes and duties levied by Gov-ernments its costs double and the couple ernments its costs double and the couple must take some thirty years to pay for their home—in effect, their standard of liv-ing is reduced by £1 or 25/- a week over the second 15 years of their married life. There is one way to cheapen houses and accelerate their production: Get the heavy hand of Government out of the present mess, reduce taxes (espe-cially on all building materials), remove tariff restrictions and allow materials to be rapidly and cheaply produced.

tariff restrictions and allow materials to be rapidly and cheaply produced. Should this be done (and it can and must be done), the thousands of splendid builders, freed from the nonsense of Gov-ernment control, can easily erect 100,000 homes in the next four or five years, enough to house another 400,000 to 500,000 people and so solve Victoria's housing problem.

THE HOUSING COMMISSION

The Housing Commission was established to reclaim slum areas, but like almost all Government Departments has grown far be-yond its "infant intentions."

To date it has incurred a loss of about £100,000 and will multiply this several times

count, and that it is recognised merely as a financial phenomenon.

FOOD FRONT: The British Ministry of Food is under fire because it declined to buy 175,000 tons of turkeys offered from Argentina. Meanwhile Essex farmers complain that hundreds of thousands of bananas were fed to pigs when they were condemned in bulk by the Food Ministry. Again, press reports inform us that thousands of parcels of food are deteriorating in store; this is not denied by officials. Now comes bread rationing. Further reports say that British production is down, because (a) workers lack energy because of insufficient food, (b) workers are worried because of domestic cares: no homes and evictions, (c) they are fed-up because of high taxation. While this is going on their ex-enemies are receiving the Britishers' food, despite the fact that a recent poll, reported in the Melbourne "Sun" of July 2, showed that 77% opposed being starved for other nations. Thus it is clear that their Government, or more properly, those behind the scenes, ignore the people in the name of democracy. Later reports say that British women are not going to "take it."

Early this year, when the Federal Gov-ernment was furthering its attack upon the sovereignty of the States by insisting that Uniform Taxation be made permanent, it was pointed out in this journal that Mr. Menzies and his associates were just as much in favour of the Federal Government retaining power over all taxation as were their Socialist "opponents."

The correctness of this view was demon-strated when, after the "debate" at Can-berra on the subject, not one Member of the "Opposition" voted against the Bill to make Uniform Taxation permanent.

Now he says: "Production matters more Now he says: "Production matters more than employment." It is true that "certi-fied" economists were "work silly," disre-garding whether a project spelt production or not; but it is reasonably clear to all but financial front-blowers that manpower and all other controls hindered production—and still do. WAR AGAINST THE BRITISH EMPIRE

(A letter to the Editor from Bruce H. Brown).

Sir, —Almost daily we see fresh evidence of the intensification of the war on the British Empire. Among the latest was the report, in the 7 p.m. news from the A.B.C. national broadcasting stations on July 4, that "Zionist Headquarters in the United States are deluging members of Congress, warning them that they will not be re-elected if the Loan to the United Kingdom passes."

That is no idle threat, either, for the same people were able a few years ago to bring about the defeat of Louis McFadden because he was an irrepressible critic in Congress of World Jewry. But it does help to confirm the statements in the "New Times" that the United States is politically under Jewish control, and that that is the country from which much of the world's trouble emanates

world's trouble emanates. The attack now being waged on Great Britain is worldwide, and I think it ad-visable to place on record in these columns visable to place on record in these columns two items of importance, which have just occurred here in Australia. The first is the appearance of the Honourable Arthur Calwell at a Jewish gathering in East Syd-ney, and the second a meeting of the Coun-cil for Civil Liberties in Melbourne at which the Honourable E. J. Holloway was billed to take the leading part in Jewish interests.

