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TAX TYRANNY AND DISHONESTY

Are We Capable of "Drawing the Line"?

The following important article by Mr. John Mitchell, founder of the Christian Campaign for Freedom in England, is the first "shot" in an expansion of our campaigning:

"I thought there would be something repulsively un-American about submerging the individual and making him no more than a taxpayer's code number in a state-controlled master plan for the manipulation of the national economy. But apparently not. The Bill of Rights sounds a little strange after it has been rewritten by the economists."

"Surely one of the prime purposes of law, at least in my layman's view, is to provide standards of acceptable conduct, reference points which will serve as guides to reasonable righteous action . . . Instead of the law being a guide to the clear road, it leads us into a maze . . ."

The foregoing remarks are taken from an address to the Pennsylvania Bar Association by Mr. Cameron Hawley, the author of a sensational best selling novel in which the hero "degenerates morally under the influence of laws which invite corruption". The response was said to be "overwhelming" and produced a flood of correspondence. "The Saturday Evening Post" broke a long tradition by reprinting the address.

Mr. Hawley was particularly concerned to draw attention to the corrupting effect of tax law, not only in its devastating effect in lowering morality, which may be especially bad in the U.S.A., but in its "restrictive, warping, distorting effect upon sound business management", which is certainly a major feature of tax legislation most evident in countries of the British Commonwealth. In order to obtain material for his book Mr. Hawley interviewed hundreds of executives. A typical experience was to sit down with the Chairman of the Board of a large concern and go through the minutes of their directors' meetings: "When we were through it was quite evident that almost every move had been substantially affected, if not primarily motivated, by tax considerations."

No one but a moron would seek to deny the importance of these matters, but there is another aspect of tax legislation to which

Mr. Hawley refers, which is of even greater consequence: "I had always thought that taxation was justified by the need to raise revenue. Oh no! That's an old fashioned view now . . . The really important function of taxation is to serve as a device for controlling the national economy . . ."

The astonishing fact is that the British people, who taught the world the art of constitutional government and who for centuries, at the cost of much suffering and the sacrifice of many brave lives, struggled to produce that Constitution for the express purpose, and for no other purpose, of safeguarding certain basic rights should allow to go unchallenged the steady growth of a process of law which directly infringes those rights and undermines the Constitution.

No question needs asking more urgently, and it is one which every responsibly-minded man should ask himself, than which of us is so wanting in moral sense and moral courage that he has no standard and no limit below which he refuses to go at the behest of Government alleging "economic necessity". In the case of Americans Mr. Hawley has asked the question and at his first asking has received an overwhelming response from self-respecting persons. Can the same question be asked of Australian business and professional men and no response be forthcoming?

What undoubtedly is required is a re-statement and assertion of the rights of the individual, as also the limits of the function of governments. We are often reminded nowadays that politics is the art of the possible, and no doubt this is true. But this statement is invariably made an excuse for not achieving a better state of affairs because what is otherwise possible is inhibited by the climate of opinion or some other political factor. There is, however, a more serious side to this question than the inability to proceed to positive advances because of inhibiting factors; there is the negative aspect that what was possible yesterday is no longer possible

today because of a deterioration in moral factors. Human rights are moral factors of the greatest consequence and infringements of them, except as a temporary matter on grounds of the direst necessity, are immoral acts. Undeniably advances have been made in higher material standards of living, but who can honestly say that we have not slid back, and are continually sliding back, in matters more fundamental than material standards of living and which if neglected will lead to the destruction of those standards and the

OUR POLICY

1. The support of all policies rooted in the Christian philosophy of freedom and based upon the Moral Law.
2. The preservation of Australia's sovereignty as a part of the British Empire, and the exposure of all internal and external groups which attack that sovereignty.
3. The preservation and extension of genuine local government.
4. The preservation and strengthening of all Constitutional safeguards for the purpose of protecting fundamental individual rights.
5. The encouragement of all activities designed to bring Governments under more effective control by the electors.
6. The preservation and extension of genuine free, competitive enterprise and private ownership, and opposition to all Monopoly, whether it be "private" or State.
7. The support of a financial policy which will (a) permit free enterprise to make available to all individuals an increasing standard of living and greater leisure for cultural pursuits, (b) result in no further increase to the community's indebtedness and the sound business practice of gradually reducing existing debt. Recognising that the basis of any sound economy is agriculture, the encouragement of agricultural policies, which will ensure the preservation and building up of soil fertility by organic farming and gardening; and the prevention of soil erosion and the protection of forests and watersheds.

