Red "Moon" Used To Further Creation Of The World State

Hysteria Fostered To Stampede The Individual

No sooner had the Russians announced that they had successfully launched their satellite than a wave of terror-propaganda was unleashed against the peoples of the world. The central theme has been a continuation of the one developed when the atomic bomb was unnecessarily dropped upon Japan: that unless the individual surrenders his individual and national sovereignty to a World Government, he and his civilization will be destroyed. Hysteria is being deliberately fostered to stampede the individual to accept an international tyranny.

While the Communist leaders are extracting the maximum propaganda value from the technical achievement of Russian scientists, and are exploiting it to intensify their programme of psychological warfare, the policy makers in the West are calling for an intensification of policies of centralism everywhere. The ultimate control of policy making in the world resides with those who control the money system, a system that has been progressively centralised. The international Money Power, centred in America, not only played a vital role in bringing the Communists to power in Russia; it has consistently aided and abetted the growth of Communism while opposing any policies which would have ended the Communist menace.

THE MONEY POWER AND COMMUNISM

If the Money Power were really opposed to Communism, as some simple people believe, then why did the Money Power during and after the last war support policies, which brought Communism right into the heart of Europe and which resulted in the victory of Communism in China? Why were Western military forces held back in order that the Russians could take those areas in Germany where German scientists were doing most of their work on rocket development? And who were the influential individuals, both in the U.S.A. and England, who allowed the numerous espionage agents and highly placed officials like Alger Hiss to feed to the Communists the technical information, which ensured that they were able to produce both A. and H. bombs? Soon after the announcement of the launching of the Russian satellite, Ivor Couzenko, the Russian who defected from Communism in Canada, and whose disclosures resulted in the famous Canadian Royal

Commission on Communism, made a public statement in which he pointed out that he had warned in vain that espionage agents were seeking information which would enable them to develop guided missiles. It has never been satisfactorily explained why many of Couzenko's disclosures were never followed up. For example, who was responsible for allowing Fuchs to continue his dangerous espionage work long after Couzenko had mentioned his name?

These and similar questions cannot be brushed aside by claiming that there has been considerable stupidity. There is undoubtedly plenty of stupidity and short-sightedness amongst Western politicians, but there has been such a consistent policy of support for Communism, including the open granting of huge dollar loans and other assistance to the "national" Communists in Yugoslavia and Poland by the international Money Power, that we must face the logical conclusion that Communism is essential to create the necessary climate of opinion in which the individual can be brought to accept as "inevitable" the claim that he must either accept the World State or perish.

COULD U.S.A. HAVE LAUNCHED FIRST SATELLITE?

Whether or not the Communists were permitted to be the first in launching a satellite is another question being asked by students of international affairs. We refuse to believe that Western scientists could not have successfully launched a satellite before this if it had been the desire of the policy makers. Dr. I. M. Levitt, one of America's leading authorities on outer space, has made the significant comment that the American army could have

"achieved a satellite moon just like Russia's by doing little more than changing the angle of fire" on one of the Jupiter rockets, which reach a speed of 15,000 miles an hour and a 650-mile altitude. In spite of all the hysterical comment, it is clear that the only military significance of Russia's launching of a satellite is the fact that the Communists may not be bluffing in their claim that they possess an inter-continental ballistic missile.

OUR POLICY

1. The support of all policies rooted in the Christian philosophy of freedom and based upon the Moral Law.
2. The preservation of Australia's sovereignty as a part of the British Empire, and the exposure of all internal and external groups, which attack that sovereignty.
3. The preservation and extension of genuine local government.

But irrespective of whether they have an inter-continental ballistic missile or not, we see no evidence to suggest that the threat of a large-scale military conflict is any greater than it was ten years ago. As C. H. Douglas pointed out just after the outbreak of the Korean "incident," nuclear war on a worldwide scale would be as dangerous to the individuals controlling the international Money Power as to lesser mortals. The major threat to what remains of civilization is the exploitation of "the threat of war" to achieve victory over the individual with, at the most, small-scale localised military incidents.

PLOT REACHING FINAL STAGE

The plot against mankind is now probably reaching its final stage. But as it does it becomes easier to show people that they are the victims of a conscious policy, which uses every weapon to break the individual's will to resist. We rapidly approach a time of supreme test, which will decide whether we are to escape the threat of a World Police State. Those temporarily dismayed by the psychological impact of the launching of the Red "Moon" might

What is Happening in Little Rock?

Press reporting on the events in Little Rock, U.S.A., has almost reached the all-time low in lying, perversion and suppression, achieved when Senator McCarthy died. This filthy press campaign has been a gift to the enemies of Western Christendom everywhere. The promoters of the integration campaign in the U.S.A. are not Negroes, but prominent Zionists like Dr. Evatt's friend, Judge Frankfurter, Mr. Herbert Lehman, closely associated with the international Money Power, and Mr. Arthur Spingarn, well known Zionist, whose pro-Communist record would take several columns of this journal to list.

