The Truth About Chinese Communists

Following the recent public controversy between the Minister for External Affairs, Mr. P. C. Spender, and Sir Douglas Copland, on the question of whether Australia should recognise Communist China, a number of letters supporting Sir Douglas's viewpoint have been published by the Melbourne press. It is obvious that there is still a great amount of wishful and unrealistic thinking concerning Communist China. The widespread misunderstanding of the real Communist menace has made it comparatively easy for the Communist propagandists to mislead and confuse large numbers of influential members of the community.

A Russian's Exposure In a series of articles published in 1949, one of the numerous Russians who have fled from the Communist tyranny since the conclusion of the war, Lieut. -Colonel Grigon A. Tokoev, former Staff Officer of the Soviet Military Administration in Germany, dealt extensively with Communist aims in the Far East. His comment on the Chinese 'agrarian reformers" should be contrasted with those of Sir Douglas Copland and other Socialist "experts":

"There is a myth, fostered with consummate skill and assiduity by Soviet propa-gandists, that the Chinese Communists, far from owing allegiance to theoretical Marx-ism or the Cominform, are only simple Oriental agrarians hungry for land and democracy. I have also heard the hope expressed by otherwise intelligent people in the West that Mao Tse-tung, though a self-avowed Communist, is really an agrarian nationalist, who, if pressed hard by the Kremlin, would rebel as Tito has done... Mao himself is a dedicated Communist, a true Believer. He has never deviated from the Party line, and was the first of the non-Soviet Proconsuls to denounce Tito's heresy. If his victories continue he will certainly go down in Asiatic history as the Lenin of China."

Land "Reforms"

In an article published in The Readers' Digest of February, 1951, "the most factual account of Communist methods that has emerged from China, it is revealed how the Communists "welcomed as 'liberators' by a Chinese village, step by careful step eventually revealed themselves as bloody terrorists." Recent reports of large-scale famine in China may not be unconnected with the Communist brand of "agrarian reform."

Determined action now by the Western Powers, to support Chiang Kai-Shek, in every possible way, as suggested by General MacArthur, could easily prevent the Chinese Communists from consolidating their position and thus extending the base from which to direct the Communist con-spiracy against Western Civilization. The history of the Chinese Communists flatly contradicts all the subtle propaganda suggesting that a wedge can be driven between them and the Moscow Communists. Soon after gaining complete control in China, Mao Tse-tung frankly announced that Communist China was going to be pro-Soviet and anti-Western Democracies. "Communist China cannot expect genuine aid from the Governments of United States and Britain. We belong to the anti-Imperialist front headed by the Soviet, and we can look for genuine, friendly aid only from that front. China will not sit on the fence. Neutrality is a camouflage.'

As soon as Task Two approaches completion . . . then the Politburo will return, with whetted appetite and confidence, to Europe. Therein lies the true significance of China's collapse. From the Soviet strategic point of view, the fact that, Mao Tse-tung has finally all but brought Chiang Kai-Shek down after two decades of incessant struggle is only of incidental importance. The great thing is that the ever-vulnerable rear of the Soviet Union is in the process

Communist Strategy

"War is not in the Soviet Politburo's time-table for 1951. On the contrary, there is no sign of mobilisation in Russia. Bread remains unrationed, factories are not being dispersed and there is little war propaganda Moscow's satellites are not dependable and have large elements ready to grasp the opportunity to revolt which war would offer. Russia's own troops can-not be entirely trusted if the Red Army advances outside Russian borders. Another factor is that Russia has still not digested her recent gains, and is unlikely to risk the loss of an empire she has not yet consolidated."

The above is an extract from a recent report by the United States News, based, it is claimed, upon the opinion of "key officials in the best position to judge, both in America and abroad." If this report is truewe have no means of checking it at present -it bears out our contention that the Communist leaders are relying mainly upon their conspiratorial and subversive activities to further their revolution. "The threat of War"-"Korea" and other incidents can always be used to create the necessary conditions-can be exploited to stampede the non-Communist countries into accepting the very Communist society their "leaders" claim they are opposing.

Council Amalgamation

The Victorian Minister for Public Works, Mr. Byrnes, has recently returned from New Zealand, where he claims that the creation of a Greater Wellington Council has been a great success. Mr. Byrnes also claims in favour of his Government's proposal for a Greater Melbourne Council, that Council amalgamations in Sydney have been satisfactory. From the point of view of those controlling them, we have no doubt that Council amalgamations in both Wellington and Sydney have been highly successful, but what do the individual ratepayers think. We know that in both Sydney and Brisbane, protests from ratepayers against Council amalgamations have grown.

No doubt the Federal Government claims that the destruction of the States has been a great success, but do Mr. Byrnes and his colleagues agree with this point of view? Centralisation has been a menace to the individual whenever tried. Its principal advocates are the Communists and Socialists.