THE LATE COLIN BARCLAY-SMITH

In publishing the following appreciation of the late C. Barclay-Smith by Mr. Vince Kelly, who wrote for "The New Era" under the nom-de-plume of "Mancunian," we would also like to place it on record that during the post-war years Mr. Barclay-Smith was a generous financial contributor to "The New Times" and took a keen personal interest in the work of Mr. Eric Butler and his associates.

The death occurred in Sydney, N.S.W., Australia, on May 19, 1957, of Mr. Colin Barclay-Smith, at the age of 64. He had been in poor health for the preceding six months and the end came suddenly, from a heart attack.

The late Mr. C. Barclay-Smith was in the Australian Imperial Forces in the First World War and saw service in Egypt and France. Never very robust, the rigours of war service left him with a heart condition that was to affect him in later life.

"C.B.S.", as his friends called him, was born in Tasmania and was educated to be a journalist. He worked for a time on the Sydney "Daily Telegraph" and other metropolitan newspapers in Sydney and Brisbane. Later, he edited a country newspaper in Queensland and subsequently edited "Country Life", and the "Pacific Magazine", both of them Australian publications.

Early in the world trade depression, which gripped Australia some 27 years ago, C.B.S. studied the Social Credit proposals of Major C. H. Douglas. He became so convinced of their soundness that in 1932 he founded the "New Era", the first Social Credit paper in Australia. This journal did more to enlighten the people of Australia and New Zealand on finance and economics than any other agency before or since.

During 1934 C.B.S. accompanied Major Douglas on his tour of New Zealand. For 25 years, C.B.S. continued to edit and publish the "New Era", always a bright informative, well-written and capably edited journal, ranking with the best Social Credit papers in the world.

It was around the early nineteen thirties that he also wrote a series of booklets on various aspects of Social Credit and finance. C.B.S. possessed the rare faculty of being able to express himself in flawless English, and to explain difficult matters so that they became simple and easily understood.

To the very end, he laboured to advance the cause of Social Credit, his last book having been completed only a few months

before he died. He called it "It's Time They Knew" and it is both a revelation of the growth and burden of public debt in Australia, and a damning indictment of the operations of so-called sound finance.

C.B.S. had many interests. He wrote a series of ten books on "The Art of Life", which dealt variously with literature, music, art, philosophy and science. He sought ever to make men and women eager to enter upon that larger cultural heritage which automation and the coming leisure age foreshadow. He wrote an explanatory book for those who wished to build their own homes. He wrote numerous works on nutrition, health and vitamin therapy. He had intended to write further books, one to be a popular work on philosophy and another to deal with the promotion of good health among elderly people. Unfortunately he was not spared to carry out these intentions.

To the very end, C.B.S. displayed a keen interest in world affairs and national politics. He was deeply concerned with all phases of life and was apt to quote the saying of Goethe: "The aim of life is life itself."

To his gift of expression were added those of sound judgment, unflinching good temper and a sense of humour. He was a charming companion, beloved by all who were fortunate enough to be numbered among his friends; generous; thoughtful and considerate of others.

In his later years, C.B.S. took up painting as a hobby and applied himself with such good purpose that his works are now valued by art-lovers as well as cherished by his friends.

The passing of C.B.S. has left a gap that cannot be filled. His versatility was a sterling and rare quality, and to his friends his death is a heavy blow indeed, for men so sincere, so true, and so gifted, are all too few.