Arkansas has had an excellent history of race harmony over many years. Passions, and the inevitable incidents which occur when human beings are emotionally disturbed, are the direct result of the attempt to send a few Negroes to white schools in spite of the generally admitted fact that nearly 100 percent of the whites are opposed to integration in the schools. The picture of a few white hooligans preventing Negroes from gaining their "rights" is damnably false. Negroes have their own schools to go to in America. Quite apart from other factors, it has been proved beyond argument that educational standards

profitably pause to ponder on the fact that while the Communist leaders are pointing to their technical achievements, there is evidence of renewed resistance against the Communist yoke by its unhappy victims. Poles rioting against their "national" Communist masters do not appear to be unduly concerned about the Red "Moon." Even if the Russians were to fly to the moon next week, there is no evidence that the Hungarians would become reconciled to their Communist prison.

The most important aspect of the Communist world is not its technical and material achievements, but the fact that hundreds of millions of individuals refuse to be reconciled to a system, which is permanently in conflict with human nature. If the international Money Power really desired the overthrow of Communism, it would use its enormous power to exploit this basic weakness in the Communist Empire. The fact that it does not do this indicates clearly the policy required to save civilization. Let us refuse to be stampeded; let us hold on to our faith in the Truth; let us make a major effort to ensure that we are ready for any major test that may come.

have fallen badly when segregation is forced. There has been one major inquiry in the U.S.A. on the results of integration in schools, but the findings were such a blow to the integrationists that they were either suppressed or distorted. Here in Australia the readers of the daily press hear nothing about such inquiries.

Neither are they told that surveys amongst the Negroes of the Southern States reveal that at least 90 percent of the Negroes desire to maintain their own schools. The small numbers of Negro agitators are invariably the victims of indoctrination by Jewish Communists. One State Government is investigating the activities of the National Association for the Advancement of Coloured People, and has already drawn attention to subversive aspects of its activities. Australian commentators make no reference whatever to these facts.

What is worrying responsible American citizens is the manner in which the passions aroused by the attempt to force integration, is creating conditions in which the Federal Government can further extend its power at the expense of the States. If the Zionist Wall Street Money Power can use Federal bayonets to tell the States that they no longer have control of their own educational systems, this principle can be extended to other matters. Church spokesmen in particular should ponder on the thought that if the Federal Government can decide today that Negroes and whites cannot go to separate schools, tomorrow it

can decide that parents belonging to different Christian denominations are not entitled to send their children to different schools.

A series of Gallup Polls taken in the U.S.A. this year reveal that there has been a progressive increase in opposition, both in the Northern States as well as in the South, to forced integration. If in spite of this growing opposition, and the upsurge of feeling in the South following the use of Federal bayonets, the Zionist promoters of the forced integration campaign are going to intensify their programme, it is certain that America is threatened with the destruction of its traditional system of constitutional Government.

THE DISINHERITED

Mrs. Lucille Quinlan's Seminar Paper Part II

There are those amongst us still who believe that progress is continuous and inevitable and to prove it, they point to the modern woman. Then, they ask, was she ever more free, better educated, more beautiful? Such people delude themselves. The modern woman is being steadily de-womanized, stripped of her prerogatives as the natural guardian and educator of her children, forced from her home by pressure of circumstances, impoverished in mind by a purely materialist education and so devitalized in body that she rarely is capable of nursing her own children for more than a month or two.

The position of women is always a sure guide to the health of a given society. The status of women has risen and fallen with the flow and ebb of each great age. In very early Christian times, it was taken for granted that her education was equally as important as that of men and St. Jerome established a kind of school for matrons where theology and languages were taught . . . I rather fancy our C.W.A. study circles would find Greek, Latin and Hebrew a little too tough, not to mention theology — and Tertullian wrote a whole treatise on the education of women. Education of women was certainly not neglected in the great ages of England. It was wide and varied, and with that of the era of the Industrial Revolution, quite general. But with the closing of the monastic and convent schools by Henry VIII it ceased to be general and we are only now beginning to make up for two centuries of neglect. But the quality of the education generally given nowadays cannot compare with that which a woman like Margaret Paston, say, received in the fifteenth century, enabling her to control a large household, directing personal, domestic and even military operations inseparable from the running of an estate in uneasy times and the absence of her husband. I should imagine that Margaret Paston's job was quite as exacting as that of any modern woman in charge of say, a hospital, or a business or a government department; more so in fact, when you remember that she went on bearing children all the time. You can hear the echoes of her busy life still when you read the Paston Letters.

