The Master Mind of World Chaos

Bernard Baruch's Activities

Under a banner of Palestinian blue and white carrying a global device, United World Federalism is on the march, quickening its pace from month to month, from week to week, from day to day. The marchers no longer march — they are breaking into a headlong run.

WHAT'S THE REASON? WHY THE RUSH?

Can the answer be that Bernard M. Baruch, aged eighty and still uncrowned, has no time to lose?

"WORLD GOVERNMENT OR WORLD CHAOS!" is the clamour of the hour.

The frenzied propaganda that seems calculated to mesmerize the public into the belief that world government is inevitable—that has conditioned us to follow personalities rather than principles—reached an all-time high in the virtual coronation of Bernard Baruch on his eightieth birthday. The oratorical columnist, Harry H. Schlacht, who seizes every conceivable opportunity to break into paeans of praise of all things Jewish, led off. As though operated by a push-button, press and radio promptly fell into line to acclaim the never-elected, always-appointed, park-bench "statesman" the greatest personality of the present day. All agreed that this is the Baruchian era. He is the presidential adviser, the President-maker, the father confessor to the people who make the nation go, the far-reaching influence on world events.

In full-page portraits he occupied every inch of the photographic spotlight that perennially plays about the Park Bench and follows the Elder Statesman around the clock to catch him in the kindly act of lifting a small sun-suited friend to the refreshment of the drinking fountain; forming the centrepiece for a cluster of ten-to-a-dozen adoring ladies; arm in arm with Soviet U.N. delegate Andrei Gromyko in a ringside seat at a heavyweight bout; in confidential communion with Dean Acheson, with Winston Churchill, with Thomas E. Dewey, with General Marshall, with General Eisenhower, with Trygve Lie, with Andrei Vishinsky, with Jimmie Byrnes, with Yukio Ozaki, president of the Union for World Federal Government in Japan. . . . Where Baruch goes the camera follows. The September 10, 1950, issue of the Sunday picture magazine, "Parade," presents him—peering over his spectacles—as America's Family Doctor, prescribing for the Korean crisis the same bitter remedy he has prescribed in two world wars, as well as year in and year out between wars: Total mobilisation. "Look" magazine of September 26 pre-

sents him in the same pose, elaborating on the grim provisions of that total, straight-jacketing, throttling regimentation.

The current September number of "Flair" sketches him—and epitomises him under the heading, 80 Years of Bernard Baruch—as Uncle Sam.

Press Agent Blasphemy

This goes far, and it neatly caps the June 30, 1947 declaration of "Life" magazine that "Baruch Sweeps the Field. . . . The season's sweepstakes winner in degrees, citations and awards is Bernard Baruch." But it remains for Baruch himself to go a long step farther and delicately suggest the attributes of Deity. "Time," August 9 1948:

"Bernard Baruch, who had acquired hardly any new honors in recent weeks informed a Manhattan society columnist of something rather flattering that Mary Churchill, Winston's youngest, had told him recently: When she was little, she had wondered what God looked like; then she had met Baruch."

If present-day Uncle Sam is indeed a composite pugilistic sport, ladies' man, Wall Street gambler, war profiteer, unofficial dictator and supreme arbiter of our destinies, with the face of Shylock, it is time to pause and analyse the condition in which we find ourselves at this stage of the Baruchian era. Following the first world war the Elder Statesman admitted to a joint congressional committee that, as chairman of the War Industries Board, "I probably had more power than perhaps any other man in the war." That he was quite as powerful in dictating the terms of the peace at Versailles, as an American member of the Supreme Economic Council and the Reparations Commission, may be taken for granted.

The long stride of Baruch from Wilson to Truman is matched by the stride of Communism, the growth of a towering national debt and a burdensome bureaucracy, the steady advance of spies and traitors and sex perverts to key positions

of government, the unrelenting assault upon our Christian Constitution, and the reckless dissipation of our troops, arms, money, and national resources in disastrous global forays. Truly, we stand at last on the brink of world government and world chaos.