MR. CALWELL'S STATEMENT

The meeting at East Sydney took place on July 1, and the following report was broadcast in the 7.45 a.m. session of the A.B.C. news on July 2: —

'The Minister for Information and Immi-gration (Mr. Calwell), speaking at the Headquarters of East Sydney Jewry last night, told the meeting that his Department, assisted by a typist and typewriter from the Australian Council of Jewry, had re-cently rushed through 2000 landing per-mits for relatives of Jews in Australia to enable these victims of German concentration camps to become architects of their own fortunes in Australia. The Minister said that Australia should become known at home and abroad as a tolerant nation, a and that was eager to welcome all comers at all times, regardless of their nationality or at all times, regardless of their nationality or previously prescribed immigration conditions, Mr. Calwell said he had dispensed with the necessity of landing money, on the ground that a citizen without money was as good as one with it." In the light of present conditions these remarks have more then usual significance

In the light of present conditions these remarks have more than usual significance. All around the world, Jews are abusing and attacking the British Government and deliberately putting obstacles in the way of those who are administering British af-fairs. This attitude is shared by "British" Jews as it is by all the other kinds of Jews. At the very time when Jews and their age long policy are causing great em their age-long policy are causing great em-barrassment to His Majesty the King it is a matter for suspicion that one of his Min-isters should publicly announce that the Department of State under his control is being used to specially facilitate their entry to this country, thus increasing the probability of the development here of un-desirable conditions of the kind being ex-perienced elsewhere.

ANTI-BRITISH ACTIVITIES

Another significant feature of the general Another significant feature of the general situation is that Jewish spokesmen use such peace-provoking words! For example, ac-cording to the Melbourne "Argus" of June 15, Dr. Joseph Tenembaum, President of the U.S. Federation of Polish Jews, de-scribed Mr. Bevin as "a disciple of Hitler," and said that Britain was "the problem child of the world and a barrier to peace" child of the world and a barrier to peace." Others have openly said that they are at war with the Empire. That being so, how comes it that a Minister of the Crown facilitates the entry to this British com-munity of great numbers of people who are at war with us and whose principal loyalty is above loyalty to His Majesty the King—people whose history shows them to be anti-Christian, anti-British, and revolu-tionary? It should also be borne in mind that apart from the position in Palestine, "American" representatives of the same people are responsible for the attempt being made to strangle our kith and kin of the made to strangle our kith and kin of the United Kingdom by withholding supplies and trying to prevent others from coming to the rescue. In my view, it should be a first requisite to citizenship here that that sort of thing will be opposed to the ut-most and the authors of it exposed. But where are the signs of opposition on the

"CIVIL LIBERTIES" MEETING

On July 4, the so-called Council for Civil Liberties arranged a similar meeting and Mr. E. J. Holloway as the principal speaker. Mr. Holloway did not appear, but, like Mr. Calwell, sent a suitable letter, and Mr. J. V. Barry, K.C., was kindly at hand to substitute for him! Some of the expressions used in the letter from Mr. Holloway are interesting. He referred to "the terrible old world curse of anti-Semi-"the terrible old world curse of anti-Semi-tism," and called it "a creeping, sinister movement." He mentioned "filthy propa-ganda in our own country," and said, "If there is a cancerous growth or a germ-infected spot this potential monster must be brought to bay in the open." This lan-guage suggests that he, too, might have had assistance or inspiration from the Austra-lian Council of Jewry. He made no attempt whatever to indi-

He made no attempt whatever to indi-cate clearly what he meant by "anti-Semi-tism" or the "cancerous growth," or to give any explanation of the strange fact that apparently every generation has had rea-son to be dissatisfied with the practices of Jewry. The "filthy propaganda" and "can-cerous" conditions are evidently not new, and it seems peculiar that Labor Ministers of the Crown can become pro-Jewish and of the Crown can become pro-Jewish and anti-Gentile and at the same time feel that they are doing the right thing by the Gen-tiles who placed them where they are.

The Australian Council for Civil Liberties, at its eleventh annual meeting, expressed concern about the problem of "anti-Semi-tism." This is significant.

is a curious and not altogether insig-It is a curious and not altogether insig-nificant fact that the instigator of the cen-tralised electric Grid system in England (Samuel Insull), the head of the centralised T.V.A., large hydroelectric scheme in the United States (David Eli Lilienthal), and the planner of the centralised Yallourn electric supply system in Victoria (Sir John Monash), are all known as Jews.

