The Korean Scandal

By Eric D. Butler

In a recent statement concerning General MacArthur's proposed policies in the Far East, President Truman said that the Korean War had been a major anti-Communist victory. President Truman is, of course, merely the public relations officer for Mr. Dean Acheson and his backers. Although Mr. Acheson was a close personal friend of Communist espionage agent, Alger Hiss, and has consistently supported policies favourable to Communist strategy, it does not follow that he is, as some American anti-Communist authorities state, a secret Communist. But he is a most dangerous individual, and American patriots have sound reasons for their demands that he be removed from his present influential position as American Secretary of State.

Mr. Acheson's contention that Communism has suffered a major setback in Korea should not be permitted to go unchallenged because it is one, which has been widely repeated in Australia. Irrespective of what local Communists may have to say about Korea, surely Stalin and his associates must be well pleased with what has transpired. It is claimed that the action taken by the Western Powers in Korea has demonstrated to Stalin that aggression does not pay. But surely a realistic survey of the facts proves that Korea, so far from stemming the Communist challenge, has done exactly the opposite.

After nearly twelve month's of fighting, during which American casualties in particular have been very heavy, the "United" Nations forces have been hard-pushed to keep the North Korean and Chinese Communist forces north of the 38th parallel. Whatever may be said about many of General MacArthur's proposed policies, there has as yet, been no effective answer to his charge that, although Supreme Commander in Korea, he had no definite knowledge of the positive objectives of the campaign he was waging. He rightly claimed, that in the absence of a statement of such policies, the war in Korea was a useless blood bath. As Stalin is not losing any Russian soldiers in the Korean fighting, he can afford to watch with the greatest pleasure while valuable American, British and Australian lives are lost for an undefined policy. The longer the fighting continues, and there appears to be little doubt the Chinese Communists are prepared to continue indefinitely, the better the Communist leaders will be pleased.

As a military leader, General MacArthur protested against fighting a war in which his major enemies, the Chinese Communists, were able to operate from bases, which were immune from attack. It may be true, as President Truman and his promoters claim, that General MacArthur's proposed policy of an all-out attack upon the Chinese

Communists everywhere would extend the war in the Far East indefinitely. But obviously the only alternative put forward is to continue indefinitely the Korean disaster. This is not a genuine alternative at all, and leaves the Communist leaders in control of the initiative. It becomes clearer every day, and members of the American Republican Party are at last facing this fact, that every effort should be made to get "United" Nations forces out of Korea as soon as possible.

No doubt many will react to this policy by saying that it is surrendering to the Communists. But by continuing in Korea the West does just what the Communists desire. It cannot be repeated too often that the real Communist menace is not that the

controllers of Soviet Russia are contemplating an immediate major military offensive but that the threat of an offensive is being used by unconscious dupes of Communists and Socialists to drive the peoples of the Western World along the totalitarian road. TO THE POINT

Communist Challenge in Far East

Two weeks ago in "On the Record" we reported a conference of Chinese Communist leaders to discuss intervention in Indo-China. Later reports confirm that something formidable is being planned. Our own opinion is that if war in Asia develops, the first critical moves will be made within three months. The first pressure will be exerted through Indo-China, with a view to affecting Siam, thus dividing Burma and Malaya. We see this as a grave threat.

Very great care has been taken by the Chinese to conceal traces which might suggest active collaboration with the Vietminh forces, but the French High Command suspect that rebel forces are being armed by the Chinese without payment; that a Chinese military mission has been attached to the headquarters of Dr. Ho Chi-minh; that roads and communications in the Chinese provinces of Kwangtung, Yunnan and Kwangsi are being repaired with Vietminh labour. It is further believed that airfields in Southern China have been modernised, and that the garrison of Tunghing, on the Indo-Chinese border, has been replaced by a Vietminh force.

Checking back on our reports we find that since June of last year there has been a persistent strengthening of the forces poised outside Indo-China. The mixed fortunes of the French forces in that time have been reported in the Press. But we have looked in vain for any suggestion that plans were being worked out during 1950 for a super-Korea, which would face the western nations with a major challenge to full-scale war in that sphere of Asia.