Recent exposures in the American magazine, *Reporter*, provided documentary proof that at least nine American millionaires were providing financial assistance for the Communists. Communist Decline?

Mr. Gifford is a director of the Carnegie Institute of which Mr. Alger Hiss, Communist espionage agent, was President up until the time of his trial.

Bank Merger

Our major reason for republishing the article below from the Melbourne Labor Call of January 25 is to draw attention to the manner in which the present Federal Government and many businessmen provide the Socialists with excellent propaganda material.

It was the Fabian Socialist, H. G. Wells, who wrote back in 1920: "Big Business is by no means antipathetic to Communism. The larger big business grows the more it approximates to Collectivism. It is the upper road of the few instead of the lower road of the masses to Collectivism.

The Labor Call's article reads: –

The most colossal piece of impudence ever attempted on the Australian people reached an advance stage this week, when the merger of two major banks—Union Bank and Bank of Australasia-was reported to have received the approval of Mr. Fadden, Federal Treasurer.

The deal put Mr. Fadden in a class above Judas, who sold out for 30 pieces of silver. The bank merger involved an amount of £347,000,000.

The Treasurer's approval was nothing less than shameful repudiation of his own and his Party's avowed principle of encouraging competition within the banking structure.

This principle was the basic reason advanced by opponents of the Chifley Labor Government's bank nationalisation pro-posals in 1947 for retention of the private banking system.

Mr. Fadden's acquiescence in the merger - the biggest banking deal in Australian history — has blasted for all time the hypocrisy of Tory protestations against bringing all banks within control of the people.

What possible justification can be advanced for an amalgamation of two thriving organisations — their combined deposits rose by £58,000,000 in the last 12 months when the result will be a self-condemned reduction in banking facilities throughout the Commonwealth?

"Strong concerns vie for supremacy with more 'guns' than small ones.'

It is unnecessary to go beyond the columns of other capitalist dailies to appreciate the complete falsity of that statement.

The Sydney Morning Herald's Finance Editor wrote, when the proposed merger was being widely discussed 12 months ago:

'If the English directors hope to secure benefits for their two companies-apart from any gains from share transfers—it can only be by the closing of competing branches and the reduction of staff overheads.

"There is now a branch of each bank at about 80 points in Australia.

'Although the case for private trading banks is usually couched in the form of the benefits from competition, it is probably better expressed as giving greater choice to the public—and more 'rights of appeal' to borrowers.

'Bank customers are going to lose a lot of choice—and be less sure of getting a loan-if some or all of those 80 Union or Asia branches are closed.'

It is to be hoped that the Treasurer (Mr. Fadden then, as now) will have this well in mind, as well as the bad moral effect of such an amalgamation—when the banks apply to him for permission under Section 51 of the Banking Act, 1945.

Another rich piece of irony was provided

14,710,150 gallons of petroleum products. 19,000,000 pounds of tin-plated steel sheeting through New York Port alone.

This is the same administration which is issuing these export licences in Washington as refused to permit supplies to be sent to Chiang Kai-Shek in his fight to save China from the Reds. This treachery is not unlike our building up Japan until the minute of war in 1941, from which time on we got

The Anti-British Conspiracy II

When we consider the records of the British people — the military prowess of the English and Scots and their descendants in the dominions, culminating in their superb effort in the last war; their inventive genius which, in the last war, was greater than that of America and Europe put together; their genius as a colonising race; and, above all, their ability to readjust themselves in a changing world — when we consider these records soberly and honestly we begin to scratch our heads and say — "Why is Great Britain being treated as an enemy alien by America; why is she being pushed off the international diplomatic scene as a world power; why should she be vilified by the Zionists all over the world after she has spent so much in life and treasure in defeating Hitler, the alleged persecutor of the Jews?

After we recover from the acute sense of anger aroused by these questions we ask the further question, the one which this journal, one of the few of all the Australian journals, has asked: "Why, after the greatest effort in her whole history, emerging with her prestige high and as victor over an enemy hated by half the civilised world—why should the power, prestige and glory which was her due be transferred from Great Britain to New York, and without a protest from any of the official British organs of publicity?

Although one is struck dumb by the colossal audacity of this knavish confidence trick, it is the fact that the thing was achieved at all, and with such great ease and complete absence of any protest which is the really dreadful aspect of the whole incredible business.

Whichever way you look at the selling out of the British Empire, the story presented to us by the world press does not fit the facts—it is simply not true. If such a brazen piece of insolence and fraud could be perpetrated so easily on such a sturdy and independent race as the British, one wonders what else has been done by the same agency, less brazenly and less openly. One wonders, for example, what has happened in India, Ireland, Canada and China?

