Events in Berlin over the past few weeks have resulted in an intense interest in the question: Will there be war with Russia ? Unfortunately the great majority of those asking this question are unaware that the war has already started. Communism is an international conspiracy and Russia is the main base from which this conspiracy is being directed.

War can be waged by various methods, and people who regard Soviet Russia merely as a *military* danger are making a serious mistake.

The controllers, of Soviet Russia have large numbers of dupes and conscious traitors working to undermine all British countries from within.

It can be taken as certain that the Soviet gangsters have no desire for military conflict until such time as other countries are virtually on the verge of internal collapse.

Communist Strategy

In his authoritative work, The Prob*lems of Leninism*, Stalin outlines the major strategy of the Communist con-spiracy for those sufficiently interested to read it.

He says: "Objective: to consolidate the dictatorship of the proletariat in one country, using it as a base for the overthrow of imperialism in all countries. The revolution is spreading beyond the confines of one country: the period of world revolution has commenced.

The major problem confronting this and other British countries is to ensure that there is a more widespread and intelligent understanding of the Communist technique of corrupting a community from within.

This technique has been clearly out-lined in the Canadian Royal Commission's Report on espionage and other Communist activities. Just how many Russian agents there are in this country we do not know, but the Canadian disclosures make it clear that they are in every British country.

The Canadian Roval Commission Report states: "It is significant that a number of the documents from the Russian Embassy specifically note 'Jew' or 'Jewess' in entries on their relevant Canadian agents, showing that the Russian Fifth Column leaders attached particular significance on this matter.

A recent news report over the ABC said that 500 Jewish refugees from the Jewish refugee camps in Cyprus were being flown to Australia. Most of the Jews on Cyprus, of course, were those who were prevented by the British from illegally entering Palestine."

COMMUNIST PROGRESS IN CHINA

Turning now to the Chinese Communists, we find them dominating apart from Peking, Tientsin, Tsingtao, and two or three more cities—a territory between the Great Wall and the Yangtze five times as big as Great Britain.

In the "liberated areas" they are taking measures to set up a regularly constituted government in place of the loose committee under Mao Tse-tung. They have unified their currency throughout these areas, and their volu-

They have unified their currency throughout these areas, and their voluminous news sheet, *published weekly in London*, gives glowing reports of industrial revival" which certainly contain some truth.

The Communist Party in China is now said to have 2,000,000 members; and it is noticeable that agrarian reform, by which the peasants were first won over, has taken second place to the task of imposing Marxist doctrines and government everywhere.

Mao Tse-tung's New Year broadcast foretold the liberation of "the thousand million peoples of the East" through Marxism-Leninism; and the Communists' May Day slogan was addressed to "the working classes of China and of all countries," with "American imperialism" pilloried as the great enemy.

Its most recent approach to Mr. McKell, sent registered airmail and with an acknowledgment card attached, has been discourteously rejected by the refusal to accept the latter, which was endorsed by the postman "Refused to accept delivery."

The letter followed an earlier complaint to Mr. McKell that letters forwarded to him had been answered in the third person by an "Official Secretary" and bore no signature. The League pointed out to Mr. McKell that, after taking counsel's opinion, it could not populate an another that the secret secret secret secret pointed between the secret sec Another reply was received from the "Official Secretary," saying that the matter would be referred to the constitutional advisers. As outlined in the Petition published last week, the Queensland League of Rights then pointed out what these constitutional advisers, Dr. Evatt and Professor Bailey, had to say in Dr. Evatt's well-known work, *The King and His Dominion Governors*, published before the war.

If the King's representative in this country is going to refuse properly presented petitions from responsible organisations representing tens of thousands of electors, it is high time that the Opposition at Canberra took the matter up and asked what Mr. McKell proposes to do about this matter. If Mr. McKell is going to deny British subjects their fundamental right to approach the Crown direct it is obvious that he is not fitted for his position. The Opposition must ask: Is Mr. McKell still a party hack serving narrow party interests? And they must demand an answer.