Supported Red Revolutions in Spain

"Time" magazine of January 2, 1939, alludes to the support given by Baruch to the red revolutionists who looted and burned the churches of Spain and used statues of Christ for target practice.

OUR POLICY

1. The preservation of Australia's sovereignty as a part of the British Empire, and the exposure of all internal and external groups which attack that sovereignty.

Professor Lattimore

The notorious Professor Lattimore, American "adviser" on Far Eastern affairs, and charged by Senator McCarthy and other Americans as being a secret Communist, continues to "run true to form." In the Australian press of March 28 he is quoted as saying that China is "lost to the West," and that nothing can be done to loosen the Communist grip. Lattimore referred to Chiang Kai-shek's Nationalist Government as "a thing of the past," with no hope of reinstatement. This intellectual says he is not a Communist. He merely campaigns persistently to try and prove that Communism is "inevitable." Well, if Communism is inevitable, there is little use combating it. No wonder the Lattimores are far more dangerous to Western civilisation than the declared Communists.

Americans Revolting?

The American planners are getting worried about the reactions of the American people to their totalitarian proposals. "The threat of war" technique does not appear to be working out so successfully. General Marshall, who played a vital role in handing China to the Communists, has expressed his concern that the American Congress is also refusing to be stampeded. "If a country which is in for as many as 10 years of tension, relaxes in a couple of months, what can we expect of the future?" he asks. What a frightening admission. The Western world is to go on for 10 or more years regimenting itself because of the tension initiated by the Communists. If this is the defeatist policy of the Western "leaders," the Communists must eventually win. Communism abroad cannot be defeated by adopting Communist policies at home. Apparently an increasing number of the American people are realising this important fact.

"Democracy"!

The Chief of the General Staff, Lieut. - General Rowell recently stated that a simple educational test eliminated 15 per cent, of Army applicants. Compulsory, secret voting ensures that this 15 percent, along with a great number of morons in the community, cast votes which political power-lusters claim gives them the right to do as they like for several years.

back from Spain last week, a small crowd did the lionising, and the song was again the Star Spangled Banner. They were fighters in a war in which the United States is neutral, veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade, organised in January of 1937 to fight for Loyalist Spain. The brigade mustered altogether 4000 U.S. citizens. Last September the Spanish Leftist Government disbanded it..... Typical of the brigade's personnel was the roll of last week's home-comers. Among them: 25-year-old Brigade Commissar (political instructor) John Gates from Youngstown, Ohio, and Sergeant Gerald Cook, office boy for the pinko, 'Nation.' . . . As the most active defender of Loyalist Spain in the U.S., the Communist Party had a big hand in recruiting the brigade, slipping its rookies into Spain and naming the outfit (for Abraham Lincoln is now a Communist hero by adoption). But many other men of any or no political faith, who saw in Spain a battle for democracy, also backed it. And one who put up 10,000 dollars to repatriate the Lincoln brigaders was Financier Bernard Mannes Baruch." The sequel to the repatriation of Baruch's protégé, John Gates, is Gates' conviction, as one of the eleven American Communist leaders, of conspiracy to overthrow the government; yet the Elder Statesman's judgment and motives in his long career of international meddling in the cause of "democracy" must never be questioned.

For peace or war, for good or ill, Baruch was — on the authority of Drew Pearson's column of December 10, 1945—a "secret emissary to the Japs" before Pearl Harbor. One of Baruch's contacts, said Pearson, was through Raoul Eugene Desvernine, an organiser of the Liberty League, who was in touch with Kazuo Nishi, New York manager of the Yokohama Specie Company, controlled by the Japanese government, and

had been angling to sell cotton to the Japanese. The F.B.I. started a probe of Desvernine, "It was at that time," Pearson stated, "that Bernie Baruch intervened on behalf of Desvernine and said he had been helping him. The Justice Department's investigation of Desvernine was then dropped."

