### Russia

## Russia Gets 46 Ships

(Australian Associated Press)

ROME, Sunday. —Russia will get the greatest number of ships — 46, including a battleship and a cruiser—in the final allotment to the Allies of the Italian Fleet.

This decision of the Big Four Naval Commission was announced by Italy to-day.

Britain and the United States were entitled to 28 and 26 ships, respectively, but they renounced their claims on condition that Italy scrapped the vessels.

France receives 43 ships, including three cruisers. Greece gets one cruiser, and one auxiliary craft. Jugoslavia gets 17 minor ships, and Albania one gunboat

Italy retains two battleships, four cruisers, four destroyers, 132 small and auxiliary craft.

# RESULT OF BRITISH RULE IN INDIA

We think that it is high time that some Member of the House of Commons of, say, the character and type of Mr. W. J. Brown, the Independent Representative for Rugby, should take up seriously, and push through to an exposure, the nature of the bookkeeping, which appears to accompany the liquidation of the British Empire.

To take the Indian sub-continent as an example, *Great* Britain has developed over 43,000 miles of railways with stations, bridges, administrative offices, and auxiliary works; provided irrigation works for 27 million acres of otherwise nearly useless land; developed first-class harbours at Karachi, Bombay, Madras, and Calcutta; built some of the world's greatest bridges and trunk roads; developed modern power systems, hydro-electric and otherwise; transformed the great Presidency cities from slums into sanitary, attractive, well-built settle-ments, traversed by wide tree-shaded boulevards, built public and business administrative offices unexcelled anywhere; rescued the forests from almost complete destruction and so checked soil erosion —to put the matter shortly, transformed a sub-continent.

Not merely has this been to the immense advantage of the indigenous inhabitants, but (until it was discovered that we were so imbecile that we would allow any amount of mud to be thrown at us, and believe we deserved it) the performance was the envy of the whole world, and has never been approached by any other country, European, Asiatic, or American.

We now evacuate the scene of 150 years' intensive and successful effort, not merely under a stream of abuse from the sob-sisters of the Middle West and the aliens of Leeds, Bradford, the London School of Economics, and Chicago, but we appear to owe "India" £ 1,500,000,000. In other words, we have to work for nothing on three years' total exports of the United Kingdom at 1936 levels, for the benefit of "India" alone, without paying for a single pound of imports from India or anywhere else, before we have liquidated the balance of money cost to us of 150 years of Indian development.

# PRODUCTION AND INCENTIVES

This journal has consistently stated over the past few years that increased production of consumer goods is one of the first major steps we must take towards preventing the disintegration of our community. But we have also stressed the fact that greater inducements must be the driving force of any campaign of increased production. These inducements must not only be made possible by a drastic reduction in taxation; it must also be made clear that the present financial rules shall be suitably modified to permit increased production to be distributed to consumers.

In his recent appeal to workers to increase production, the Prime Minister, Mr. Chifley, made no mention of the fact that the very financial and economic policies he is relentlessly pursuing are one of the greatest barriers to increased production. Mr. Chifley stands condemned as either a knave or a fool. As he is always presented by his publicists as a "financial wizard," we must assume that Mr. Chifley was appealing for increased production with his tongue in his cheek. Or, perhaps, he was trying to get "onside" with the daily press, which keeps up a chant about increased production being the solution of all our problems, and criticises all those who urge that something more than increased production must be suggested to the workers.

The Melbourne "Argus" of Wednesday, March 10, contained the following significant reports "Big Union Rejects P.M's Plea . . . The Federated Engine Drivers, and Firemen's Association last night rejected Mr. (Chifley's plea for more production. A Trades Hall meeting resolved to tell Mr. Chifley that members believed that increased production would cause an industrial crisis unless the purchasing power of most people wasincreased."

There is no doubt that all workers still remember pre-war days when there was adequate production with large numbers of unemployed and a general deficiency of purchasing power in the community. It is not surprising, therefore, that Trade Unionists are extremely doubtful about the proposition that increased production will automatically result in a steady increase in the standards of living of the people. They recall the bitter lessons of history.