Of C.B.S. we can surely say, as Bunyan said of the Death of Valiant for Truth:

"So he passed over, and all the trumpets sounded for him on the other side."

No person can consider himself adequately informed upon the great issues of our time, who does not understand the present-day aims and workings of the Jew-controlled American Federal Reserve banking system.

"History of Netherlands Monetary Systems", by Alexander Del Mar (2/- post-free). This pamphlet by the great American historian, Del Mar, is indispensable for those interested in the history of modern Europe and the vast changes wrought by the modern money system. Notes on the News

Secret Mission to Washington

On May 31st the Hobart "Mercury" announced that Australia's Secretary of the Treasury, Sir Roland Wilson, had gone on a "secret mission" to Washington.

It now appears, from various other reports that Sir Roland's job will be to borrow a large sum of money from the United States, possibly in excess of one hundred million pounds.

The money will be used by Australia to purchase aircraft and armaments from the U.S.

The gradual maneuvering of Australia away from Britain into closer co-operation with the U.S. — whatever else it portends — means increased orders for American industry and bigger and better loans by the masters of America's money.

Professor Oliphant on Radioactivity

In a statement in Canberra, published in the Melbourne "Age" on June 5th Professor Marcus Oliphant pointed out that scientifically there is no evidence that harm is being done by radioactive fall-out. Nor, he said, is there any evidence that harm is not being done.

Professor Oliphant's statement was apparently aimed at scaremongers who claim solid scientific backing in their attacks on British hydrogen bomb explosions in the Pacific. He made it clear that the great weight of scientific opinion is that the fall-out from nuclear tests is small compared with natural radiation.

British Columbia Grant To Home Owners

The government of British Columbia is making a grant this year of 28 dollars each to all homeowners. The grant, which will go to 267,500 people, will be in the form of a credit towards their municipal taxes.

Soon after the grant was announced, the Canadian Federal government at Ottawa stated that the 28 dollars would be taxed as income or a gift. Taxpayers polled by the Vancouver "Sun" unanimously declared that the Federal government's decision was "unfair".

Premier Bennett of British Columbia says that if the Federal authorities try to stop provincial governments from reducing taxes, "that would be one good reason why they should be thrown out of office."

Tribute to a Great Senator

Those who followed the career of the late Senator McCarthy know that he was subjected to one of the toughest propaganda battering in history. Communist activity against Senator McCarthy was so successful that some Catholic press commentators in Melbourne and Sydney followed the Red line without knowing it.

In Washington, however, Monsignor John J. Cartwright, preaching the eulogy at St. Matthew's Cathedral, called Senator McCarthy the "watchman of the citadel" and said his role in America "will be more and more honoured as history unfolds its record".

He went on: "There is no one more resentful of the hero than those who do not want to be saved because they do not know that they are threatened."

The Mass in St. Matthew's Cathedral was celebrated by the Archbishop of Washington, the Most Reverend Patrick O'Boyle.

Strange Story on Hungarian "Refugees"

A strange story in the Melbourne "Sun" of June 1st told of Hungarian "refugees" living in Switzerland who are wearing new clothes and are well provided with semi-luxuries as well as the necessities of life.

The "Sun" pointed out that these "refugees" are bound for Australia despite the "pleasant life" they are leading in Switzerland. In fact the "Sun" story was really an advance warning to Australians, lest they should be too surprised at the well-dressed, well-fed appearance of the newcomers.

It seems likely that these people are one more segment of the large Jewish migration from behind the Iron Curtain, which has now been going on for some time. These people are being forced, by their superiors, to migrate to the New World, for reasons best known to these superiors or "elders".

Something, obviously, is afoot.

Hidden Government, by Lt. Colonel J. Creagh Scott (8/-). This valuable work is a summary of the long process which Disraeli described when he said: "Governments do not govern, but merely control the machinery of government, being themselves controlled by the hidden hand."