We are firmly of the opinion that such forces have now been deployed and that their use will depend upon the overall strategy of militant Communism; that will be decided, of course, by Moscow and not Peking.

disintegration" is a certainty. While present financial rules are persisted with, and centralised planning in all spheres is expanded, rearmament can only intensify inflation. Inflation is the greatest ally the Communists have. They know that "the threat of war", maintained over a number of years, will, on present indications, destroy the West from within. Until this central feature of Communist strategy understood, the West can only go from one disaster to another, as they have so obviously done in Korea. What is urgently required is a direct challenge to the Communist strategy. This requires an immediate repudiation of most of the political, economic and financial policies now being pursued by the Western Powers and clear statement of the objectives of these Powers.

Leftist Movements, IV

Ideally, it is easy to see what the unique function of government should be: namely, that of a trustee of the constitution and of the credit of the country. The process of building a country, its farms, its countryside, its culture and its prestige, is the work of many generations; it is not in the nature of things that all this work should be entirely wrong, and neither is it safe nor reasonable that a successful process should be suddenly reversed.

The organic growth of a community is a complex process not readily appreciated by young men in a hurry, and a constitutional brake is required to prevent the too precipitate repudiation of all past experience. Changes there have been, and changes there will be, but, as Douglas has pointed out, new laws are only necessary to take charge of some fundamental new invention. The fundamental new invention of modern times was the application of solar energy to the machinery of production. This was revolutionary, and although the invention displaced the hand and muscle of man and increased enormously the value of the capital structure of the country, there has been no equivalent revolutionary financial change to reflect the revolutionary mechanical change in modern industry.

Strangely enough, the fiercest opposition to this revolutionary change came from every department of the Leftist movement—from the Higher Command down to the Communist trade union official. Here we found a conservatism of a very determined type, a conservatism which ignored the realities of the industrial era, and which was largely instrumental for the chaos, frustration and uncertainty of these modern times.

Whatever reform we discuss, if it is to be of any permanent value it will have to be automatic in character and operating according to well known and recognisable principles, and largely independent of the good graces of the government in power. Naturally, before it becomes law it will have to obtain the sanction of something more substantial than a political monopoly obtained by fraud.

One of the most essential instruments of civilised life and of ordered planning for the future is a stable currency; more especially a currency, which is not depreciating in value. Modern man scarcely realises what a unique instrument of exchange money is. It is a labour saving device par excellence, and, combined with a free market, is one of our greatest instruments of freedom.

Before the days of planned scarcity men could enter most towns, demand services too many and varied even to indicate, and receive them in exchange for a coin or note. The amount of service one gets, and its quality and variety, depends on competition; where there is no competition the consumer is always wrong, and quite helpless. No amount of law making can possibly protect the customers once competition is removed. Competition is one of those automatic regulators and protective devices of which the socialist is so very contemptuous.

The socialist alternative to competition is a vast bureaucracy who "fix" prices for every article, and who attempt to police with heavy penalties; rationing where possible the scarce commodities. Rationing is obviously necessary where there is a short

supply; what is not so obvious is that a short supply is necessary to produce rationing, and that a rationing system is necessary to maintain a socialist bureaucracy. That is why the food supply to England has been deliberately restricted.

In a socialist state, where there is chronically a shortage of consumer goods, money loses its uniquely selective value; choice is strictly limited. Conversely, in a competitive society where the amount of money in circulation is artificially restricted by those in control of the financial system, money can buy anything; but there, unfortunately, many people have not enough to buy even the necessities of life.

We claim that the shortage of consumer goods is unnatural and as unnecessary as a shortage of money, and that both can be prevented. Here then is one of the keys to a stable community—a sound currency, here, if anywhere, is a unique opportunity for reform; here is the place where a minimum of effort would produce a maximum result in the welfare and happiness of a people; here is one of those automatic devices which ensure the minimum of interference with private lives.

No one can demand anything more of a currency than it reflects realities. If our industrial plant has improved in a ratio consistent with the time, labour and money which has been expended on it; if it has improved in any way consistent with the improvement in the industrial arts and with the multiplication of power expended, then we are entitled to see some reflection of this improvement in the availability of the ordinary needs of life.