Every well-informed person knows that, apart from the "crippling effects, of taxation, many workers feel that the less they can do, the more certain they are to have permanent employment. Many of them recall years of unemployment before the war.

The most smashing blow that the non-Labor parties could deliver against the Socialists and Communists would be an unqualified declaration that they are in favour of such financial reforms which will permit the benefits of increased production to be available to all individuals irrespective of whether their services are required in the production system or not. But we feel that there are many people in the community who will do anything to defeat the Communists—except support any proposals to modify those financial and economic policies, which are the greatest assets the Communists, have.

ported the disastrous partition plan for Palestine. The direct relationship between the Palestine question and Russian policy is one of those vital subjects which the daily press ignores, thus providing further evidence of the fact that it still refuses to face up to the real Communist menace.

Another important aspect of the Communist menace, which the press ignores, is the fact that Communist ideas have been furthered by an exploitation of the conditions resulting from the policies of our present financial and economic system.

How many daily papers throughout the British Empire have ever even briefly referred to the power of the German-Jewish international financiers of New York? These financiers are not afraid of Socialism and Communism; they obviously regard these movements as necessary weapons of destruction as a preliminary to the creation of the World Monopoly State.

## The Depression Policy

Every well-informed person now admits that the Great Depression was the direct result of financial policy originated in New York. In other words, the international financial groups of New York dominated by the Warburgs, Brietungs, Morgenthau, Baruch, and others of the same ilk, created conditions, which were a godsend to the Communists everywhere. It was Lenin who stated that "Revolution is impossible without a nation-wide crisis (affecting both the exploited and the exploiters)." The crisis of the Great Depression was followed by the upheaval of the Second World War. And we know that the international financiers were responsible for Hitler's rise to power.

Financial policy has been directly responsible for the progressive centralisation of all industry into bigger and bigger units.

The gradual elimination of small-decentralised economic units is the first step towards complete State control. Stalin has made it very clear that the widespread ownership of the means of production makes the Communist revolution almost impossible.

### Centralisation of Industry

The centralisation of industry into bigger and bigger units means that more and more workers are brought together at the one centre. Direct contact between a personal owner of an industry and his employees becomes impossible. This is where the Communist agitator on the industrial front steps in. As industry has become more and more centralised, so in turn the Unions have become more and more centralised. The Communists are well aware that the present financial policy is their greatest ally.

That is why they bitterly oppose people such as the Social Crediters who point out that a modification of the present

# MR. ATTLEE AND WHIG POLICY

Perhaps the salient feature of the present World situation is that Great Britain ("Britain") is in the remarkable position of being without a friend in any current controversy. Just what really is our policy in regard to Palestine, no one seems to know; but, whatever it is, it has succeeded in antagonising Jew, Arab, and Mr. Ben Hecht. What we contemplate for India when Mr. Nehru seeks refuge in Wall Street is not clear; but everyone is agreed that as a performance our postwar handling of him is only paralleled by Mr. Kerensky's display of statesmanship in the Russian Revolution.

Mr. Attlee's administration seems equally unhappy at home; nobody loves him and everyone feels that a country, which will tolerate his Aneurin Bevans and Emanuel Shinwells, must be decrepit or it would take action.

Yet in this connection, it must be recalled that Mr. Attlee himself is far more honest than many of his detractors. In 1934 he declared that "we," the Labour Party, had quite determined that they were not the Party of the people of this country, but of the world. Since then, of course, it has been made plain that the world does not include infra-tinkerscusses. It is doubtless true that he was speaking for the benefit of his predominantly alien supporters, whether in this country or elsewhere; but so far as we are aware, he spoke in English, and he ought to have received attention. Because he gave no indication, and no assurance, that any part of the world outside this country would pay any attention to him; and, in the event, no one outside this country, and a rapidly decreasing number of people inside it, does pay any attention to him. What he succeeded in doing, as anyone outside the detestable Fabian atmosphere knew would be done, is to facilitate the enslavement of his constituents for the benefit of his hidden financiers.