THE MODERN "EMANCIPATED" WOMAN

But the modern prophets would regard women like her as slaves, bound as a correspondent in the "Age" with whom I came to grips in the war years, so beautifully described as the "soul-destroying drudgery of child-bearing and child-rearing". Family life, said the prophets of the Wells-Shaw Utopia, was tyranny imposed on women for the benefit of men, and woman must be emancipated, set free to live her own life. So, with the help of the crèche and the nursery school and

the latchkey round the neck of the seven to twelve year olds, women went out to express their personality behind typewriters and other machines, behind counters and occasionally behind professional brass plates. But as Chesterton pointed out, it is the woman in the home who has the varied and the satisfying job. The emancipated one mostly repeated the same thing hour after hour, as well as day after day, and week after week. With the home woman there was certainly repetition, but there was also the variety as she coped with things needing the skill of cook and nurse and gardener and needlewoman and cleaner and decorator, and so on, ad infinitum . . . and all of it nourished by the warmth of human needs and love, with the dignity of being mistress of her own domain instead of a vague face behind a counter, a blur behind a machine, a name on a payroll.

With the woman gone out of the home most of the week, home life is being killed at the roots. School fees to be paid, doctors' bills, the instalments on the furniture, and the home—more and more of the homemakers, the women who really would prefer to stay at home, are being driven into the early morning queues at the suburban railway stations to swell the crowds in the city-bound trains. It happens in the country, too, of course, for the shortage of purchasing power spares no one. But it is most obvious and most depressing to someone coming fresh from the country to one of the capitals. How was it that Bryan Monahan put it:

"How many women overload the transport system to go to work to earn the money to buy the labour-saving gadgets to enable them to go to work to overload the transport system . . ." and so on ad nauseam.

Sit on Spencer Street station in the early morning and you'll see them—young brides with bright new rings who should be home fussing over their newly won paradise and storing up energy for the strains ahead (instead of going to work to earn just a deposit on a paradise); young mothers in their twenties and early thirties whose children have been left in a crèche or with some of those other hard-up mothers who advertise in the shop windows of the suburbs, "Children cared for while mothers are at work"; yellow-skinned, dull-eyed middle-aged women who should be pottering about some outer suburban garden in the fresh cool air, instead of padding about on tired feet behind the counter of dingy cafeterias or washing dishes eight hours a day. Shades of the suffragettes and the emancipated woman! If this is emancipation, give me what my Communist opponent in the "Age" called the "soul-destroying drudgery of child-bearing and child-rearing".

State Rights Versus The Credit Monopoly

We hear encouraging reports concerning the Victorian Liberal Government's determination to continue their fight to get back the State's taxing powers. Personal discussions with several State Liberal Members reveal that there is considerable resentment against the Prime Minister's stand against the abolition of Uniform Taxation. However, whether Victorian State Liberals make a real fight on this issue remains to be seen. They certainly initiated a debate on the question in the Victorian Parliament last week, and there was some very excellent and outspoken comment. But we learn that, following a most critical article by the Victorian Liberal Party in the Melbourne "Sun" several weeks ago, appropriately titled, "Double Tax or Double Talk?", Prime Minister Menzies was so incensed that he wrote a strong letter of complaint, which brought an abject apology.

It is becoming more obvious every day that the Federal system in Australia is being progressively destroyed. This destruction has proceeded in spite of Federal Government whose leaders have in the past paid considerable lip service to the Federal system. If the Federal Constitution is to be saved, it is certain that effective resistance must come from the States. We make a special appeal to our Victorian readers to ascertain from their Liberal and Country Party Members just how far they are prepared to take their resistance. At present members of the present Liberal Government in Victoria are, as far as we can ascertain, the most likely of all State Members to make a stand if given sufficient public support.

Apart from the talk amongst Victorian Liberals about fighting for a restoration of State affairs, there is at present renewed enthusiasm in some parts of Australia for the creation of new States. But it is essential advocates of decentralisation face the fact that real decentralisation is impossible without decentralised control of money. While we strongly agree that the restoration of taxing powers to the States would be a step in the right direction, we must also draw attention to the fact that taxation is not the only source of revenue State Governments depend upon for their activities. They are most dependent upon what are called "loan funds", and the volume of such funds is at present firmly controlled by the Commonwealth. The first major blow at the Federal system was delivered with the Financial Agreement, which even Mr. R. G. Menzies, then a State Member, strongly condemned as a blow against the sovereignty of the States.

If the Commonwealth implemented financial principles such as we suggest, the States would, like all other bodies, be able to operate to the satisfaction of individuals. But any State desirous of obtaining real sovereignty at present should give serious consideration, not only to fighting to obtain taxing powers back, but to making use of State banking powers, which could be used constitutionally without worrying too much about Dr. Coombs and the financial masters at Canberra. So long as there is a Commonwealth Monopoly of Credit, Federalism is dead.