In other words, the purchasing power of the £ should increase in value from year to year, not only buying more goods with less effort, but buying a greater variety of higher quality goods, and at the same time eliminating our accumulated debts, governmental, semi-governmental and private, and thus reducing our taxes. But not only has nothing like this happened; there is no sign that anything like this is likely to happen in the near future.

Not only have ordinary goods become scarcer and dearer; the capital cost of improvements, built year by year by the people, has been charged up as a cumulative debt to the people. The debt system, along with the taxation and rationing systems, are the inevitable results of our present governmental monopolies, and they are designed as a penal system—not as a system for paying dividends.

A community is entitled to know that the agents who are responsible for its financial arrangements are honest; they are entitled to know that the money put into circulation in the form of wages, salaries and dividends, is real money; i.e., reflecting realities, i.e., capable of liquidating the collective prices charged to them in the production of goods and services. If, in the pro-

duction of goods and services, every community finds itself getting, each year, further into debt, then doesn't this state of affairs demand some kind of investigation; isn't it time we had a balance sheet to tell us where hundreds of millions of pounds of human effort has disappeared to.

Isn't it rather strange that nearly every "economist" in this country is a socialist, and that they are not at all interested in the nature of the capital costs of this country, nor in how they were financed; may it not be that the socialist "economist" has a vested interest in preventing the introduction of a self regulating mechanism which would do away with the need for "socialist planning"?

There are only really two political financial systems available: the profit system where people profit by their labour, and the penal system where people do not profit by their labour. The first system can only operate where there are automatic controls dependent on the decisions of large numbers of independent people; i.e., an economic democracy independent of monopolies governmental or semi-governmental. The second system is the "planned economy" where the products of one's labour are seized or diverted by the government for purposes over which the individual has no control; and this system is achieved by such means as "Full (official) Employment", "vindictive taxation", fraudulent currency, and conscription of industry by means of war or threat of war.

Each part of the Leftist Movement has played its appointed task in the introduction of the present penal system—the socialist writers in undermining the credit of the British people; the Fabian Society in infiltrating the opposing political parties the socialist "economists" in arresting the long overdue inquiry into the financial system; and now the Communists in obscuring the facts of technological development by economic sabotage.

The most interesting individual vote of the Federal election was that of Canberra. The seat only carries a vote on local matters, but the fact that it has gone Labor and gone Labor pretty solidly, has the Government far from happy.

Reason is that a great majority of Canberra residents are Public Servants. The vote therefore means that the P.S. is again the Government, and at the same time in a position to make their anti-Government feelings an excuse for gumming up the works of public administration.

Cabinet Members, who know just how unco-operative Public Servants can slow up the works of a Department, are wondering just how many of their top advisers have voted Labor.

In the Liberal Party, where there has long been a feeling that the Government should have stood up to the Public Service in general, and the top-bureaucrats in particular, instead of taking them over as a going concern from Chifley, there will be a growing demand for a tougher Government attitude.

Fooling the Electorate

In recent times electors, for a number of reasons, have given up going to election meetings. They appear to rely increasingly upon what the Party leaders say, and not what their local candidates say. Centralised control of information ensures that the electors are told only what the centralisers desire. It therefore becomes progressively harder for the individual candidate to obtain electoral support on his own merits. This situation, together with the operation of the secret, anonymous, and irresponsible vote, provides an ideal condition for the furtherance of totalitarian polices.

Although we have dealt with this matter in the past, it is essential that we continue to restate that there appears to be little hope for Western Civilization while present voting practices continue. At present those who, by centralised control of the major instruments of information, can influence electors to vote themselves into serfdom, without having to accept any personal responsibility whatever for what is being done, are wielding dangerous powers.

During the recent Federal Election we made it clear that we thought that, considering all factors, the return of the Menzies Government with a reduced majority was the lesser of the two evils confronting the electors. We cannot therefore be charged with bias when we draw attention to one method by which the irresponsible electorate is subjected to skilful influence: The Melbourne "Herald" and its associated papers throughout Australia campaigned strongly for the Menzies Government. The Gallup Poll organisation is closely associated with the Melbourne "Herald". In two predictions before the elections, the conductors of the Gallup Poll claimed that there was increased electoral support for the Menzies Government as compared with the 1949 elections. The Melbourne "Herald" featured these predictions, well aware, as are the Socialists and Communists, that a considerable number of electors are highly susceptible to the "inevitability theory". Under secret, anonymous voting, we are convinced that there is a section of the electorate, which likes to vote for the Party, which is considered most likely to win.