O'Konski Speaks Out

On May 3 1945, Hon. Alvin E. O'Konski, of Wisconsin, said in the House of Representatives: —

"American human lives to international do-gooders are merely a means of profit and doing business. The more wars the more business. The international do-gooders build enemies so that we can destroy them and build them up again. This way they get business from both sides. And the international do-gooders love business. They love business more than they do the lives of our own boys who must die to make more business for them — Baruch, Mellon, Du Pont, Morgan, Rockefeller, and Morgenthau. Hang on to whatever you are holding when you read this, because it sounds as fantastic as it is real . . ."

The Anti-British Conspiracy V

Before a group of people can take effective action to protect themselves against outside enemies, it is necessary that it should have, not only accurate information about what is happening round about them, but it should have that information in plenty of time to prepare for action.

The massive military instruments used in modern warfare take years to prepare and perfect, and a nation, which steals a march on another in warlike preparations, has a tremendous advantage. The Rothschilds owed a great deal of their power to the fact that they were able to get exact information earlier than their competitors.

In the modern world, information of external events is available to the ordinary man only at second-hand. The origin of that second-hand information is mostly unknown; also it is almost entirely conveyed to the public through the press and the radio. This, of course, would not be very serious if there were a variety of independent sources of information available to the public; but whatever sources are available for overseas news services, one thing we can be certain of is, that some organisation, somewhere, exercises not only a general over-riding control of all cables reaching British countries, but exercises this control in a most meticulous manner—and there is not the slightest doubt as to the policy under which this control is exercised.

For the last fifty years, to go back no further, the British public have not been prepared for the critical events which have cost them so much in life, in treasure and in prestige. Always they have been met with a *fait accompli*, and have had to fight their way out of disastrous situations with hastily improvised weapons and at a colossal cost.

This, of course, is a very serious indictment of various British Governments and, of the British Press, and it shows that alien control of the British Empire has extended more deeply than most people realised.

One brings to mind the ridiculous and deceptive official picture of the French army, circulated in Great Britain before the war of 1914-18—the *élan* of the French troops, the superiority of French officers and the wonderful equipment of the French army. There was not a shadow of truth in this fantastic picture, and accordingly the little British army which was sent over to France was trapped and had to fight with practically nothing but rifles and bayonets against the massed ranks of German artillery. And after this little army was shot to ribbons, the cream of British youth was poured into the blood-bath of Flanders to be mowed down in their hundreds of thousands.

Before World War II Germany was re-armed with the aid of foreign money, which evidently was unavailable to re-arm the British army; and again vital information was denied the public. Douglas Reed, who was foreign correspondent to *The Times* of London and who spent most of his life in Central Europe, testified that his despatches warning the British public of what was in store for them were consistently suppressed. And again before World War II, there were the same deceptive stories

about the condition of France with its "famous" Maginot Line.

In an over-industrialised and over-commercialised country like Great Britain, whose very existence depends on finance—on the understanding and manipulation of it—it is an appalling thought that one man in May 1920 was permitted to shut down almost the entire industry of the country, and, in the course of three years, bankrupt a host of firms of unimpeachable reputation, and throw three million unemployed on the street. That is what Montagu Norman, the American trained (tamed) Governor of the Bank of England, did when he drastically reduced credits to British industry and doubled the interest rate, and so put money beyond the reach of competitive industry.

The appalling ignorance of the British people on the question of money—its creation and cancellation—together with the complete blackout by the press and the British Government on those who were willing and capable to give some guidance, is something on which many books could be written.

It has been stated that the control of finance and of news is concentric, and there is no doubt that both have been used for a very long time for the elimination of Great Britain as a world power. And it is mainly through the control of finance from New York that Great Britain was "defeated" in the last two wars.

Until people know exactly what is happening and know in sufficient time to take protective action then, and only then, will they be able to protect themselves from their enemies. British people even now are not permitted to know what is happening, they haven't the remotest idea what is happening in China—how then can they take effective action?