In answer to those critics who suggest that Great Britain has played her part as a world power, and that it was inevitable that her Empire should break up into its separate parts, I suggest that the process was not so inevitable as critics would have us believe. Let us consider some important factors.

The administration of a country consists largely in removing unnecessary irritants and grievances, and in protecting honest men and women and their property from molestation. You can see the idea exemplified in part in what is known as a "happy ship." Life aboard ship for long periods is inevitably restricted, and for most men is not very natural; trouble soon starts unless someone in charge removes grievances and eliminates troublemakers. Conversely, the refusal to remove grievances and troublemakers is part of an ancient technique, well known to Eastern potentates, which can be used to create explosive conditions where and when required. A few years ago I was discussing India with an English merchant who had been in that country over twenty years; like most responsible men, he had been associated with various societies in an endeavour to help the Indians in different spheres of

activities, and to bring about good relationship and mutual understanding. Over a series of years members of these different societies had met and discussed their difficulties; each one of them found that they could get so far in their ventures, but never very far, before they were jammed. Whichever way they moved, they were jammed, and in each case they traced the trouble to one source—to the Viceroy of India.

This year I met a British official from India, and put the above statement to him. I asked him if it coincided with his experience, and he said, "Very definitely." He said there was quite a lot of organised anti-British propaganda, and that the government was taking no measures to organise the British point of view. He and others offered to do this with films, etc., but no British official had power to give permission. On making enquiries he found that this was one of the many "transferred powers," i.e., powers taken from British officials and given to the Viceroy. The appeal to the Viceroy for permission was refused.

Few intelligent Englishmen would care to work in India under such ridiculous conditions of frustration, nor to place their son in such a humiliating position; and the deterioration of the personnel of the Indian Civil Service in the years preceding the last war can well be imagined.

The story of the British retreat from India has yet to be written, and when the British people hear the sordid details they will be amazed—that is, if they are still capable of being amazed at anything.

No doubt the stories of Canada and of Ireland will be found to run along similar lines. The trouble starts at the top—where trouble always starts. And when we begin to examine communism the trouble will be found to start at such a high level as to be almost invisible to the naked eye.

All over the world there is material, which by processes explained above can be ignited by evil men who think they have sufficient power to direct the conflagration to their own purposes. What happens to the helpless victims will, with the aid of the world press, be hidden behind an iron curtain. All we shall be told will be that the "Oppressor" has been removed, and the natives are hell bent on "Democracy" and "Progress" (just like Russia). When the British power moves out of India another power must take its place. It is stupid to suggest that a few Indian intellectuals can rule India, or would be permitted to do so. The rulers of India will be the same people who were strong enough

to hold the hand of the Viceroy, who were strong enough to remove British Rule from India—and none of these was an Indian.

The removal of experienced European administrators from various territories in the East is not due to any spontaneous uprising of national feeling among backward races—the finger of Moscow and New York can be traced in most of the trouble

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THE POWER CRISIS

Over a number of years this journal has been constantly warning that increasing economic centralisation can only result in progressively less genuine benefits for the individual. The drastic power cuts now being imposed in Australia's two biggest cities, Melbourne and Sydney, provides grim evidence of the insanity of policies which have been endorsed and furthered by all political parties. In Victoria the extension of the State Electricity Commission's monopoly of power has been hailed on all sides as genuine progress. But, like all Socialist organisations, the S.E.C. has failed "to deliver the goods". Even worse than this, it uses its vast powers to intimidate any of its customers who refuse to bow to this monopoly's arbitrary edicts.

While it is true that the policies of the Canberra planners have made it difficult for any organisation to plan ahead and operate satisfactorily, it is significant that all the monopolies, whether "private" or State, are failing to demonstrate that great efficiency, which the Socialists contend, arises from progressive centralisation. The S.E.C. is at present causing more industrial unrest throughout Victoria than all the Communists put together. If drastic power rationing has to be applied in the middle of the driest and hottest summer on record, what is going to be the position in the middle of the winter?

It is revealing to look back over the number of excuses for power failures made by the S.E.C. in recent years.

The stock excuse has, of course, been the war. But the war has now been over for nearly six years. Year after year it has been predicted that within two years the power shortage would be overcome. It is now claimed that by 1953 there will be adequate power. But no doubt the arrival of 1953 will put forward another few yean the S.E.C.'s estimates. The truth of the matter is, as S.E.C. apologists themselves admit, that this State Monopoly has failed dismally to plan ahead. It is claimed that the S.E.C. has been unable to anticipate growing demands for power. But this ignores the fact that the S.E.C. has over a number of years pursued its monopolistic policy of taking over existing local generating power units while at the same time connecting more and more customers.