Fadden Gives Facts On Huge International Commitments

Speaking at Canberra on April 15, Mr. Fadden, leader of the Australian Country Party, made some comment on Australia's international commitments which must be read by every Australian concerned with the preservation of Australia's sovereignty as a part of the British Empire. The daily Press practically ignored Mr. Fadden's speech, extracts from which we publish:

... It is impossible to traverse even a small part of the ground in a debate of this nature. There is need for much more frequent debates on this and kindred subjects, so that current international affairs, and Australia's participation in world organisations, can be more quickly and more closely scrutinised by the Parliament.

The index to the statement on international affairs contains various subdivisions of the United Nations organisation, such as the Interim Committee of the General Assembly, the Economic and Social Council, regional economic commissions, the Economic and Employment Commission, the Trusteeship Council, the Atomic Energy Commission, the Commission for Conventional Armaments, the International Refugee Organisation, as well as several alphabetical word-puzzles such as the I.L.O., the F.A.O., the I.T.O., U.N.E.S.C.O., U.N.R.R.A., and I.C.E.F., Benelux, and so on, almost without number.

Endless Committees

Each of those organisations holds committee and sub-committee meetings, and the difficulty of keeping track of and co-ordinating, their discussions is almost insurmountable.

However, UNESCO has held three specialised meetings.

The first conference dealt with some sort of Latin-American educational fundamentals, in which Australia was represented by observers.

The second conference concerned itself with museums, whilst the third conference discussed the role of philosophers in the modern world.

Again, the Economic Commission for Europe, after conducting negotiations with the International Labour Organisation, the Food and Agricultural Organisation, the International Monetary Fund and the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development, secured a satisfactory division of responsibility in the fields of timber and fertilisers....

Splitting Sovereignty

All nations, which abide by United Nations decisions automatically lose some of their independence of action; in other words, participation by sovereign States in the United Nations Assembly must result, in some measure, in the transference or division of certain of their sovereign rights.

I fear that Australia may already be committed to a splitting of its sovereignty with the international organisation to a degree, which is not generally recognised. At the Second Session of the General

At the Second Session of the General Assembly, members were called upon to carry out its recommendations on economic and social matters. The Minister admits that these recommendations gave the Council and the Assembly a more direct influence on the economic policies of national governments, and for that reason they received the full support of the Australian Delegation.

/ should like to know to what degree these recommendations have mortgaged Australia's freedom of action by compelling future Australian Governments either to abide by the United Nations decisions or to break faith. . . .

BRITISH AID TO RUSSIA

Announcement of British-made machines and equipment which Britain has promised to supply Russia with over the next two or three years in return for 750,000 tons of coarse grain has resulted in a great amount of comment in industrial and business circles here.

Russia agreed to send all the grain by September 30, 1948, while Britain has undertaken to supply the Soviet Union with 25,000 tons of light rails and the possibility of a further 10,000 tons.

Release of the list coincided with publication of what goods and equipment Britain might receive from the United States under the proposed Marshall Plan to aid Europe.

Informed sources here do not see how Britain can meet this commitment without cutting down the export of goods and equipment promised to other countries, and especially to hard currency areas. At the same time, no information was released on prices the U.K. is to pay for the grain or what Russia will pay for the goods she gets. Additional items, which the British have promised to supply, include: 1,100 narrow-gauge locomotives; 2,400 flat trucks; 2,400 two and three drum winches; 210 excavators; 54 caterpillar loading cranes; 250 automatic timber carriers; 14 tugs; 4 *dredgers;* 150 *mobile diesel electric generators;* 24 steam power turbine stations of 500 k.w.; £1,050,000 worth of plywood equipment; £400,000 worth of timber mill equipment; £150,000 worth of scientific and laboratory equipment; 4 pile-drivers mounted on pontoons; 4 sets winding gear; 1 electric dredger; 18 ball mills for copper ore grinding; 8 ball mills for grinding apatite; 3 rod mills for grinding ore; 3 railway steam cranes; 6 complete distributing sets; and 45 isolating switches, 154 k.v.

Added to this, the United Nations is pledging its credit to the United States of America to the amount of 65,000,000 dollars for a building loan.