In placing Mr. Attlee for the moment in the pillory, we have no illusions in regard to the part played by the alleged Conservatives in the armistice period. A very considerable amount of effort was devoted by Social Crediters to uncovering the continuity of the Whig influence from the South African War onwards, and Mr. Churchill, Mr. Eden, Mr. Harold Macmillan, and, in fact, the whole operative framework of the party which smugly allows itself to be labelled "Tory," are nearly pure-bred Whigs. We have previously referred to what is perhaps the outstanding historical novel of this century, the American Mr. Kenneth Roberts's Oliver Wiswell, and his ex-planation of the loss of the American Colonies, the inhabitants of which were preponderatingly loyal, but it is so germane to the present position that we give his estimate of the Whigs at some length:

"Why shouldn't you find Howe's behaviour unfathomable? For years, in this country [England], the Whigs were in power, and had things their own way. All good Whigs had splendid government positions, and had splendid salaries for doing nothing . . . The Whigs are out in the cold, Oliver, and they don't like it . . . They're doing everything on earth to get back into power again. They're attacking the Tory Party in every possible way, and stopping at nothing.

The Tory Party is the Government, Oliver; so every Whig is against the Government. The rebels in America are against the Government; therefore the Whigs support the rebels. That's the only reason Pitt and Burke make speeches in favour of the rebels—to embarrass the Government. If the rebels should be defeated, the Tory Government would have been successful; the Tories would remain in power . . . The English don't like to admit it, but . . .

the Whigs, in their attempt to get back into power, aren't even hesitating to wreck the British Empire . . . Nearly every member of the Whig party, in Parliament, for purely political reasons, has seized every opportunity to give aid and comfort to the enemies of his country. Never in any nation has anything been seen like the malignant and daringly outspoken treason of the English Whigs . . . General Howe is a Whig." (pp. 384-

Compare Mr. Roberts's description of the eighteenth century Whig with the Socialists. It is only necessary to understand that Whig (largely Jew) strategy has been refined to control both parties (so that in fact the Parliamentary division is not Labour v. Conservative, but P.E.P.-Fabian v. Back Bench) to perceive that the mass-migration of "Liberals" to "Conservatism" when the Whig tool, Lloyd-George, had served his purpose while wrecking his party, led by Alfred Moritz Mond, not to mention the Rothschild espousal of "Labour," was primarily designed to ensure that "Mr. Attlee" would have a free run in his solicitude for the alien, whether within or without our gates.

# A.P.P.U. Blames Taxes For Fall In Primary Production

All State delegates attending the Federal Council of the Australian Primary Producers' Union meeting in Melbourne this week agreed that the serious decline in primary production was due to excessive taxation. Delegates from Tasmania, South Australia, Victoria, and New South Wales were present.

State delegates were unanimous that some immediate taxation relief should be given primary producers on personal exertion incomes. To enable a case to be submitted to the Federal Treasurer, the State executives will be asked to supply supporting evidence.

The executive agreed that farmers should be encouraged to apply book-keeping, costing, and recording of their activities for the future benefit of primary industries

primary industries.

The Victorian Wool Committee is to consider a possible solution to overcome the shortage of shearers. It was stated shearers were difficult to obtain and the position was deteriorating.

Tasmanian delegates spoke on the necessity for immediate importation of American potato forks. It was decided to bring the urgent need for 1,000 dozen of these to be imported under licence before the Minister for Trade and Customs, Senator Courtice.

Tasmanian barley growers will be supported in their demands for a price increase for malting barley in an endeavour to encourage production. This barley is also considered to be of a high standard, and, if grown in Tasmania, would obviate the necessity of shipping barley to Tasmania from the mainland.

It was claimed it would not only benefit farmers, but also Australia's national income.