There are, even now, local electric generating units in several parts of Victoria. These units operate satisfactorily and, for the very reason that they are local, have always been able to anticipate demand and within present financial limitations—the S.E.C. has none—plan accordingly. If the bureaucratic controllers of the S.E.C. were honest and said that they cannot supply power to meet growing demands, and that they were not going to accept any more customers at the expense of present customers, we have not the slightest doubt that steps would then be taken to develop alternative power supplies. But while people persist in believing that the failures of centralisation can only be solved by still more centralisation, present industrial disasters will continue to because worse. What we arc experiencing is the breakdown of an industrial system which is inherently self-destructive.

Communistic Influence in U.S. Universities

"OTTAWA—The Soviet Union and the satellite governments of Eastern Europe are waging a subtle battle to place communist sympathizers on the faculties of Slavic Studies in United States educational institutions.

"Favourite method of infiltration by the Kremlin is to offer large cash sums to endow chairs in U.S. universities where Slavic languages, especially Russian, have jumped to the top of the curricula.

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jumped to the top of the curricula. "Before Gen. Dwight E. Eisenhower took over as president of Columbia University in mid-1948, the communist government of Poland had given \$10,000 to the university for a chair of Polish Literature. The man who led the protest against acceptance of the "gift' Sigmund J. Sluszka told *The Ensign* here that all loyal Polish American students left the 38,000-strong student body when the money was accepted.

"Sluszka, who was recently awarded a Doctor of Philosophy degree in Slavic languages by the University of Ottawa, is an instructor in Polish civilization at Brooklyn College, N.Y., and teaches English and Journalism at Sewanaka High School, Floral Park, Long Island, N.Y.

Snapped Up Offer

"Robert Fackenthal, now a trustee of Columbia University, snapped up the Warsaw offer of a grant while he was acting head of the university before Eisenhower took over, Sluszka said. Named to the chair of Polish Literature was Dr. Manfred Kridl, unknown to Columbia until he was suggested by Warsaw authorities as the man for the job. Sluszka said Kridl, who still holds the post, was a close friend of Oscar Lange, great-nephew of Karl Marx and first ambassador to the U.S. of the Polish communist government.

"Lange, a member of the Chicago University economic faculty from 1943 to 1945, was an associate of Dr. Leopold Infeld, University of Toronto physio-mathematician who left Canada for Warsaw last June to help reorganize the Polish education system . . . Lange himself has since been recalled to Warsaw.

Czechoslovakia Gift

"Columbia University also accepted a \$15,000 gift from the communist regime in Czechoslovakia but refused \$5,000 from Hungary. *The Ensign* also learned that the Universities of Pittsburgh. Michigan and Indiana have refused gift 'with strings attached' from Eastern European satellites..."

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Korean War Furthers World Plot

Subsequent events have confirmed the central thesis of the following penetrating article by Mr. L. D. Byrne in the September 1950, issue of the Canadian journal, "Social Credit":

It is, of course, the intention of the Promoters of the World Revolution that the tumult of propaganda accompanying the Korean "war" shall obscure the design of its real purpose.

We are asked to believe that the policy being pursued by the State Department of the United States under Dean Acheson is strongly opposed to Communism. According to Robert H. Williams, of California, who is one of the best informed authorities on the Communist-Zionist plot, Acheson is a protégé and close associate of Felix Frankfurter, aptly described by him as "the pro-Moscow Marxist—who is also one of the world's leading Zionists."

In the same issue of Williams' Intelligence Summary (December, 1949), we learn that John J. McCloy, High Commissioner of U.S.-occupied Western Germany, is a protégé of Felix Frankfurter. His assistant and adviser is Benjamin Buttenweiser, who resigned from Kuhn, Loeb and Co. to take the appointment last September.

The organization in Paris headed by Harriman—closely associated with Kuhn, Loeb and Co.—takes care of policy regarding both Marshall Aid to Europe and the disposal of Western German exports.

Behind the U.N. What?

The United Nations Organization was born during the latter part of what we are asked to call World War II. Its origin can be traced to the scheme put forward by James Warburg of Kuhn, Loeb and Co., and subsequently promoted by Clarence Kirshman Streit for a federation of "democracies" under a world authority controlling finance, the armed forces, police, civil rights and international trade—in fact, an absolute tyranny on the model of the U.S.S.R.

The U.N.O. was brought to birth by the enthusiastic efforts of Alger Hiss (also a protégé of Felix Frankfurter), representing the U.S. State Department. Unfortunately for his real masters, he was subsequently indicted for perjury and denounced as a Communist working against the United States.