THE NAMELESS WAR

The Nameless War, by Captain A. H. M. Ramsay (8/- post free). Captain Ramsay, who died last year, was the British patriot and Member of Parliament who almost succeeded in getting to Mr. Neville Chamberlain information which might very well have changed the course of history. Captain Ramsay enjoyed the confidence, of Mr. Chamberlain during the critical months between Munich and September 1939. They discussed the trans-Atlantic power-group, which was trying to force England to get the Second World War started. Captain Ramsay was to have provided Mr. Chamberlain with certain information — but the War Party intervened. Before he could get to Mr. Chamberlain with this information, Captain Ramsay was thrown into prison, without trial, and was kept there until September 1944. After his release he was still bound not to reveal certain facts regarding documents, which passed between President Roosevelt and Mr. Churchill, BEFORE Mr. Churchill became Prime Minister.

"The Nameless War" contains a great number of important quotations, many of which are not easily accessible elsewhere. One of the main virtues of this book is that one can disagree with some of Captain Ramsay's forthright opinions, but at the same time thank him heartily for an abundance of factual material of first-rate importance.

Sham Battle Over "Democratic Socialism"

In a featured article published in the Melbourne "Age" of May 23, Mr. F. E. Chamberlain, Federal President of the Australian Labor Party, attempted to define "Democratic Socialism". It is clear from a reading of Mr. Chamberlain's article, and numerous other statements by Labor spokesmen dealing with this subject, that the present dominant policy makers in the Labor Party, the intellectuals, have followed the lead of the British Socialists in repudiating direct nationalisation schemes and in placing greater importance upon achieving Socialism by indirect controls. But there is nothing new about the control suggested — high taxation for the redistribution of incomes, centralised credit controls, heavy death duties to destroy property rights, etc. They are all listed in Karl Marx's ten points for communising a State.

The use of the term "Democratic Socialism" is, of course, one more demonstration of the brainwashing go widespread in these allegedly progressive times. The essence of Socialism is the centralisation of power. But genuine democracy is only possible when there is decentralisation of power, thus enabling the individual to control both the political and economic system. Mr. Chamberlain's conception of democracy, which admittedly is very widespread, is that if the Labor Party can persuade a majority of the electors to vote for them, they can have the right to use all the indirect controls constitutionally permissible to create the centrally Planned State.

Now the threat of the centrally Planned State is very real indeed. Mr. L. H. Moore, Federal President of the Liberal Party of Australia, commenting upon Mr. Chamberlain's article in "The Age" of May 30, stresses the fact that it is possible to advance towards Socialism within the present Federal Constitution. But he does not mention the fact that most of the controls he says the "Democratic Socialists" may use are also being used by the present Liberal-Country Party Government.

It is true that the "Democratic Socialists" would consciously intensify the drive towards the centralisation of power, whereas many Liberals reluctantly accept the centralisation of power as "inevitable". And for this reason the centralisation of power is slower and less obvious under the Liberals. But the final result is inevitable unless there is real change of policy. Should Mr. Moore object to this statement, we ask him to take out the promises presented to the electors by Mr. Menzies and Sir Arthur Fadden at the famous 1949 elections and compare them with what has happened since. Both the taxation and credit systems have been used as instruments of control. And the bureaucracy, directed by the real policy makers, expands daily. All the evidence indicates that the centralisation of power will continue. Electors should not permit the sham fighting between the Liberal and Labor Parties to obscure this fundamental fact.

treatment of men and women by the State, not as persons, but as cyphers having no rights whatsoever.

If a people through sheer feebleness of character are unable to "draw the line" at any plan or policy of economist or politician and assert that they have certain rights which they will not sacrifice at any price then the art of the possible in politics passes out of the hands of men capable of pursuing policies which lead to a higher civilisation into the hands of debased power-seekers, to whom the object of the art of the possible is not the advance of civilisation but how to make men and women more and more the subjects of their will to power.

The purpose of addressing these remarks to whoever will read them is to ascertain if there is in our society a point where a substantial and determined body of people will "draw the line" at sacrificing their liberties and rights, and if so, where it is. If there is no such line of resistance then nothing can stop the whole world becoming a Communist Slave State. On the other hand if there is such a line then that is a firm base on which effective resistance can be organised to stop and defeat the forces, which are working to enslave us.