"Consider the amazing fact that not only did the Maginot Line terminate in the air, but the hastily fortified line from its termination to the sea was held by the worst quality troops, with the worst officers, in the French army."* Again the British army was trapped, and again it escaped by a miracle.

It is ridiculous to suggest that the General Staff, the diplomatic service, foreign correspondents and others in Great Britain did not know what warlike preparations were in hand in Germany before World Wars I and II; it is also ridiculous to suggest that the Royal Kaiser in the war and the plebeian house painter in the second war were other than useful tools for the real designers of these two wars.

If the virtual disarmament of the British Empire, the only military power capable of effective resistance, was an essential to the prosecution of World Wars I and II, then we have to find some reason why British Governments were so willing to play into the hands of those who were going to make war on them. We have either to admit that the titular and elected

governments in Great Britain were merely dummies, screening a hidden and alien government, or were operating under overwhelming pressure from some hostile power.

That both these statements are correct becomes a certainty when we examine the financial operations, which, more than anything else, helped to cripple the power and prestige of Great Britain.

We see this outside pressure operating clearly during the 'depressions' of the early '20's and '30's, and we see it again in the financial penalties imposed on Great Britain after the two World Wars.

Tweedledum and Tweedledee

Even the most casual survey of the policy speeches of the Party leaders reveals no substantial disagreement on fundamental policies. Neither Labor nor anti-Labor promises to start decentralising power. Both advocate various measures for centralising power still further. It is true that Mr. Menzies does not appear quite as confident as Mr. Chifley in advocating more centralised controls. Perhaps he is worried that some electors might recall what he and his colleagues said prior to the 1949 Federal elections! Nevertheless, the policy announced by Mr. Menzies for helping to defeat inflation — selective credit control, restriction of credit, a capital issues board, a National Resources Planning Board, etc. — is basically totalitarian in conception.

Both Mr. Menzies and Mr. Chifley have stressed the importance of increased production in order to defeat inflation. Neither has been, very convincing in suggestions as to how the individual is, under a policy of controls, including high taxation, going to be stimulated to increase production. Mr. Chifley says that the Trade Unions will co-operate with a Labor Government, while Mr. Menzies says that once the Communists have been dealt with, production will be bettered. We agree that increased production of goods and services demanded by individuals is an excellent thing, and we also believe that increased and more efficient production may temporarily slow down the increase in prices. But we say that any political leader who claims that increased production by itself will reduce prices, is either ignorant or is deliberately misleading the people. Is Mr. Menzies not aware of how rapidly prices have been increasing in the U.S.A.?

Australian electors must face the fact that none of the parties have put forward any genuine solution to the problem of how to defeat the twin evils of inflation and Communism. They refuse to accept a real solution, because it necessarily conflicts with their inherent will-to-power. There can be no solution until a Government is compelled to reduce very drastically the burden of Government, and, instead of spending the people's money on inflationary Socialist activities, applies it to a scientific price subsidy system, which would stabilise the economy. Clumsy and unscientific as they were, Price Subsidies during and after the war years helped to stabilise the price structure. It wasn't centralised price fixing, which was so vital, as Mr. Chifley now attempts to make out. New credit had to be created for the war, and Price Subsidies demonstrated beyond all argument that portion of these new credits could be passed directly to the individual without increasing costs and thus increasing prices. We urge as many electors as possible to take this matter up with candidates before the elections, making it clear that the candidates' written assurances will decide voting preferences. We believe that many individual candidates are at present very susceptible to pressure on this vital issue.

The Origin and Objectives of Communism and Socialism

Communism and Socialism are so much in the limelight just now that a clear understanding of their origin and objectives seems most essential.

Eric Butler's Campaign For Principles

In opening his election campaign at a public meeting in Greensborough on Wednesday, April 4, the Independent Candidate for Deakin, Mr. Eric Butler, said that his major objective was to try and rally electors in support of the basic principle that all Governments were monopolistic in their practices, and that constitutional safeguards alone protected the individual against complete tyranny.