A stir has been caused by the insertion in the daily press of a bogus advertisement by the Labor Party purporting to quote from confidential Liberal Party notes.

The unseemly reaction of Labor members when the matter was aired in the House is a clear indication of the measure of in-tegrity operating in Federal politics today. 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IS IT ACCIDENTAL OR DELIBERATE?

Peaceful Progress Possibilities Prevented

By JAMES GUTHR1E, B.Sc.

Today, many people who have escaped that deadly process of intellectual doping which goes under the name of "modern education" must have thought often enough about the very great absurdities which confront us in this world.

We hear, for example, of aeroplanes which speed through the air at over 600 miles an hour, with the immediate possibility of greatly increasing that speed; we hear of the amazing and brilliant research and cooperation, which made the "atomic bomb" possible.

But we sit back and wonder rather wistfully why we, supposedly helped by the all-powerful Government, cannot get much-needed coal out of the ground, or build such simple things as five-roomed cottages in any but trifling numbers.

Now, people who can make 'planes that fly at 600 miles an hour are not stupid people; people who fought for six years against powerful enemies, inside and outside their country, without squealing, are not lacking in courage or ingenuity.

Why, then, do they behave like political half-wits?

This question requires to be answered, and I think the survival of our civilisation requires that at least a few of us should obtain the right answer in the very short time that is left to us.

We have often heard the remark that our statesmen are not what they used to be, that we lack honest statesmanship. Whatever truths lie embedded in that belief, I don't think that this line of research will take us very far.

POLITICAL PURPOSES

Dr. Tudor Jones, of Liverpool University, has stated: "Not much skill is required in the truly political Art, and such is the nature of man, much more skill is required to make things go wrong continuously than to devise means for allowing them to go right. No, the politicians have become, instead of devisers of ease for people getting on with their work, manufacturers of difficulty: makers of messes for other and better people to clear up.

Politicians are work makers; "Full Em-ployment" is their slogan. But "Full Employment" is not their only slogan. Al-though the people are to be fully employed, they are to be allowed to taste the full fruits of their labour.

This task of observation is not easy with power-driven machinery pouring out goods on an ever-increasing scale. It requires very clever men to dam or divert this mighty stream, and to prevent more than a trickle of it getting into the homes of the people the people.

War, of course, is an excellent means of keeping people fully employed and, at the same time, preventing them doing much for themselves. But there are other means. The vast Federal Bureaucracy not only keeps an army of men polishing seats in Govern-ment offices, but it can keep the rest of the community so busy that they have no time to do anything useful.

I cannot see how any experienced person, surveying the last twenty-five years, can doubt that this satanic policy of frustration, of obstruction of human effort, is deliberate.

FINANCIAL FRUSTRATION

Dr. Tudor Jones, quoting from the "In-come Tax Payer" of England, gives a com-parison between salaries of 1913 and 1945. Taking the official cost-of-living figures, and deducting income tax, he found that £1000 a year, last year, could not buy what £300 a year bought in 1913. This comparison was based on the bare living basis, and did not allow for the extortionate prices of uncon-trolled articles or the great rise in indirect trolled articles, or the great rise in indirect taxation; nor did it allow for the very low quality of goods compared with 1913.

The British Government recently gave the figure of 8/4 as the purchasing power of the $\pounds 1$ note, compared with the $\pounds 1$ in 1913. The Australian pound has decreased in value in a similar manner. But if our scientists and teachers and politicians were doing all they pretended to do, the £1 note today, instead of buying very much less than half of what the 1913 £1 note bought, should be buying very much more.

tional to the taxes imposed by the various Finance Bills. Had the creation of mone-tary units which are necessary to represent improved process been applied, as they should have been, to a reduction of prices, the pound sterling would have stood at an immense premium to the dollar, and every-one in the country would be better off, while no one in the country would have been poorer. But, of course, Dr. Dalton wants to make us poorer."