Secretary-General The and chief executive of U.N.O., who was chosen by "the vote" of the delegates of member states, is Trygya Lie. According to *The S. J. Frame* Monthly for May, 1949; "Fiat, Dublin, 1947, reports: 'Comrade Lie owes his present position as Secretary-General of U.N.O. to the faithful service he has so long rendered to Stalin. Trotsky in his last work, "Stalin and His Crimes," devotes an entire chapter to the subversive activities of Comrade Lie. The Comintern, states Trotsky, regarded Lie as one of its chosen instruments. The various other agencies of U.N.O. were organized with meticulous care. The key positions in U.N.R.R.A. were held almost exclusively by Zionist Jews under Messrs. Lehmann, LaGuardia, Munk, Green-Bank was organized under Eugene Meyer. The Atomic Commission was headed by Bernard Baruch (later replaced by Lilienthal). And so on down the line, with a non-Zionist front wherever it could be arranged with safety.

From Yalta to Korea

The second world war "to make the world safe for democracy" having been concluded, to the accompaniment of hysterical propaganda in favour of "our glorious allies, the Soviet Union," and their "democratic way of life." the Zionist Promoters of the World Revolution lost no time in consolidating their gains. Too late it dawned on people in the United States and British Commonwealth Countries that Yalta and Potsdam had been treason feasts. Poland, to protect the integrity of which Great Britain and France had declared war on Nazi Germany, only to be double-crossed by the Soviet Union, was handed over to the totalitarian U.S.S.R., together with half of Germany (including control, of Berlin), and the rest of Eastern Europe. Zionist dominated Soviet Russia—ally of Nazi Germany at the beginning of the war, pursuing an identical policy and enjoying the of the pick of the Nazi High Command (General Paulus and Co.) was the real victor. To round off the victory, Palestine was allowed to be "conquered" by the Jewish forces, under the auspices of the Zionist-dominated U.N.O.; and the State of Israel, organized on Communist lines, was established as the geographical centre of International Zionism.

The Zionist forces, headed by Kuhn, Loeb and Co., and the Baruchs, Frankfurters, Cohens, Meyers, Stracheys, Laskis, Harrimans *et al.* rapidly increased the economic stranglehold on Western Europe and Great Britain, while perfecting the machinery for a coup d'etat on the American continent. Meantime the military strength of Zionism, as represented by the armed forces of the U.S.S.R., China and Russian-dominated countries, was built up for the final stage.

In Great Britain, France, Italy, the United States, Canada, and Australia, the centralization of power was intensified under the threat of war; the idea of World Government popularized, loyalty to U.N.O. and its agencies built up—all in preparation of the latter stages of the Revolution for the universal Communist State—i.e., for the conquest of the world for the Zionist rulers.

From Korea to

When the necessary groundwork was completed the so-called Schumann Plan (probably conceived in the parlours of Wall and Pine Streets, New York) was produced. Its purpose was to set up an economic dictatorship of Western Europe, giving the Promoters absolute control of Eastern Europe and Asia through the machinery of the Soviet Union, the economic control as a prelude to political and military control over Western Europe, including Great Britain. But the unforeseen occurred. The Zionistdominated socialist government of Great Britain, under pressure from the Trade Unions, refused to have anything to do with the Schumann Plan. Comrade Trygve Lie, no doubt with appropriate instructions, was sent hotfoot to Moscow under cover of the fantastic pretext that he would try to end the "cold war." forces in North Korea were poised for the signal.

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Mulches By J. I. RODALE, "Organic Gardening", U.S.A., July, 1950

About April 15th we made our decision regarding what to do with the mulch that had lain on our vegetable patch since last October. We plowed it under as shallow as the plow would permit. It was far from being decayed. Much decomposition had been accomplished at the bottom of the mulch. The material was greatly darkened and softened. There was no fear that the thrusting of so much raw organic matter upon the micro-organisms of the soils would create a nitrogen deficiency because, to start with, our soil was so fertile. Those who start with an infertile soil, or a soil that has just come from the chemical method, would do well to pull the mulch away, plant and then return the mulch.

As it was, our soil had the benefit of a protective, warming mulch all winter, which no doubt helped to multiply the soil organisms and the earthworms. From an examination of the soil, we are completely satisfied thus far. It looks much darker and of better tilth than in previous years when we went to the trouble of making compost and applying it. I have never applied so much organic matter to one piece of ground. When we used to make compost, there never seemed to be enough to go around. Now with the application of a new heavy mulch as soon as the plants start growing, and leaving it as a cover over next winter we know that there will not be a lack of organic matter,

Mulching Increases Potassium

There is extensive literature to indicate that there is production of potassium under mulch. In one test a type of mulch, which was low in potassium, was used on a soil in which the potassium tested low. After the lapse of a period of time, the soil tested much higher in potash, much more than would be warranted by the amount of potash in the plant material of the mulch. Evidently the leaching down into the soil of liquids obtained from the mulch furnished something that worked on the insoluble potash in the soil and made some of it available. Carbon dioxide given off in plant matter decay may have been a factor. When compost is made, large amounts of carbon dioxide are given off and lost into the atmosphere. I am going to talk more and more from time to time on the dynamic quality of organic matter placed directly on the soil. It does many things of value to the soil when the process of decay takes place in or over it,

the Jan., 1950, *American Fruit Grower:* "At Purdue University (Indiana) Clarence E. Baker found that mulching with manure, straw and soybean hay eliminated symptoms of potassium deficiency in a peach orchard. Check trees, which received no mulch, did not recover.