Mr. Butler said that a study of the policies of all the parties revealed that they were in substantial agreement that they must have more powers at the expense of local governments and the individual.

Manipulating the politicians were the permanent economic advisers, all totalitarians, who knew that they and their growing army of bureaucratic officials always used the power centralised by the politicians. The Australian people were doomed to serfdom, irrespective of the label used to describe it, unless they could stir themselves to strike back against the enemies of their rights and independence. The parties all said that they are concerned about the twin evils of Inflation and Communism, but like the alcoholic who will do everything to cure himself except give up drink, they refuse to disgorge the centralised power, which stimulates inflation and encourages the Communist conspirators.

In a fighting address, Mr. Butler showed in detail how all Canberra Governments have been striving to destroy or by-pass

the Federal Constitution. He said that, in their own self-defence, electors must unite to protect existing Constitutional safeguards and to demand the erection of further safeguards in the form of a new Bill of Rights. He believed that it was essential that electors have more effective control of their Parliamentary representatives, and he was attempting to set an example in this direction by pledging that, if elected, he would resign and re-contest his seat if 20 percent, of his electors petitioned him to do so.

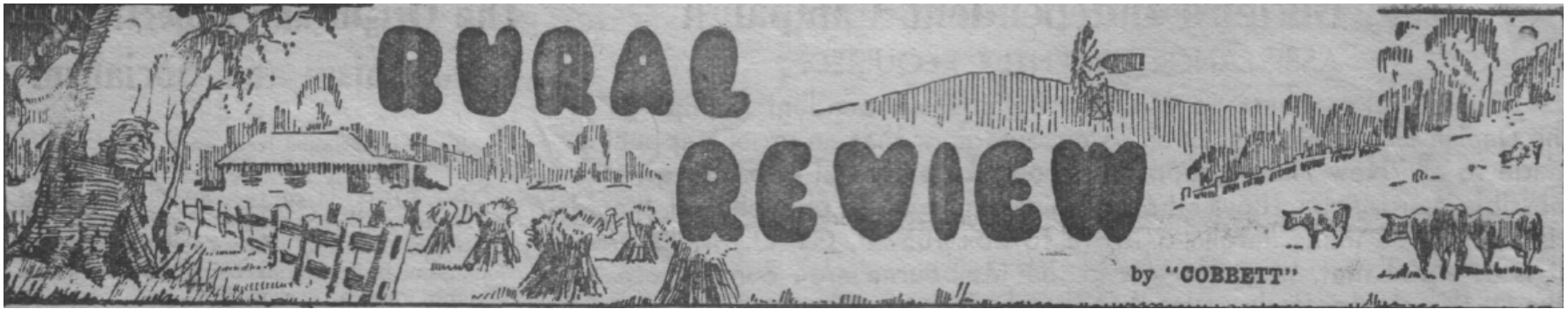

Heavy Carrying Capacity of Tasmanian Organic Farm

The following article in the Melbourne "Leader" of April 4 is an interesting survey of organic farming methods being followed by well-known sheep man, Mr. John Foster. (Mr. Foster is a keen supporter of "The New Times"):

When visiting "Pleasant Banks," Evandale, Tasmania, where some of the best and heaviest cutting fine to superfine Merino sheep are bred and reared, I was surprised by the extraordinarily heavy carrying capacity of this old established property.

The unique methods adopted to bring about this result were most impressive.

Mr. John Foster, the present owner, lives in the fascinating homestead, which was built in the early 'eighties. He is always improving the deeply rooted pastures and lush growth of phalaris, lucerne, grasses, and doing his best to keep them in the most succulent condition, whatever the season.

His avowed main object is to produce the best fine-wooled Merino sheep in the world. To do this, he claims that it is necessary to cut out all the "get-rich-quick" schemes brought into farming in recent years, and to work closely along Nature's own lines.