UNIVERSITIES USED

That many people are ignorant of what is really happening is obvious enough. Their ever-increasing resentment at the unnatural and (to them) unexpected sequence of events can be seen all around. But what requires a great deal of explanation and investigation is that most of the political half-wits come out of our universities (And such persons are teaching our adoles cents.)

It is natural enough for young men and It is natural enough for young men and women to be impatient at the continuous frustration of human effort, and the un-godly mess that is being made of public affairs, but the disturbing fact is that these socalled educated young men and women appear completely ignorant of the experiences of generations; they have been robbed of those instincts which preserve the continuity of primitive tribac and they continuity of primitive tribes, and they have been given nothing to take their place but a collection of untenable theories that won't stand five minutes' investigation; nor do they appear to be capable of conducting this investigation for themselves.

Apart from the technical branches of a university, there is little evidence of any educational process; our young men and women are not being educated, they are simply being doped. The main dope factory in a university is the school of economics, where future-heads of the bureaucracy being trained. I consider that these schools of economics are among the most destructive influences in Australia.

AN ALIEN ASSAULT

But the work of destruction is not limited to the schools of economics; from the alleged cultural sections of the universities we find young men and women coming out suffering from severe overdoses of Marx, Laski and Freud, and with practically no knowledge of any other point of view.

To prevent any accidents happening, and in case the students might pick up the truth for themselves, any person who is considered a rival to the three modern prophets has his work distorted in an outrageously dis-honest manner, so that the students' minds are conditioned against any further investi-action gation.

Today, we are seeing the whole basis of Western civilisation being assailed and undermined by a well-disciplined army of fifth columnists, and these men are being paid by you, dear readers.

What have these people got to substitute for this thing they would destroy?

They would substitute a "civilisation" which would make Hiler's Socialist Ger-many seem a mere kindergarten school by comparison.



LARGE-SCALE VERSUS SMALL-SCALE ECONOMIC ORGANISATIONS

(A Radio Talk by ERIC D. BUTLER over 3CS and 3MA.)

Good evening, listeners. In our talk last week we dealt with the manner in which the Socialists and Communists can get a hearing for their advocacy of Government control of all industry, because the controllers of financial policy have deliberately pursued a policy of building monopolies. The Communists and Socialists desire to complete the centralisation of economic power, which the financial monopolists started.

It is very difficult to get many people to see that the elimination of small, competi-tive economic units is NOT leading to that increased real efficiency and better service which, we have been continually told, only large-scale economic units can give us.

It may be true that one chain-store in a town instead of half-a-dozen small stores can distribute all the goods required by consumers, although it is highly probable that consumers would find themselves without much selection in the range of goods. No doubt we could save a few gallons of petrol and some tyres if we prevented bakers, butchers and milkmen from compet-ing for business in the same area. How often we hear the Communists, and many others who merely parrot the Communists, saying what a wasteful thing it is to have as many as three or more grocers or three or more milkmen all delivering their groceries or milk in the same street.

This type of argument appeals to the person who cannot be bothered to do a little thinking for himself. Its utter foolishness can be shown by pointing out that it is also "wasteful" for people to have their own private homes, where they make their own arrangements for their meals. What a saving we could have if we were all housed in barracks and had communal kitchens and communal dining rooms! But at this point most of us will say that we are happier in our own private homes, all built to different designs, even though they cost more financially than barracks.

The whole trouble with our economic system today is the fact that it is being made to conform to financial rules, which are artificial.

THE REALISTIC ASPECT

It may be true that the Victorian State Electricity Commission can, at present, supply electricity at a slightly lower financial cost than can the remaining small municipal and other electricity generating units in Victoria; but at least these small units are continuing to supply power at a time when the State Electricity Commission has had to introduce rationing of power in the middle introduce rationing of power in the middle of winter. Judged from the point of view of efficiency of results and service, the State Electricity Commission has failed miserably. What is the use of reducing the financial

cost of any service if you thereby lose, effec-tive control over that service? What is the use of reducing the financial cost of produc-tion if men have to be turned into soulless robots in mass-production factories to do it?