Now that the final election results have been computed, it can be demonstrated that, even allowing for the influence they had on the total vote, the Gallup Poll predictions were incorrect. So far from the Menzies Government increasing its electoral support as compared with electoral support for the Labor-Socialists, it actually lost ground. But the Melbourne "Herald", in its issue of May 9, deliberately misleads on this matter. Continuing its pre-election line, its headlines proclaim "Bigger Vote, But Fewer Seats", "Government Fate in Poll". But an examination of final election figures reveals that while it is true that the Government increased its total vote there was an increased electorate—the Labor-Socialists increased their vote even more so.

Replace secret voting with open, recorded, and responsible voting, and centralised control of propaganda will no longer be the menace it is today.

Electricity Internationalised

From the very first we took the line that Marshall Aid would mean three things: (a) a chain of American outposts across Europe, (b) central control of European heavy industries, (c) centralised electricity running from the Alps to Great Britain. With the signing of the North Atlantic Treaty and the Schuman Plan, "a" and "b" are fulfilled. What about "c"?

At a meeting in Paris on 16th of February, representatives of the following Governments met: Austria, Belgium, Holland, Italy, Luxemburg, Switzerland and Western Germany. With them were representatives of the private electricity concerns in those countries.

At that meeting they agreed to set up a new European organisation dealing with electric energy. This organisation will call itself the "Union for the Co-ordination of Electricity Production and Transmission in Europe." The provisional chairman is Mr. Charles Crescent.

The first task of the new Union will be to establish a fact-finding bureau to collect data concerning potential output in each country. One phrase in the first report from the meeting struck a warning note: "... it would be advantageous to include the United Kingdom because of its large coal resources which would be complementary to the hydro-electric power resources of Switzerland, Austria and Italy."

It is high time we awakened to the net of international socialism, which is closing in. What we have already lost in the way of national sovereignty may never be recovered. What a great day it will be for the planners when electricians striking in France or Italy can plunge our island into darkness.

So far one great technical obstacle has to be overcome. Transmission of electric power by submarine cable is costly and inefficient. If they ever solve that one we shall find ourselves hitched up to Europe before we can say "Eisenhower."

Zionist Controllers of Communism

The student of world revolution knows that communism is not Russian, communism is not Polish, is not German, is not French, is not Chinese, is not American, is not British; that communism is the "strategy" or "weapon" of a numerically small but politically powerful group of international gangsters bent on the destruction of Christendom and all national sovereignty, and the establishment of "world government" under their control. A study of the directors of the present Red regimes reveals the identity of these international conspirators.

Organic Surface Tillage Forty Years Ago

I was farming organically when I heard of Faulkner's small-scale experiments early in 1944, and immediately resolved to extend his work to a farm scale as a natural sequence in the system I was evolving. Since then I have searched for earlier evidence of these methods, and quote here a report of the first scientific application of such methods, as long ago as 1912 — in France.

"In 1912 the newspapers of the South of France reported that a farmer of Carcassone, Jean de Bru, was obtaining unusually heavy crops on very poor land, without ploughing, without manure, and without fertilisers. In addition, this farmer was growing cereals year after year on the same land without paying attention to crop rotation.

"All of us, who were imbued with the teachings of the School, merely shrugged our shoulders and muttered to ourselves: 'This is the Midi.' But as time went on, high officials who had made the pilgrimage to the farm of Jean De Bru related what they had seen, while showing openly their stupefaction.

"Through curiosity and with the purpose of discovering the trick of which we accused Mr. Jean, the farmer in question, one of my friends and myself visited his farm—which was on the way to becoming widely known—during October, 1912. Believing as we did that we had to deal with a 'tall story,' we passed the whole afternoon in digging all over the place to find bags of fertilisers. We also conducted a meticulous investigation in the nearby village. All this trouble was for naught; on the whole property there were only two spring-tooth harrows.