The first requirement is healthy pasture. To ensure this, a variety of stock is essential. Sheep, Ayrshire dairy cows, Polled Herefords, Arab ponies, turkeys, ducks, and fowls, all find a place in the economy of "Pleasant Banks," each having access to a planned change of pastures and fresh clean water supply. A 10-inch pump is used to irrigate the paddocks.

Mr. Foster says that anyone can produce "good" stock, but that little extra to make and maintain it as "the best" takes every effort you can put into it.

One of his most successful methods is the fowl-grazing project. The first and foremost use of the fowls is to manure and scratch, thus lightly cultivating and aerating the pastures. This fits in neatly with the rotational-grazing plan.

The fowls scratch up and distribute the animal droppings. They add their own valuable contribution as well to the improvement of the soil.

Portable fowl sheds, mounted on skids are placed so that there is a fowl run of 200 yards to a trough or waterhole. They are shifted weekly to new positions in the paddock.

These sheds are made to hold 150 to 180 hens. They are 15 feet long by 8 ft. 6 inches wide. The floors are made of sheep grating, with nests along the sides. Timbers required are 9 in. x 3 in. for runners,

3 in. x 2 in. for struts, and 9 in. x ¾ in. boards for roofs. To keep down lice and other vermin, each shed is sprayed with creosote and sump oil every two months.

The feeders hold one ton of feed. When opened, the boards on the sides allow the fowls to feed, but sheep and cattle are unable to get at the grain or mash.

Labour is a small and light item. At 7.30 a.m. daily a girl opens the nests, at 11 a.m. she gathers the eggs, and two hours before sunset she opens the feeders and gathers more eggs. At sunset, the feeders are shut and the fowls locked up for the night, to protect them from foxes and dogs.

The fowls feed all day in the paddocks, and soon get to like their home in the portable shed. Thinking that one batch of 400 grown fowls, purchased at a clearing sale, would not take kindly to their new surroundings, Mr. Foster erected a temporary wire-netting yard for them, but they very soon availed themselves of the covers of the sheds against the cold of the nights.

The fowls always make their way back to the sheds and feeders before sunset, to get some grain before going to roost. Most of the portable fowl sheds are of the inverted V type, while others are U-shaped. The fowl project is so successful that it is being enlarged, and Mr. Foster hopes to raise 500 chicks every month, with the exception of December and January. He will market the cockerels as soon as they are ready to sell, and will run about 2000 laying fowls.

Mr. Foster is also installing a freezing plant and a plucking machine, to make his fowl project a complete unit.

While the hens are making money in their own way, they are providing a splendid stimulant to the paddocks in which they run, to the great advantage of the "Pleasant Banks" Merino stud.

This is one of the oldest pure-bred Saxony Merino flocks in the southern hemisphere, with a long list of championship awards gained in mainland and leading Tasmanian sheep shows.

The sheep bred and reared on "Pleasant Banks" are considered by many to be the best-underlined and truest-bellied sheep now bred. Their heavy cutting fleeces, of beautiful colour, and well-marked, well-defined character, have made the name of "Pleasant Banks" a "hall mark" in the sheep world.

Great credit must be given to the breeder

and his stud master for maintaining such a high standard.

That this 1375-acre property has developed the amazing carrying capacity of eight to ten sheep to the acre, along with other and varied stock, shows that Mr. Foster's own scheme of "organic farming" has much which could be adopted with advantage by other graziers and farmers.

The Master Mind of World

Mr. O'Konski gave an itemised list of our gifts — running into the thousands and hundreds of thousands — to Soviet Russia: airplanes, motor vehicles, tanks, self-propelled guns, submarine guns, other big guns, locomotives and cars — all America's best; and billions in money through Lend-Lease, U.N.R.R.A., Bretton Woods Agreement, Commodity Credit, and Export-Import Bank.