As the Minister said, it may be that the expenditure of these vast sums is a wise investment.

Controlling Public Expenditure

Zionists Dominate U.N. Says American "Letter"

"Nothing in the whole history of U.N. discloses better the forces that dominate it and that probably called it into being. For just one group was interested in forcing through this Palestine project, namely those political Jews who are the backbone of the Zionist Movement.

"We think that most American Jews know little about this question, and care little. They are American first, just as the vast majority of Americans, of other origins, are Americans first. Those who forced this project through UN are Jews first.

"Drew Pearson, who claims to be on the inside of many things, asserted in his column of December 3, that President Truman had 'cracked down harder on his State Department than ever before to swing UN votes for the partition of Palestine.

"And he proceeded to tell in detail just what Mr. Truman did to put it across. Apparently the international Jewish organisation left no stone unturned to bring pressure on Mr. Truman, and Mr. Truman went all out to carry out the desires of this group.

"This makes it pretty clear that the Truman Administration is in the hands of this group.

"Taken in connection with the bitter fight to land three Jews in the membership of the vitally important five-member Atomic Energy Commission; the aggressive efforts to force through the Com-munist-inspired FEPC law, as well as the so-called anti-discrimination laws that have been passed in two or three States; the violent efforts to force a modification of our immigration laws to permit the bringing in indiscriminately of more Jews from Europe; the studied abandonment by the federal government after 1941 of keeping records of Jewish immigration; the fact that both this and the preceding Administration of Mr. Roosevelt were infested on almost all levels

with Jewish appointees, many of them Communistic: read in conjunction with all of these facts, it becomes apparent what force has been moulding the policy of the United States in recent years, involving it in war, and making well-nigh treasonable concessions to Soviet Russia.

"It explains why, after a century and a half of closely following American tra-dition, the United States has become re-peatedly involved, at whatever cost, in events all over the world, in most of which she has not the slightest vital interest, but which, if persisted in, will surely lead the American Republic to destruction.

The Truman Administration has been greatly influenced by this group. So, we believe, to a large extent, was the Republican Party in its campaign in 1936, and especially in its campaigns of 1940 and 1944.

"The grave question before the American people is whether in 1948 the Republican Party will permit itself to be dictated to, both with respect of its platform and its candidate, as in the recent past.

RUSSIA BACKS SECRET SOCIETY TO AID PALESTINE IMMIGRATION

Back in 1932 a secret organisation known as "Kvarantana" was founded to assist Jews to escape from Germany into the surrounding States. This organisation lapsed to some extent with the outbreak of war, to be revived late in 1945 in Moscow by Professor Mikhoels and Itsyk Feffer.

Mikhoels was at that time director of the Jewish State Theatre, and with the writer Feffer formed a Jewish Anti-Fascist Committee in Moscow.

During the war three congresses were held, *attended by many Soviet public figures*, including Zaslavsky, Ehrenburg, and Vasyl Grosman.

Following an extensive tour of America, Canada, Mexico, and Great Britain by Professor Mikhoels and Feffer, it was learned that the "Kvarantana" was functioning again, this time on the Hungarian border of Rumania, near Arad.

Considerable financial support was received especially from two American institutions, the Committee of Jewish Scholars, Writers, and Artists, and the Jewish Council of Russian War Prisoners.

The Soviet Red Cross representative in New York, Dr. Lebedenko, is also reported to have collected considerable sums of money for this secret organisation.

Home in Soviet Union

The stated purpose of the "Kvarantana" was to offer survivors of Hitler's massacres a home in the autonomous region of Birobodzhan, in the Soviet Union.

Its chief was Leonard Guenzberg former Captain in the Red Army and a Soviet citizen; his deputy, Sasha Mikunishev, was also a Soviet citizen.

At the headquarters at Arad a comprehensive index system was made of Polish, Rumanian, Hungarian, Czechoslovak, and other Jews who desired to emigrate to Birobodzhan.

Late in 1946, however, it was found that the destination of the emigrants was not Russia but Palestine, for which most of them set sail from Black Sea ports.