Mulches Increase Yield

Here is an item from *Successful Farm-ing* (Feb., 1950), which shows another advantage in mulching:

Do you often get a big apple crop one year and none the next? Well, here's a tip! The Indiana Agricultural Experiment Station says mulched apple trees tend to bear annually instead of every other year. The trees bloom moderately. There's a fairly good fruit set every year.

Reporting on a continuing experiment, the Indiana research workers state that their Grimes trees, in sod and mulched, have been leaders in production. The mulch used was a mixture of straw, shavings, and manure. Strawy manure would probably work quite well if it is kept in a loose condition. —Don. L. Helt.

Channing Cope in the March 23 issue of the Atlanta Constitution says: "The Experiment Station at Watkinsville has discovered mulching is a better land building practice than is the plowing under of green manures. Perhaps these practices are not regarded as composting by the organic farmers, but they are steps in the right direction. We still need fertilizers with most of these practices, but as we increase the humus content of our soils we move closer to the day when we need less fertilizers—perhaps none at all." Another Example

Here is another example of splendid results obtained from mulch gardening, and I am going to reprint the entire item, which was written by Carrow de Vries and published in the Ligonier, Ind., *Banner* of March 9. Indiana seems to be partial to mulching. The article is entitled: "Mr. Koester's Wonderful Garden."

When I lived in Detroit, my father-in-

he told me that Mr. Koester didn't use chemical fertilizers and didn't spray, I knew my father-in-law had gone far beyond optimism and was just plain lying. I knew that because I was trying to raise a Victory garden and spent a lot of money on chemical fertilizers and sprays.

"A few years later, I moved near to Ligonier and had a chance to see his garden grow. To my astonishment, I saw my father-in-law had not needed to exaggerate. Mr. Koester actually did raise such wonderful vegetables.

"One day he told me how it all came about. He reads a lot of magazines, and having an inquiring mind, is always in search of new ones. Mr. Koester glanced through a magazine on organic farming and said, 'Nobody can tell me you can raise decent vegetables without using chemical fertilizers and spraying.'

"He had been a chemical fertilizer man for years. He even mixed the stuff into his soil with his hands. But something about the magazine made him pick it up again and in the end he decided to give it a trial.

"He sheet-composted three inches of wellrotted cow manure for three years. Once during that time, he applied phosphate rock at the rate of eight to ten pounds per one hundred square feet. He mulched two seasons and turned the residue under in the Fall, but gave it up as it left him with no weeding to do. The results he obtained are unbelievable.

"His garden plot is enclosed by a rabbit fence. (Rabbits have a special liking for his vegetables.) The windbreak is of Kentucky Wonder beans and I have never seen so many pods, so long and so tender. They vary between nine and twelve inches in length.

Next to the windbreak are wax and green beans. The foliage is heavy, the pods abundant, and seven to eight inches long.

"The foliage on the limas is thick, the pods plentiful, the beans tender and delicious. In fact, the best I have ever eaten.

"Then comes the tomatoes, ten feet high, two stems per plant having trusses of from nine to fifteen tomatoes.

"Then in succession eggplant, beets, swiss chard, and broccoli. Yes, eggplants as big as large muskmelons, and broccoli as big around as a dinner plate. "About a third of the garden is devoted to flowers. And a lovely sight it is. Many are the cars that drive slowly by to enjoy it all."

Here is another bit of evidence that mulches increase potassium. I quote from

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law came to see me often, especially in the summer, and on each visit had something new to tell me concerning Mr. Koester's wonderful garden on Morrison Island on Lake Wawasee, Indiana.

two facts. Mulching may sometimes prove dangerous in the early season when there is risk of freezing. At such a time the mulch increases the warmth under it and if the weather turns too cold, the upper part of the plant may freeze. This has been found to happen often in England where they try for a long growing season. Where there is such a question, if there is a mulch on the ground, rake it aside into piles, but be sure to keep these piles on unplanted portions of the patch so that liquid leachings from them will be preserved in soil where planting is done. Where new mulch material is accumulated, make piles of it, if possible, right in the vegetable garden, for the same reason. If it is a dry year or a dry region, water should be applied to the laying mulch.