The co-operation of readers is invited to determine this line of resistance. If there is a sufficient indication of determined support for a minimum of rights a Declaration will be drawn up as a basis for non-party political action. A wide distribution of this appeal depends on your support.

A Queensland Appreciation of C. Barclay-Smith

The following has been received from Mr. J. E. Harding, Hon. Secretary, and Mr. A. E. Webb, President, of the Monetary Reform League, Rockhampton:

Queensland Social Crediters place on record their deep and lasting appreciation of a Christian, a great citizen and a great Social Creditor, Colin Barclay-Smith. Our heartfelt sympathy goes to his home folk, but we envy them the everlasting honour of being related to such a man.

Barclay Smith was a simple and kindly man with a great intellect and a great sense of public duty. He had the very rare ability to go right to the heart of a problem. He concerned himself with the problems of humanity and not his personal troubles, concentrating on the two greatest problems of physical health and economic justice. Returning as one of the victims of the 1914-18 war, he was given by his doctors but a few months to live. Having faith that there is a Christian purpose in life on this earth, he set out in search of a cure for his bodily ills among the writings of great physicians — and found it. From the knowledge gained, he restored his bodily health and proceeded to set out the principles revealed by his research, in a series of booklets for the benefit of his fellows.

He was among the first to appreciate the truth of the economic and financial principles enunciated by Major C. H. Douglas in 1919. From then to the day of his death he devoted all his great ability to spreading knowledge of these principles so that humanity might free itself from the degrading enslavement of the present financial dictatorship.

Being a man of great ability he could have sold his services for a financial reward that would have brought to himself and his home folk the material luxuries of this life. Instead, he chose the road of truth — and paid for it dearly, even to the extent of having to mortgage his home effects to provide money to keep his Social Credit journal, "The New Era", in action.

Those of us who fought alongside will remember these things and see that future generations know of them and of the great debt they owe to Colin Barclay-Smith.

History will write his epitaph. Our part is to see that the work he gave his life to is prosecuted with unflinching energy and purpose, not only as the one acceptable tribute to the memory of Barclay-Smith, but because there never has been a time when the urgency of the reforms he advocated was greater than it is now.

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HOW MUCH POISON ARE WE EATING?

The manufacture of two billion pounds of insecticides in the United States during 1954 raises a very vital question: "How Much Poison Are We Eating?" It's a question that organic gardeners and farmers have been concerned with for many years, and one that now has been adequately presented to the general public through an article in "Harper's Magazine".

Written by Ralph G. Martin, associate editor of "Newsweek", "How Much Poison Are We Eating?" emphasises the fact that to date there have been no really effective means of either controlling or determining the amount of poison consumed by U.S. citizens in the form of insecticide residues.

"Up to now, anybody could put an insecticide on the market without having to demonstrate its harmlessness — the burden of proof was on the government, and prolonged court cases were necessary to get some dangerous pesticides off the market," writes Mr. Martin.

To alter this situation, a Congressional Committee (the House Select Committee to Investigate the Use of Chemicals in Foods and Cosmetics) held two years of hearings and took four volumes of testimony. Scattered throughout the pages of the committee transcript are "numerous illustrations of how dangerous this method of control — or lack of method could be. Here, for example, is the testimony of Dr. W. C. Hueper, chief of the Environmental Cancer Section of the National Cancer Institute:

Question: Was the discovery that acetylaminofluorene produced cancer an incidental or accidental one, or was an attempt being made to determine the fact?

Dr. Hueper: The authors made it quite clear in their communication that it was accidental.

Question: In what part of organs of the body did it produce cancer?

Dr. Hueper: It would produce cancer of the liver, the stomach, the breast, the thyroid, the pelvis, the kidney, the bladder, the female genital tract, the external auditory canal, and occasionally the brain.