From that moment neither Professor Mikhoels, nor Itsky Feffer, played any further part in the organisation, which they had been instrumental in reviving.

Towards the end of last year the "Kvarantana" was shut down; its comprehensive card index system was handed over to Trajani Padure, a member of the Central Committee of the Rumanian Communist Party, who was in charge of the Council for Assistance to Palestine at Galatia, and which was from then responsible for transport arrangements to Palestine.

fruits of which are only too evident in the pattern of world events today.

The link between the Soviet and Palestine is the powerful trade union to which nearly all Jews in Palestine must belong—Histadrut.

The great majority of Jewish communities in the Soviet Zone of Germany, and in all the satellite countries, had made contact with Histadrut early in 1947.

This great trade union completely dominates the economic life of the Jewish settlements, and was closely concerned with all Jewish immigration into Palestine.

The centre of pressure from which Russian activity in Palestine is directed is the Soviet Embassy at Ankara; the vehicles used are the Palestine Victory League, which evolved from the Palestine Society for Friendship with the U.S.S.R., and two political parties, the Hashomer Hatzair and Poale, which united this year, and to which nearly half the members of Histadrut belong.

Infiltration

Thus, without the leaders of the trade union of necessity being conscious of it, *Histadrut is being carefully infiltrated* with young Jewish blood, carefully trained in Soviet methods at one of the fifty-six political training centres for Jews which are functioning in Bohemia, Bulgaria, Hungary, Poland, Rumania, Slovakia, and in Sub-Carpathian Ruthenia.

Through the action of Zionist organisations in Palestine, the country is thrown into a ferment, which may yet grow into a full-scale war.

Russia, with her eye constantly upon the rich lands of the Near East (and of India and China beyond), marches step by step with all who are at the centre of trouble, Jew or Gentile, and will continue so to do until her object is achieved or the balance of power against her forces her to withdraw frontiers within their natural limits.

Making Use Of The English

Walter H. Page, American Ambassador to Britain, writing from London on October 25, 1913, to President Wilson, said: —

"The future of the world belongs to us. A man needs to live here, with two eyes in his head, a very little time to become very sure of this. Everybody will see it presently. These English are spending their capital, and it is their capital that continues to give them their vast power. Now what are we going to do with the leadership of the world presently when it clearly falls into our hands? And how can we use the English for the highest uses of democracy?"

—Page 144 of *The Life and Letters of Walter H. Page*" (Heinemann, London, 1924).

In 1905 a certain Colonel Goldsmid, of the well-known family of Jewish bankers, recommended to Dr. Theodore Herzl, the Zionist, the imposition of heavy taxes upon land, with a view to the ruin of the landholders.

It will be observed that this was prior to the "Liberal Landslide" of 1906, which inaugurated the period of "spending our capital," *e.g.*, Estate and Legacy Duties, to which Mr. Walter H. Page makes reference.

CHILDREN OF THE MARTYR RACE

By Maurice M. Feuerlicht.

I learned early in life that 1 was Jewish, and that there was a "Jewish problem." Through the years I have learned further that Jews as a group do not act like normal people, and by normal, I merely mean the majority of citizens.

As the son of a Rabbi and the product of a typical Jewish environment, I am hardly prejudiced against Jews, and I have no desire to avoid being known as a Jew. But I do not believe there are any Jews at birth. Their Jewish con-sciousness is cultivated consistently from the moment they are capable of under-standing the spoken word. Every religious experience thereafter tends to re-mind them that they are not Gentiles. My earliest memory is the celebration of the Feast of the Lights, or Chanukah. I sat at my father's feet, as have countless other Jewish youngsters, and heard him tell the thrilling story of Judas Maccabeus and his brave band, who risked their lives for their religion. I lighted candles and sang,

Children of the martyr race,

Whether free or fettered,

Whether free or fettered, Wake the echoes with your song Where ye may be scattered." *I* had the theme, "Children of the Martyr Race," dinned into my conscious-ness so deeply that it became a basic element of my daily life. Almost the first words I understood were "oppressed* people," "martyrs," "prejudice," "perse-cution." When little Gentiles called me "Jew," my parents carefully explained that the boys meant to insult me, and that the boys meant to insult me, and that the world didn't like Jews.