The possibility of using indexed figures

in a practical way in computing cost of production figures in the various industries will also be investigated.

have seen to that.
Not only has Mr. Menzies sponsored Socialist policies; he is on record as proudly claiming that he *is* a Socialist. While in Great Britain early in 1941 he

# GARBAGE INTO FERTILISER

The following report is taken from the "Auckland Star" of January 4th, published under the heading "Modern Method of Turning Waste to Valuable Uses": —

Plans for the commercial development of a new type of garbage destructor that would transform all refuse into high-grade fertiliser were outlined in Melbourne recently by Mr. R. D. Mould, of the Sandringham City Council

They are of interest to Auckland in view of the possibility of the City Council taking action to compost sewage and

Mr. Mould said that even the most modern methods of destruction by fire

were inadequate.

The solution of the problem, which called for bold measures, was possible in a way that would ease the financial strain on every municipality and transform the present menace and liability into an asset.

Agricultural scientists recognised that humus, or decaying vegetation, was the

best fertiliser.

By a new system of garbage disposal this process had been shortened from years to hours. The plants already were in extensive use in America, and one had recently begun operation in Sydney.

It was considered that four plants, two serving the inner municipalities and two the outer, would cover the whole of the greater Melbourne area.

Uniform methods and periods of collecting household garbage and all types of refuse from markets and similar centres would relieve councils of much work and expense and would clean up the garbage evil.

Under this system, garbage was carted in covered vehicles to the converter sites, where it was tipped on to conveyors discharging into big steel bins.

On the conveyor, all tin cans and metal waste were removed electro-magnetically, compressed into blocks hydraulically, and fed into special furnaces, which recovered the tin, lead, and iron separately.

# THE FIRST ART

From the holding bins, the garbage was fed through a machine, which chopped it into small bits and transmitted it to the top storey of a completely enclosed multi-coloured circular steel conveyor. Inside the mass was treated and constantly turned in its passage from floor to floor.

In the bacterial-fermentation process, great heat was developed, and after about eight hours a day, a sweet-smelling, greyish substance was discharged. According to Mr. Mould, this is perfect humus,

ready for bagging.
"In one day science converts this," problem into nature's best fertiliser," said Mr. Mould. "Extensive tests have determined its value as comparable with chicken manure.

## **Use of Animal Urine**

Undoubtedly one of the most wasteful policies in most modern farming is the non-use of animal urine.

At least four-fifths of the potash in animal manure is in the urine.

It contains half the nitrogen.



# Communists Issue 10 Commandments for Red Youths

A press release from Bern, Switzerland, on April 30, 1947, contained the text of the Ten Commandments of Communism. To suppress opposition the Communist Party urges its followers to deny that it opposes religion. But when secret orders are given to the members of the Party they are told that destruction of religion must be their first concern.

The headquarters office of the Communist youth in Novosybirsk, in Soviet Russia, published "ten Communist commandments," to guide Communist youth in furthering world revolution. The "commandments" attack religion and the clergy of all denominations as the greatest barrier against world Communism. Following is the text of the "commandments":

- 1. Never forget that the Clergy is a declared enemy of the State and of Communism
- 2. Try to convert your friends to Communism. Do not forget that Stalin, who gave to the Russian people its new constitution, is the leader of the anti-Gods not only in the Soviet Union but throughout the world
- 3. Try to persuade, but do not force, your friends to stop going to Church.
  4. Watch out for spies; denounce sabot-
- 5. Spread atheistic literature among the
- 6. Every good Komsomol is also a militant atheist. He must know how to shoot and be expert in military discipline.
- 7. Work eagerly to prevent any religious element you may notice from influencing your neighbors.
- 8. Every atheist must be a good Communist. Watching the security of the State is the duty of every anti-God.
- 9. Support the Atheist Movement by financial gifts that will especially aid the propaganda of foreign organisations, obliged through circumstances to work in secret.
- 10. If you are not a convinced atheist you will not be a good Communist and a faithful citizen of the Soviet State. Atheism is permanently linked with Communism and the two ideals are the basis of Soviet power in Communist Russia.