One of our readers, Vernon Ward, of North Carolina had an interesting experience in pre-mulching tomatoes. First he plowed and harrowed, then he mulched the ground with about six to eight inches of wheat straw. Then, using Rutgers plants, he set his tomato plants through the mulch at a distance of four feet apart each way. To set the plants he pulled the mulch apart and set the roots in the prepared ground, then pushed the mulch back together around the stems. This was the end of his work. He did nothing else the entire season but pick tomatoes. Dark green vines soon completely covered and obliterated the mulch. No weeds grew. There was an immense set of fine tomatoes, which remained large, with hardly any culls throughout the growing season, and the vines were still full of tomatoes at frost. Due to the fact that the fruit rested on the straw mulch, there was hardly any rotting at any time during the season.

An Experience in India

In a book called *Out in the Midday Sun*, by Monica Martin (Little Brown and Co.), the author gives an experience with her garden. She says:

"In friendly rivalry with other gardeners, I grew sweet peas with as many as eight blossoms on one stalk, and in such abundance friends decided I was cheating. They looked to see if some of the sweet pea flowers had been stuck on with glue. I have planted potatoes the size of plovers' eggs and dug up their crop, many of which weighed two and a half pounds each. From October to the following April not one single insect nibbled the cauliflowers, cabbages, potatoes, and sweet corn that all grew in a mad scramble to see which could be the biggest. The cabbages, great white heart drumheads, and the cauliflowers were a size I have never seen anywhere else, and with never a nibbled leaf or a crumpled blossom. In winter the only enemy of the

Her method is what we advocate as the "new method." Note that she applied the manure right after the previous growing season was over. She worked the manure into the soil and gave it six months to decay before the next planting season began. There were no losses due to the rains washing out valuable substances, for in her case, the washings stayed in the soil where the plants were to be grown and not on some unused site of a compost heap. What is also important was that the decomposition was a cold decay as nature always uses in her composting, not the high heat of a compost heap which oxidizes out valuable nutrients, bacteria and enzymes. The lady thus obtained spectacular results.

Seeds as Fertilizers in the New Organic Method

In the December 1949 issue, page 21, projected the idea of using seeds such I as beans, soybeans, wheat, barley, oats, sunflower seeds, etc.-as a fertilizer. They would have to be finely ground up, however. I said that they should be applied to the soil about two weeks before planting time. I meant two months instead of two weeks. A hundred pounds of ground whole wheat can be purchased for about \$3.00 and it can be mixed in with your mulch material. Thus it can be applied immediately to a soil and not dug in. At many feed dealers' establishments there are bags of spoiled seed that may be obtained at salvage prices.

Another application of using ground up seed as a fertilizer is to put it in water and let it soak for a few days, then to filter out all the water and use as a fertilizer. I believe this seed-water could be used effectively as an application to growing flowers or other plants.

Make Compost With Earthworms

For the small gardener I would highly recommend the breeding of earthworms for making compost. While they breed, they work with the raw materials of their boxes and turn it into rich fine compost in only 60 days. This does not have the disadvantages of compost made outdoors which has the objection of resting on an earth bottom and which is open to the air. Let me explain our method of doing it.

We use wooden cases about two or three feet square and a little more than two feet high. In the boxes we put a mixture of raw materials. A typical mixture would be about 70 percent weeds, leaves, grass clippings, etc., about 15 percent manure and 15 percent top soil. This can be greatly varied. If no manure is available parts of oughly studied are the enzymes in the composting process. Since enzymes are destroyed at 40 degrees centigrade (104 degrees Fahrenheit) and since compost heaps get up to about 160 degrees Fahrenheit, it would appear that all of the enzymes are destroyed. But in the earthworm boxes the heat would not reach such danger points.

We must also be aware that manures and green matter contain vitamins. One rarely sees mention of this. We are told that in cooking foods much of the vitamin content is destroyed by the heat. Therefore why should this not also be true of vitamins in a compost heap? But in earthworm boxes the heat does not get high enough to destroy enzymes or vitamins. The earthworm compost is also rich in the castings or manure of the earthworm, which is far superior to ordinary animal manures such as horse, cow or pig.

The material in the boxes should be piled to a height of two feet and kept sufficiently watered, but do not put too much water in, or it will create an anaerobic condition. In the Italian method of the enclosed pit we do not exactly have an anaerobic condition. Some air does gain access to the inside, and since no water is put in, the organic matter is not drowned. There is space for air, which is rich in carbon dioxide. We have found that earthworms can thrive in this atmosphere. It is the combined action of the earthworms, bacteria, fungi, etc., which produces the best kind of compost you will see.

The process takes about 60 days. Then you take out half a box of material and fill it up with the raw materials again and in 60 days the new stuff will be completely composted. It is advisable to feed the earthworms with something equivalent to chicken mash, but you can make your own feed, using ground leaves, ground grain seeds such as wheat, barley, corn, etc.