Home Instruction

My home instruction never allowed me My home instruction never allowed me to forget the past. Vicariously, every Jewish youngster suffers the pains of persecutions, which have been visited upon his group for 3,000 years. After Chanukah, I celebrated Passover, and hated Pharaoh with all the fervour of my childish heart, because he persecuted the Jews. Lest I forget the hasty flight through the Red Sea I ate unleavened through the Red Sea, I ate unleavened bread to remind me of hardships suffered 2,000 years ago. In Sunday School and at home, while other children learned fairy tales and played with tin soldiers, I learned of the tortures of the Spanish Inquisition and of the Jewish confine-

ment to the Ghetto and the Pale. Like all other Jewish children, I emerged with a "persecution complex," which grew stronger as I grew older. I did not learn a great deal about the re-ligious principles of Judaism, but I cer-tainly knew all about the Dreyfus case, the Ku-Klux-Klan, the country club, and hotel restrictions. The knowledge, more than anything else, constitutes the Jewish consciousness we have today, for we are more conscious of our maltreatment than we are of our religion.

because I am Jewish." Few of us have the courage to admit that the fault might rest in our personal make-up. It is true of human nature generally that men seek the blame for failure everywhere except at their own doorstep, but we Jews diverge from the normal when this becomes a mental habit with which we constantly salve the wounds of all our failures.

In the prominent Eastern school which I attended, 15 percent of the student body was Jewish, several distinguished members of the faculty were Jews, yet the college had been charged with dis-crimination in admissions. And an astounding number of Jewish parents made equally astounding charges of prejudice because their son had failed to make a team, an office, or had failed a course of study. I knew from daily contact that many of these boys were

unmannered, lazy, spoiled youngsters, who constantly carried a chip on their shoulder — who would have been just as undesirable if they had been Presbyterians or Confucianists.

Chip On His Shoulder

An infinite number of similar examples could be given, covering every phase of life and every type of Jew. For the many cases of actual prejudice do not obscure the fact that too often the prejudice ascribed to race is a completely justified personal one. Most Gentiles are fair-minded and judge individuals on their own merits. It is the Jew with the chip on his shoulder who creates false issues

and makes Gentiles dread him. A person with a "martyr complex" harbours a desire to hit back blindly. The appearance of a Gentile at any Jewish social function is severely criticised by those very Jews who are most anxious to gain recognition in Gentile social functions. If a Jew commits the most heinous of all offences, and marries a Gentile, he feels the full force of prejudice, which Jews have built around themselves.

The far-reaching consequences of the martyr complex go beyond any effect on the individual Jew, however, and do not leave unmarked even the most sympa-thetically inclined Gentiles. Since the

Mr. Chifley should know that the more any country exports, obviously the worse off that country must be.

Point (3) reads—"Willingness to share with Britain the risks incurred in obtaining a dollar loan.

This journal long ago pointed out the sks incurred in the Dollar Loan and Bretton Woods, but it is something to hear Mr. Chifley admit it, as previously he had nothing but praise for these in-ternational financial schemes. How he expects electors to share his "willingness" is hard to understand! Then there is to be a campaign for more self-denial, so that we can send more food to Britain. The New Times has repeatedly pointed out that only a very small percentage of our exported food is going to Britain, and that a great deal of it is being shipped to

Jew is hypersensitive on the subject of his Judaism, Gentiles fear to offer constructive criticism lest they be accused of prejudices. Thus the Jew is denied the benefit of honest evaluation of the very real differences and prejudices existing.

Great Tragedy

The great tragedy of this attitude is the inconsistency on the part of the Jew who complains bitterly because he is not accepted by the world as an individual first, and a Jew second. He forgets that his own first reaction is that of a Jew. If the newspapers state that: "Isaac Rubens, 26, Jewish, robbed the Smith Grocery last night," every Jew in town is up in arms against the editor for the gratuitous libel. But if Albert Einstein presents a revolutionary scientific theory, those same Jews glow with satisfaction at the phrase, "the great Jewish scien-tist." We must decide whether we want the world to think of us as individuals or as Jews.