If this policy is pursued, we must pay a dreadful price—the price the Russians have paid and are paying. The destruction of the small farmers in

Russia and the building up of huge collec-tivised power farming did not produce the results so confidently predicted. Large-scale production must ignore the human element, with a progressive deterioration of results achieved. Small-scale farming in Great Britain and New Zealand is far superior from every point of view, to collectivised farming in Russia. New Zealand farmers would laugh at the production per acre from the collectivised farms of Russia.

In spite of the fact that large-scale organisations, as we mentioned last week, are al-lowed much easier and more liberal access to financial credit than small-scale organi-sations, there is plenty of evidence to prove that they cannot compare favourably with small-scale production.

EVIDENCE FROM AMERICA

This matter has been more thoroughly investigated in America than in Australia Theodore Beckman, in an article contributed to the supplement of the American "Econo-mic Review," March, 1944, states that lead-ing industrial angineers ing industrial engineers in America, after ing industrial engineers in America, after an exhaustive survey of the industrial sys-tem, sponsored by the Society of Industrial Engineers, declared that in applying mass production methods "emphasis should be placed not on size, but on production method. We have worked out optimum size plants for these four basic industries (machine code nig iron timber and patchem are tools, pig iron, timber and petroleum pro-

Large-size plants had the lowest financial costs in only six cases. Medium-size plants had the lowest costs in 21 cases. Small-size plants had the lowest costs in 26 cases. These results effectively dispose of the argument that large-scale economic units are necessary on technological grounds. The American Trade Commission also in-

The American Trade Commission also in-vestigated the average production contribu-tion made by workers in 28 selected indus-tries. In 15 of the industries small plants employing 250 workers or less had a greater contribution per worker than large plants. This result should not surprise us; it is only in small-scale organisation that the individual can take a real interest in his work; he sees the production of an article from the start to the finish. How can any individual worker be expected to take a individual worker be expected to take a real interest in his work when it merely consists of some repetition task in a huge specialised mass-production factory?

THE MENACE OF MONOPOLY

Are we to virtually turn the entire world into one big mass-production factory in which we all perform some repetition task without any clear understanding of what it is all about? If we pursue this policy be-cause of this modern God called "financial efficiency," we are going to destroy the human race. Where will all this much-publicised "efficiency" be then? If large-scale production is not due to

If large-scale production is not due to real technological reasons nor real service-efficiency reasons, why is it becoming more common? We have already touched on this matter, but let us see what the American

Federal Trade Commission had to report on this matter. It said: "But monopoly cannot be attributed to natural factors alone. It is the product of formal agreements and secret undertakings, of combinations, inter-corporate stock-hold-ings and inter-locking directorates; of the ruthless employment of superior financial

resources and bargaining power. . . In nearly every case in which monopoly per-sists, it will be found that artificial factors are involved."

Note carefully the statement that monopoly is not natural; it is the result of artificial conditions. It is preposterous to suggest that the individuals responsible for these artificial conditions do not know what they are doing. They know only too woll they are doing. They know only too well.

Week by week, the "New Times" brings to its readers facts relating to the plot to turn the entire world into one big Monopoly in which the individual will slave at an appointed task, however useless and degrad-ing that task may be.

COUNTER-ATTACK NEEDED

The individual must realise, in the short time that is left for him to take effective action, that a deadly war is being waged against him, a war to reduce him to the same level as the beasts of the field.

Now, if the individual is to win this war, he must first clearly identify his enemy in order that he may fight him. Unless the individual will identify his real enemy, he will continue to blame all his troubles on to the wicked "capitalist"—the "boss"—not realising that the class war is used to des-troy the community by civil strife and at the same time provide an effective smoke-screen under which the real enemy can

carry on his campaign of destruction. Not only must the individual clearly identify his real enemy; he must make him-self thoroughly familiar with his tactics, in order that suitable action can be taken to counter them. Those who want to play an effective part

THE COMMUNIST MENACE IN CANADA (Concluded from last issue.)