"HOLDS BIG STICK," headlines an A.P. dispatch from London on April 5, 1945: —

"... Baruch's interview was given to A. Victor Lasky, Stars and Stripes staff writer. As originally prepared for publication it quotes Baruch as saying: 'And one reason I am over here is to hold the big stick over the big boys to make damn sure they're not going to foul up the peace.'... Lasky said that, during the interview, in Baruch's suite in the Claridge, the telephone rang, and Baruch's secretary told him the Prime Minister was calling. Baruch, Lasky said, gave Churchill a mild brush-off to continue his talks with the soldier reporter. 'Hello, Winston, this is Bernie,' Baruch said into the phone, according to Lasky. 'Look, Winston, I'm busy this afternoon. I'll drop over later.'"

Winston and Bernie (Churchill and Baruch)

And, while Winston danced attendance on Bernie, the press carried a threatening echo from an underground radio station in Germany: "WERE - WOLVES BAY AT BARUCH.... 'If Jew Baruch comes to Germany we'll hunt him down as an insult to the German land,' the radio's spokesman shouted. 'He instigated the First World War and now is continuing his crimes. One day were-wolf will get him.'"

Eluding the wolf pack and by-passing the battle front, Baruch returned to swing the big stick over Congress and in the lines: "DESTROY NAZI INDUSTRY," BARUCH URGES SENATE" (June, 1945). Is it the flourish of the big stick that causes the press to lapse into its customary servility after an occasional spirited protest? "An infamous and vicious proposal — treasonable in effect," the San Francisco "Examiner" of June 21, 1946, editorially labelled Baruch's proposal to give all American atomic bomb secrets to an international authority and junk our existing stores of bombs. And a few days later the words of Senator Homer Capehart, of Indiana, were quoted: "By what claim to diplomatic or scientific knowledge, and by what warrant from the people or Congress, does private citizen Bernard Baruch attempt to decide an issue so critical that it may mean our national life or death?"

"A FOOL'S COURSE," ran an "Examiner" editorial, "—Secretary of War Patterson, in urging the American people to give unstinted support to the Baruch proposal for international control of atomic energy, has urged a FOOL'S COURSE upon his country—and he is either blind to all the facts of the matter or is deliberately ignoring the facts."

The fool's course into which we have been beguiled in the Baruchian era has led us far from the Christian principles of the Founding Fathers. Self-respect, loyalty,

truthfulness, honesty in government and in foreign policy, have all gone into the discard. The very words have been twisted out of their true meaning, and others—tolerance, democracy, discrimination and the like—are used in a way that is not intended to be understood by the rank and file of Americans.

The Fruits of Treachery

We have lost our way, and have contracted a strange malady from the poisonous miasma that emanates from the cesspool known as the Babylonian Talmud, a "rule of life" that sanctions every sin and crime named in the decalog. Small wonder that we find a diabolical programme of atom bomb treachery far advanced by nimble leg men named Gold, Fuchs, Oppenheimer, Lilienthal, Weinbaum, Greenglass, Sobell, Weinberg and Rosenberg, under the secret government of Lehman, Morgenthau, Frankfurter and Bernard Baruch.

We must think our way back to a time when the atmosphere was clearer, and heed the counsel of one who speaks our language; one who, looking to God for guidance, had no need to "hold the big stick over the big boys to make 'damn' sure they are not going to foul up the peace."

A Warning from Abraham Lincoln

From Abraham Lincoln, whose prophetic instinct, it is said, forecast the time and manner of his death, comes a solemn warning of danger to the life of the Republic: —

"It may be asked, 'Why suppose danger to our political institutions? Have we not preserved them for more than fifty years? And why may we not for fifty times as long?' We hope there is no sufficient reason. We hope all danger may be overcome; but to conclude that no danger may ever arise would itself be extremely dangerous. That our government should have been maintained in its original form, from its establishment until now is not much to be wondered at. It had many props to support it through that period, which are decayed and crumbled away. Through that period it was felt by all to be an undecided experiment; now it is understood to be a successful one. Then, all that sought celebrity and fame and distinction expected to find them in the success of that experiment. Their all was staked upon it; their destiny was inseparably linked with it. The experiment is successful, and thousands have won their deathless names in making it so.