I believe we Jews will never be normal individuals as long as we foster our martyr complex; so long as we remain evasive of self-appraisal and selfimprovement, and so long as it is easier to blame the other fellow for our own faults

GREAT BRITAIN ENSLAVED! Douglas Reed Exposes Socialist Tyranny

Same as Germany

In the introduction to his survey of the Socialist tyranny in Great Britain, Reed says: "In the moment of victory (in 1945, after the General Election), a British Government began to inflict on my own country all the penalties of de-feat ' which a conquering Hitler would have imposed, and to set up in England, stage by stage, the regime which I had watched Hitler build in Germany." Reed believes that serfdom in Great Britain really started with the introduc-tion of bread rationing by former Com-

tion of bread rationing by former Com-munist Strachey: "Bread tickets, as 1 knew from observation abroad, are the nisable keystone of dictatorship. recos a word which means starvation, destitution, and imprisonment brought about by governmental action . . . their importance is that no man can be starved if he may freely buy bread; while he cannot. his submission to every decree can be enforced by denying it to him. Reed effectively disposes of the myth about bread rationing being imposed because of a world wheat shortage. Our regular readers will recall the great amount of factual material we have published on this subject from time to time.

All-Powerful Bureaucracy

Reed's indictment of the imposition of despotism by the expansion of an all-powerful bureaucracy will sound terribly familiar to Australians who have watched the growth of the same type of

watched the growth of the same type of despotism in this country. "In Attlee's Government." writes Reed, "are Ministers whom England never knew before in peace: One for Food, one for Fuel and Power, one for Housing . . . "Now the Minister 'for Food' proved to be for rationing, that is, against food; the one 'for Fuel and Power' did not in-crease and cheapen light and power, but 'rationed' them under penalties; the one 'for Housing' forbade men to build houses, 'rationed' bricks, mortar, and timber, and punished the offender against these vetoes."

Enforcement Officers

By January 1947 there were 380 "Food Enforcement Officers" in England with powers to enter and search private homes—powers not even made available to the police in cases of murder. Reed sees in the "Food Enforcement Officers" the first shadow of the secret police. Questioned in the House of Commons in 1947, Mr. Attlee admitted that 17 of

his Ministers and their subordinates had the power to authorise inspections inthe power to authorise inspections in-volving entry into private houses with-out a magistrate's warrant. Reed says that this state of affairs means the re-turn of the "spy informer." *"Reptilian by nature, they are always just below the surface, waiting to be used L say, them build up the Gastano*

used. I saw them build up the Gesta State in Germany. In England, in 1947, a Chief Constable 'appealed to private citizens to inform the police of any instances which come to their notice of wastage of electricity by householders ... names and addresses will have to be given, but will be treated as confidential by the police. This recalls the appeal, by a taxation official, to Australians to act as anonymous informers concerning fellow Australians thought to be escaping the clutch of the taxation Monopoly.

The Communist Menace

Reed makes some startling statements about the Communist menace in Great Britain. He knows all about the most dangerous of these traitors; those who do not disclose their affiliations. He claims that one-tenth of the 393 Socialists elected in 1945 are undisclosed Communists. He points out that most of the Communist strength is the result of domination of the trade unions. The Communists supported the direc-

tion of labour policy of the Attlee Go-vernment, as they did the imposition of

bread rationing. In dealing with the large number of Jews, most of them rabid Zionists, in the British Socialist Party, Mr. Reed does not pull his punches. He also quotes an esti-mate, which states that between 60 and 70 members of the House of Parliament are Jews. This significant fact has re-ceived no publicity in the daily press of this country.

HOW AUSTRALIANS ARE BEING SWINDLED BY THE PARTY POLITICAL GAME

After a run dating back to the early days of the war, during most of which time the Chifley Government basked in the sunshine of approval from the "capitalist" Press, so that electors came to accept it as a permanent institution, there have been fairly obvious signs during the past few months that the same Press has taken upon itself the responsibility of preparing "public opinion" for a change.