In the spring you can transfer your earthworm and compost-making activities to the outside, being sure that you have a cement base.

First, however, it is advisable to start with the purchased earthworms as they thrive best under conditions of captivity. See advertisements in *Organic Gardening*. Secondly before placing them in the boxes mix all the ingredients thoroughly. This will prevent the high heating which takes place in the regular compost heaps. 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The Truth About Chinese Communists

of being secured: China's open door is closing against the West which first prised it ajar. The collapse of China has advanced with a speed, which must have surprised even the most optimistic Soviet military experts. Two mistakes have obviously helped to bring on the avalanche:

"The lackadaisical attitude of the West to the Soviet grip on Outer Mongolia, which has since become the main Soviet arsenal in Asia, is the first and most outstanding reason for the present collapse of China. The second mistake was that through General Marshall's efforts to impose a coalition Government, the U.S. in effect championed the Chinese Communists as true 'agrarian Liberals' and contributed to the undermining of the established government.

"The attempts of General Marshall to reconcile Chiang Kai-Shek with Mao Tsetung proved that the Americans had not yet clearly understood the basic principles of Communism; that is, the fact that never or under any conditions would Communists accept loyal collaboration with non-Communists. Inside the Soviet Union, Marshall's strange efforts to divide Chiang Kai-Shek's power with Mao Tse-tung's Communist regime were followed with incredulous satisfaction. For one intoxicating moment it almost appeared that the distinguished American would actually succeed where even Nanming, a member of the Central Committee of the Chinese Communist Party, an outstanding Comintern personality and a close friend of Stalin's, had failed.

"Though Marshall's coalition scheme finally broke upon the rock of Chiang's opposition, his withdrawal from China, accompanied by a virtual cessation of all

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U.S. aid to the Chiang Kai-Shek government, in effect represented a strategic victory for Mao against Chiang. With Chiang left to his fate, the way was open for a Soviet thrust into Asia at practically no risk. Soviet arms and military might flowed into the vacuum, and Chiang's unsupported armies were brushed aside.

"It would seem now that another mistake is to be added to the previous ones: Mr. Hoffman, of the Economic Co-operation Administration, has been quoted as saying in Shanghai that even in the event of the Communists coming into control of the Government, U.S. economic aid to Chinas would continue. Is it possible that the Western diplomats have not yet understood that any kind of compromise with the Communists is a danger to world peace?"

Compromise Impossible

It is all too obvious that the doctrine of compromise still has many supporters. The Soviet suggestion of a "Big Four" Conference has been seized upon to suggest that "peace" may yet be possible. But genuine peace with the Communists is no more possible than is a genuine division between the Chinese Communists and the Moscow gangsters. Su rely the Chinese Communist delegate to the "United" Nations left no doubt on this matter when, in his final address before leaving Lake Success, he said: "The great unity between China and the Soviet Union is unshakeable. All your conspiracies of driving a wedge are futile, doomed to failure, and have already failed."

It would be interesting to hear what Sir Douglas Copland and other "intellectuals" have to say about this specific repudiation of their major thesis concerning Communist China.

PROFESSOR EINSTEIN'S FRIENDS

Some months ago this journal named Professor Leopold Infeld of the University of Toronto, as a pro-Communist associate of Dr. Albert Einstein.

Mr. Infeld recently returned to Poland on leave from the University of Toronto, and now writes to inform President Sidney Smith that he has decided to remain in Poland and work for "peace." It is believed that Dr. Infeld, like Einstein, is in possession of vital information on atomic research.

The latest "British" atomic scientist to flee to Russia is Dr. Bruno Pontecorvo, who is reported to have had full access to whatever secret work was under way at the Chalk River atomic plant in Ontario where he worked during the war. Professor Pontecorvo is reported to have left his native Italy during the Mussolini regime to escape "anti-Semitism."

The authoritative Canadian Weekly, *The Ensign*, says that Pontecorvo, Infeld, and Professor Zlotowski (also formerly on the staff of the University of Toronto) who now heads Poland's atomic research institute, will probably work together in Moscow's puppet Polish state. Pontecorvo's "career" threw him into close contact with two convicted spies — Dr. Klaus Fuchs and Dr. Alan Nunn-May. A British Conservative M.P. described Pontecorvo as a bosom friend of Fuchs,

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who, it will be recalled, is also a friend of Albert Einstein.

Professor Einstein seems to have an incredible number of friends who are turning out to be traitors to America.

It is amazing how these alien, anti-Christian left-wingers come to our shores seeking refuge; we take them in, give of our hospitality, place them in high positions — and all the while they are stealing our secrets for Russia.