The following is taken from a speech by Mr. Norman Jaques, the Social Credit member for Wetaskiwin in the Canadian House of Commons. The speech was delivered during the Debate on the Address, on March 25, 1946. According to the Canadian "Hansard," Mr. Jaques said:

I said that the big idea has been to elimiate the British Empire, using as an excuse Greece or Palestine or India or some other place. Always the Socialist is against British action and British control. I remember a year ago last Christmas when Britain was having trouble to keep order in Greece. I was, I believe, the only member of this House who publicly made a statement en-dorsing the British action. For that I was abused more than these spies have been abused. I was the subject of an abusive editorial in the "Citizen," for instance, be-cause I said that very thing.

The Co-operative Commonwealth Federation [Canadian Socialist Party], at their national convention a year ago last Christmas or thereabouts, issued a statement, which was published in the press, that they con-demned British action in Greece, saying that Canadians were not dying to restore discredited governments or reactionary monarchs. When the representative of the Co-operative Commonwealth Federation was over in London at the United Nations' Organisation conference, he had the great pleasure of hearing Mr. Bevin call Mr. Vishinsky "a damn liar" for using those very words.

Mr. Coldwell: Oh, no.

ATOMIC ANTICS: Bikini reporter George Moorad, whose broadcasts have been cen-sored, reports "highly suspicious factors" about the atomic test, among them being censorship on a specific group of corre-spondents. His conclusion is that: "Atomic power is nothing more radical than was T.N.T. over Chinese gunpowder." The tim-1.N.1. over Chinese gunpowder. The tim-ing of atomic propaganda gives a clue to the reason behind it: Firstly, it provided a face-saving formula for Japan to quit; then, it helped to stampede people into ac-cepting the World Government idea, while the Bikini stunt happens right at the psy-chological time when the world plotters are chological time when the world plotters are endeavouring to create the world Atomic Energy Control body, which would, of course, permit their stooges to be located in all countries, and dictate affairs under the plea of atomic development or control of it.

PALESTINE PROBLEM: The seizure of the Jewish Agency in Palestine and the discovery of large quantities of arms, including small arms, ammunition, hundreds of grenades, detonators, explosives, sabotage material, rifles and mortars. Mr. Attlee, commenting on this, said he wanted to retain the Jewish Agency, but it could not be a cover for the running of illegal armies and the doing of illegal acts. The situation seems to be coming to a head rapidly, and powerful Jewish forces in America are staging demonstrations headed by Dr. Stephen Wise, etc., in Italy by "The Union of Jewish Communities," and in South Africa by Communities," and in South Africa by General Smuts. The background of this Jewish struggle is old and deep-rooted, and can only be understood by extensive study. The book entitled "The Mysterious Protocols" should be of assistance in this connection. A few copies of the recent edition are available in all States at 2/7d. posted. In view of the present develop-ments this publication should be well received.

MATERNITY MOVE: The British College of Midwives is campaigning to assure mothers that for children to be born at parents' homes is as safe as in maternity wards, and they point out that more than half of last year's babies were born at home and are getting on as well as those born in hospitals and maternity homes. They might have gone further and said that un-told millions of babies were born in their parents' home before maternity hospitals were thought of, and that millions of babies are still being born in Eastern countries where there are as yet no maternity where there are as yet no maternity hospitals. It is good to learn of this move

against the hospitalisation of maternity. Homes should be spacious enough to provide for this; the midwife to help the mother, and the local doctor handling the case, are the only factors necessary for safety.

GAMBLING GAMES: New York police, presumably upholding the principles of human freedom so peculiar to the land of Uncle Sham, are now said to be arresting readers of papers devoted to racing form. Arrests are made when two or more people are found reading the paper (presumably together). Thus we sail into the Brave New World with Uncle at the helm! For years in Australia it has been, and still is, a crime to bet on two-up, or on horses if the betting is outside the enclosure from which the Government receives a rake-off; but, even so, we have a long way to go to reach the "Protocol" Utopia operating in U.S. It is from small things such as these that large-scale encroachments on our per-sonal liberty commence. —O.B.H.