How far that change will be removed from any change of policy is indicated in the evidence presented below.

Whether or not "public opinion" responds to the present press campaign there are signs that our "Labour" politicians, who know quite well who pulls the strings in Australian politics (particularly the purse strings), are preparing against the possibility of the worst, whilst no doubt still hoping for the best.

Stage Being Set

To those who can read between the lines in Canberra politics it is clear that the hope behind the Representation Bill (1948) is that the not-so-safe Labour seats will be made safe and the safe seats become safer yet, whilst an enlarged Senate elected by proportional representation will prevent a landslide there.

Seeing that the stage is being prepared for a change of the actors in the not so distant future, it might be wise, and not without profit, to explore the possibility of a change of policy away from the totalitarianism of Mr. Chifley and his Socialist caucus.

To do that we must examine the history of the present "opposition" and take particular note of their more recent utterances.

"Opposition" Statements

Perhaps the best point for the commencement of our search is the confessions of Messrs. Menzies, Spender, and Harrison when rising in defence of the people's freedom and the Constitution at the commencement of the debate on the Rents and Prices Bill (1948).

On that occasion Mr. Menzies said: "I say quite plainly that there are speeches of mine to be found in which I have advocated a system in which there would be a great centralisation of power with an effective decentralisation of function. But the events of the past few years have

be salved before the wicked totalitarians could be put to flight. These are the words with which he emptied the skeletons from his private cupboard:

"There was a time when I was a strong supporter of unification and believed in the centralisation of power in Canberra, but I have learned that when a government is dishonest enough to introduce into the Parliament legislation designed to affect fundamentally the lives of the people, without having a mandate to do so, there is danger of the loss of freedom."

Convenient Change

This change of outlook in the Opposition leaders seems to have conveniently occurred at the same time and the right time, and to have conveniently coincided with a newspaper campaign against the Chifley Government.

It is clear from the above utterances that the three gentlemen who made them are not so much concerned with the centralisation of power as such, as they are with the continued exercise of power by a party other than their own.

This concern of the leaders of the Opposition for the will of the people seems strangely out of place against the classic statement by Mr. Menzies in his book, *The Forgotten People*, that:

"It is notorious that many electors believe that the function of their member of parliament is to ascertain, if he can, what a majority of his electors desire, and then to plump for it in parliament. A more stupid and humiliating conception of a member of parliament can hardly be imagined."

If Mr. Menzies has outgrown his contempt for the will of the elector, he certainly gave no indication of it when he and a majority of the "opposition" cooperated so readily with the socialist totalitarians in the ratification of the Bretton Woods "Agreement", quite unconcerned for the will of anyone other than the people behind the international control of finance.

rational reason why the States should be maintained."

There is reason to believe that Mr. Menzies had similar aims at that time, and the Melbourne *Herald* of 19th October had this to say regarding some of the present "defenders" of State sovereignty:

" 'Wartime is no time to be meddling with the Constitution,' said the Federal Country Party Leader (Mr. Cameron) commenting on reports that three Federal Ministers—the Assistant Treasurer (Mr. Spender), the Postmaster-General (Mr. Harrison), and Sir Frederick Stewart—advocated the abolition of State Parliaments." But the above are not the only skele-

But the above are not the only skeletons in the cupboards of the parties which constitute the Opposition at present. It should not be forgotten that price control was originally introduced by the Menzies Government at the outbreak of war, with no right of appeal to the Minister, together with many other controls.

It is also interesting to reflect that one of the parties in the present Opposition was responsible for the establishment of most of the boards set up to control the farmer.

The Benefits Of Compositng

The following is a brief summary of the principal benefits of compost farming or gardening:

The fertility of the soil is increased, resulting in greater production.

The soil's ability to absorb rain and retain water is improved. This should be carefully considered by Australian agriculturists, most of whom have a comparatively low rainfall.

In his Pay Dirt, the American organic farming authority, Rodale, says that compost increases the capacity of the soil to absorb and retain rainfall by up to 50 percent.

No Erosion, Few Floods

There is no soil erosion and few floods.