Question: After the discovery that this proposed insecticide did produce cancer it was discarded for that use, was it not?

Dr. Hueper: That is right. It was never used for that purpose.

Question: If the fact that it did produce cancer had not been ascertained in the accidental fashion which you mentioned, it might now be used as an insecticide; is that correct?

Dr. Hueper: Doubtlessly it would have been.

Question: After the discovery was made with respect to acetylaminofluorene, did you know whether a general programme was started by anyone to test other insecticides then in use for their possible tumor - producing or cancer - producing properties?

Dr. Hueper: Not that I am aware of. All this testimony resulted in a new law. "Now, for the first time," reports Mr. Martin, "it will be up to the manufacturer to show comprehensive proof that the residue of his insecticide left on crops can safely accumulate in the human body over an entire lifetime."

The reason for all this anxiety is not the microscopic bit of insecticide residue on any single food we eat. "It is fear of the unknown cumulative effect, the long-range build-up inside your body of the vast variety of toxic materials that may crop up in every meal.

"In his testimony, Dr. Francis E. Ray, director of the Cancer Research Laboratory of the University of Florida, explained why in his field this problem is particularly difficult to solve. 'Long continued application of small doses,' he said, 'is more effective in producing tumors than are large doses frequently applied . . . Cancer of the internal organs may pass unnoticed

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until it has progressed to the fatal stage. In human cancer, therefore, it might be very difficult to 'prove that a tumorous growth was initiated by the long-continued ingestion of small amounts of chemical in food'."

With any proposed chemical, the questions about its residual effect are many. How can the manufacturer offer a lifetime guarantee when there are so many unknowns, and so much controversy about what little is known?

DDT is an example. It is a deadly poison, which attacks the nervous system and finally the brain. An investigation reported at a recent meeting of the American Public Health Association revealed that no meal had been found in which some trace of DDT did not appear and that the daily menu for the average American contained 184 micrograms. The researchers added that this amount was far below the dosage human volunteers had taken without injury. But what particularly concerns the doctors is the tendency of DDT to store up in the fatty tissues of all animals, humans included. If people, after four or five years, are found to have up to 33 parts per million of DDT in their fat, what is going to happen after we have been using DDT from ten to 15 years?

Dangerous residues are not restricted to DDT, but are a major problem where insecticides as BHC, systemics (a whole new group of phosphate chemicals) and many others are used.

"There is a growing group of agricultural experts who feel that too heavy a use of insecticides may lead us into a downward spiral toward disaster," declares Mr. Martin. "Many of them belong to what is generally known as the Organic Farming School, which holds that healthy plants in naturally fertilized soil can resist insects and disease without the aid of chemicals . . . Dr. William Albrecht, the nationally-known nutrition expert of the University of Missouri, points out that you can kill insects and get more pounds of corn per acre, but the total amount of protein taken from that acre remains the same.

"And author-farmer Louis Bromfield, with much-publicised success, has operated farms in France, Ohio and Texas without using insecticides at all. Other 'organicists' have warned that insecticides could backfire (as they may have already done) by creating super-insects, bred from those that are immune, and thus increasing pest population."

Here is Mr. Martin's conclusion: "The hope of the new law is severe enforcement. It is the hope that government scientists will always think of consumer health before pest-killing efficiency. . . . And it is the hope, most of all, that public awareness will maintain constant pressure to keep the new law strict and strong, so that never again will the American people be 160 million guinea pigs."

Anti-Smoking Campaign Would Embarrass Government

"The Social Crediter" has made the excellent suggestion that those interested in local objective campaigns should seek to embarrass the Federal Government by demanding that it take appropriate action concerning the overwhelming medical evidence that there is a direct relationship between smoking, lung cancer, and other diseases. The Government has a big vested interest in smoking as it provides a considerable portion of the total taxation collected. While the question of whether to smoke or not to smoke is one for the individual to decide for himself, the Government should be asked does it propose to continue exploiting a habit which medical authorities agree tends to produce lung cancer and other serious diseases.