"But the game is caught; and I believe it is true that, with the catching, end the pleasures of the chase . . . Towering genius disdains a beaten path. It seeks regions hitherto unexplored. It sees no distinction in adding story to story upon the monuments of fame erected to the memory of others. It scorns to tread in the footsteps of predecessors, however illustrious. It thirsts and burns for distinction; and, if possible, it will have it, whether at the expense of emancipating slaves or of enslaving free men. Is it unreasonable, then, to expect that some man possessed of the loftiest genius, will at some time spring up among us? And when such a one does, it will require the people to be united with each other, attached to the government and laws, and generally

intelligent, to successfully frustrate his designs. Distinction will be his paramount object, and, although he would as willingly, perhaps more so, acquire it by doing good as harm, yet, that opportunity being past, and nothing left to be done in the way of building up, he would set boldly to the task of pulling down."

The Wrecking Crew Carries On

The wrecking crew is boldly at work. United World Federalism is gaining momentum. The demands of Bernard Baruch become more frequent and insistent. The Stars and Stripes are stealthily lowered, while the U.N. flag of Palestinian blue and white goes up in elaborate ceremonies throughout the nation, for only on the ruins of Christian Constitutional government can a Jewish slave state be erected.

The hour is late, and never since the days of the Great Emancipator has Christian Nationalism faced such a challenge and so urgent a call to the colours in the service of the Republic.

Nemesis

In one English dictionary, Nemesis is defined as "... the distributor of punishments most severe to ... the proud on whom fortune had lavishly bestowed her favours." Does not this suggest that some Grecian ideas about trespassers may have had some affinity with those of Jesus?

And what about today? Would it not be feasible to bring indictments against very many exalted office-bearers in commercial, political and cultural institutions because their ways are corrupt, i.e., divorced from Reality? Also where in the whole crop of fruit of community life, as such, do we find samples that are not Dead Sea fruit, or tainted in some way, when tested by criteria of quality and value in the deeper Christian sense?

Everyone, therefore, who tries to discriminate, and to understand the strength and depth of the forthright challenge which Jesus launched against the political and religious leaders of His day, should he not want similarly to challenge the ignorant and the foolish upholders of the faulty conventions of theology, of finance, and of Party intrigue of today? Should he not want to challenge the all-pervading trends towards centralised power?

If, as seems evident, Nemesis is on our tracks, cannot we bring it home to some of those to whom fortune still metes out a sheltered life due to material favors or an assured position, that it will be merely a matter of time before they also will feel the effects of vials of wrath as distributed by Nemesis?

The Laws of God are being blatantly flouted, and the unctuous recession into the realm, of personal regeneration, of excellence of sentiment or moral intention, is no cure. Such recession may even advance the

prospects of the few of Satanic purpose as they plan to keep the rest of the world under their thumb.

A word or two may be apropos regarding the word 'discriminate' as used above. Our Four Gospels were compiled, it seems, many decades after the death of Jesus, by editors whose chief object was to boost polemical outlines of belief then in vogue, rather than to be too finicky about historical exactitude.

Many attempts are being made to guess what the historical Jesus would mean to us, if He were available to us. One intriguing effort is contained in "Soliloquies of a Hermit," by T. F. Powys. One quotation may give a hint of this writer's conception (p. 115-6): "We cannot conceive the lightning rapidity in which the vision of true life enters in and passes out of our minds . . . Jesus held the new idea for a moment, and that moment gave Him time to understand, because He was the one ready to understand." . . . "What Jesus saw and lived we may see and live, only we prefer the immortality of our earth to the new heaven of Jesus." (p. 118.) "He longed that the vision that will free man from his immortality may come to all and be received by all."

Somehow or other, we must get the new vision, or else the flail of Nemesis will flay us.