The increased flooding of rivers in many parts of the world can be traced directly to the destruction of vegetation and humus by fires, the indiscriminate falling of timber, over-cropping, &c., in the water sheds.

Howard writes: "There is . . . ample humus (in the forest soil) for the direct absorption of moisture. The excess drains away slowly by way of the sub-soil. There is remarkably little run-off, even from the primeval rain forest. Hardly any soil is removed. Nothing in the nature of soil erosion occurs. The streams and rivers in forest areas are always perennial because of the vast quantity of water in slow transit between the rainstorms and the sea. There is therefore little or no drought in forest areas because so much of the rainfall is retained exactly where it is needed. There is no waste anywhere."

The soil is looser and more easily worked.

This saves work, which helps to compensate for the time spent in making compost.

The farmer or gardener can start work much sooner after rain.

Soil lacking in humus is very sticky after rain and later sets hard.

More Earthworms

The greater the humus content of the soil, the greater the number of earthworms, Charles Darwin estimated that earthworms will, in fertile soil, add an average of 1/5 of an inch in thickness of topsoil every year.

Organic soil will not pack hard under the weight of heavy machinery.

Aeration is much better.

It has been shown that the roots of plants in poorly aerated soils suffer from asphyxiation and practically strangle. It is well to remember that the burrowing of earthworms also helps aerate the soil.

Heat Absorption

Compost darkens the soil and permits the quicker absorption of heat.

The soil thus warms up earlier in the spring and helps germination of seeds. In his agricultural classic, *The Clifton* Park System of Farming, the great Eng-lish authority, Robert H. Elliot, writes:

"It is important to note too that the

air passing over a humus-fed soil would be cooler and moister than air passing over a mineralised soil. The dew-fall therefore would be greater and when the land throughout the country becomes generally humus-fed, the rainfall would be more advantageously distributed, and fall over a greater number of days in small showers instead of in heavy falls as in the case when the land is clothed with forest."

Soil Healthier

Plants grown on compost manured soils are healthier.

Insects do not attack healthy plants grown on compost. This eliminates the necessity for all the time and money spent on chemical sprays.

It is surprising how some agricul-turists will argue against composting be-cause of "extra" work while they spend long hours on spraying, &c., necessitated by diseases which would be eliminated by the use of compost.

The production of healthy crops, plants, and animals by composting would soon result in a considerable reduction in human diseases.

UNREALISTIC EXPERIMENTS AT ROTHAMSTED RESEARCH STATION

Lady Eve Balfour, famous authority on modern methods of organic farming, paid a visit to the orthodox agricultural research station at Rothamsted, England. She described what she saw in a recent edition of the Quarterly Review, "Mother Earth," journal, of The Soil Association.

Later, I was taken to the farm at my own insistence. I naturally asked to see any compost they had been making or any composting experiments that were being done. The thing that startled me most was to discover the nature of the material, which the Rothamsted workers call compost. There is a concrete pit, like a small swimming bath, where straw is soaked with water mixed with sulphate of ammonia, and then forked out onto a kind of draining board. A second so-called type of compost consists in very large heaps of waste ma-

with farmyard manure as its basic in-gredient, but even this has sulphate of ammonia added to it.

12 Months To Make

None of these "composts" take less than twelve months to make, and even after that period no true decomposition has taken place. The straw is shorter, but it is still obviously straw. The beau-tiful, fine, leaf-mould material—practic-ally soil—, which we understand as compost, is unknown at Rothamsted.

This means, of course, that any state ment of opinion which comes out of Rothamsted, as to what compost can or cannot do, and similarly any criticism as to our claims of what it can and cannot do, must be the result of secondhand information or else of guesswork.

One of the most damning indictments against chemical fertilisers is their destruction of earthworms. The earthworm plays an important role in increasing soil fertility.

Boring deep down into the soil they bring basic minerals to the top.

Earthworm castings have a great fertiliser value. In recent years there has been a great awakening to the fact that the earthworm is one of the greatest assets the farmer and gardener has. In his book, Vegetable Mold and Earth-