"In 1918, urged on by a stubborn curiosity, we again visited the farm at Bru during the month of May, then again at threshing time, and finally in August, when land preparation for seeding was under way. In May we saw crops of an admirable appearance at threshing, we noted the following yields per hectare, in the midst of neighbouring poverty: wheat, 23 hectoliters (26 bu. per acre); oats, 55 (61 bu. per acre); barley, 45 (50 bu. per acre).

"He had obtained this result by chance, as his sole objective was to reduce his cost of production. He was the very first to be astonished at the results he obtained. After referring to all agricultural textbooks, which we could find, we were obliged to admit that all we had seen was the absolute negation, the evident proof of the falsity of all we had been taught up till then. We spoke about the matter to our peasants, who laughed at us. We wrote to

a few professors of agriculture who answered that all this was not serious, and even refused to visit the place. In 1914, we had made the same findings; when war was declared."

Mack Gowder's Farming System

At about the same time as Jean de Bru started his ploughless farming method, an American farmer of the State of Georgia, Mack Gowder, evolved a soil tillage method of his own style to prevent soil erosion and to maintain soil fertility at a high level on a hilly farm which he had purchased and cleared himself. The main features of his system were to leave the trash and crop residues on the ground and not to use the moldboard plough. Here is what Paul W. Chapman, Dean of the University of Georgia, said of the Mack Gowder's system, which we have previously described in brief in *The Farmer*.

"Since he purchased his hilly farm he has never turned the surface layer of his place.

"He does plough, but uses an implement of his own design which does not turn under the trash and crop residues. Gowder's plough—now famous because it was taken to Washington to show to the Agricultural Committee of Congress—is a bull tongue with a sharp point—a modified "Georgia Scooter," which he forges himself. It does not turn the top layer of soil, merely stirs it a little. Most of his ploughing is done in the fall, when he has plenty of time, and, even if the land is a little wet, it doesn't matter, for it has ample time to "weather" during the winter months.

"Mack Gowder has terraces, but they were an after-thought put in five years after he cleared the land. They are not used to hold the soil, simply to "take care of the floods." The trash on the surface holds the soil; there is no serious erosion. Since he ploughs through the crop residues on the land rather than turning them under, his fields look trashy. Some people would call it "sorry" farming, but the proof of the methods is in the production. He makes a bale of cotton to the acre—sometimes two bales. His corn yields vary from 40 to 75 bushels per acre. (No Georgia county over a period of years has an average as high as 20 bushels.) He makes from 25 to 30 bushels of wheat; 40 to 50 bushels of oats.

(Average oat production for Hall County is 15 bushels per acre.)

"On a measured acre of land he has made 90 bushels of corn. Five years ago he sowed five bushels and one gallon of wheat on six acres, and threshed 206 bushels of wheat. He used 150 to 200 pounds of fertiliser per acre, as compared with an average of 250 to 300 pounds for the farmer in that section of Georgia. His yields are at least three times as large as those for the State as a whole, and they are made at lower costs per acre."

I am grateful to Albert Gosselin, a Canadian reader, for the above information, which he hopes to publish in a Canadian book called "Which Way to Better Farming," along with other evidence of the value of surface tillage from various parts of the world.

Our Socialist planners have not yet hit on a device for controlling the weather. If they can control the grub then they should forsake their comfortable office chairs and have a go at it. Wages are not

controlled. Rates are not fixed, etc., etc., etc.

Now, if you have Price Control for one thing you *must*, in fairness have price control for everything. In fact you must have everything controlled—except pardon, the controllers. Then you have the complete Socialised State. Either that or you must have complete freedom to do as you wish, providing you do not interfere with other people doing the same. About time we made up our minds on what we want.

The McArthur-Truman battle still rages. Cutting out the side issues, McArthur's case seems to be that he was hindered from doing, what he, as a military commander was in duty bound to do. That is to dispose of the enemy in the shortest possible time, at the lowest cost in lives to the men under his command and the lowest cost in money and materials to those who employed him—in this case the United States public.