While the woman remains in the home the home remains a fortress where children feel safe and needed. Now they are handicaps, parcels to be left till called for at the crèche or the day nursery. And for the older children, home is a dead place without the mother, a place they hastily desert for the street. And there starts trouble.

I said while the woman can remain at home, home is a fortress. In fact, woman herself was described as a fortress, the last fortress, said a revolutionary Masonic writer of the last century, the last fortress which the forces of obscurantism (by which he meant religion) place in the path of progress. A woman who remains secure in her home will insist on caring for her own children in her own way; she will decline the interference of the State in its health and education. She will, in fact, encourage independence and self-reliance and teach moral truths. All these things are a bar to what is now called Progress. So one can see why there has been what is called a trend towards women going into industry, towards, I should say, driving women into industry.

WOMEN IN EARLY AMERICA

When Alexis de Tocqueville was analysing the reasons for the progress of democracy in America in the 30's of the last century—when American democracy was in its hey-day—he came to this conclusion:

"As for myself, I do not hesitate to avow, that although the women of the United States are confined within the narrow circle of domestic life, and their situation is in some respects one of extreme dependence, I have nowhere seen women occupying a loftier position; and if I were asked . . . to what the singular prosperity and growing strength of that people ought mainly to be attributed, I should reply: To the superiority of their women." (Vol. 2, p. 225.)

There is no need for me to emphasize what a different picture he would paint today. Debt and taxes, hire purchase, the super-mart and the deep freeze, the futilities of the women's club, high-pressure advertising and corrupt journalism, all these have gone to whittle down or quite destroy the apparently rock-like characters which the Frenchman so greatly admired (even if he obviously preferred the more yielding charm of the European woman) and which you find so wonderfully sketched in the tales of the Maine coast by the immortal Sarah Orme Jewett in that little classic "The Country of the Pointed Firs".

All of which sounds as if I have become inoculated with the pessimism of the age which I have been trying to describe for you, just as Graham Greene, as zone of

his critics says, begins to reflect in his own face the evil at which he has stared too hard and too long. Let us in conclusion switch from the negative to the positive—that is, from lies to truth, from the Evil One to God, and imagine what could happen if the two principles which I mentioned at the beginning of this talk were allowed free play. The world would not be perfect for men are not perfect. The world would not be simple, for men are too complex. But who could endure an uncomplicated Utopia? (I can remember in my first year in North Queensland—growing tired of the everlasting sun, and longing for a grey day!) Men as I said are not simple, but a simple change in the financial mechanism would set in motion all kinds of human complexities that are now frustrated and whose possibilities are endless. If we could afford it financially, who would choose to live herded in the great industrial cities? Wouldn't automation and a liberal income allow us to spend only a few hours a week there and escape to rural communities—or solitudes as you prefer—where the handicrafts and the arts could flourish, and (if we are to survive something must be done about this quickly) where men could grow food uncontaminated by chemicals, and keep that contact with the soil and natural things which appear to be necessary to a really balanced life.

A SYNTHESIS NECESSARY

People have often felt, even the least philosophic of them, that the world as we know it is falling apart. The philosophic say it lacks integration . . . that is, it is disintegrating. And there is no aspect of modern life of which this is not, generally speaking, true.

Take modern art—on second thoughts, my audience will probably say, "No: you take it: I don't like it." Well, I'll take it, but just for the moment and for an example of what I have said about the world falling apart. Picasso, the Spanish originator of what is called modern art, startled the world back in 1907 by painting "Les Demoiselles d'Avignon" with such a cynical, bestial leer about them that the only way to interpret it was as a prophecy of the bestiality that the Great War was about to let loose on the world. His more recent pictures have been described in a theological work on the influence of Satan in history, art and literature, as bearing "all the marks of the diabolic spirit, now engaged in an attack on the masterpieces of Creation itself, i.e., the human body." For this painter takes all separate features of the human face, which has burst into fragments as though from some high explosive, and put them together again, but according to no principle but that of incongruity. These leering puzzles are perhaps the most typical examples of that

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Important Book by British M.P.

Exposes America's Anti- British Policies

In these days when the peoples of the British Empire are expected to accept the carefully fostered myth that the policy-makers of the U.S.A. are the loving friends and allies of the British peoples, it is refreshing news when a member of the British Parliament, and a Conservative member at that, writes a book designed to show that the present desperate plight of the British world is primarily the result of anti-British policies imposed from the U.S.A.

Mr. John Biggs-Davidson, in "The Uncertain Ally", shows convincingly and in most moderate language that the policy-makers in the U.S.A. have consistently used financial policy since the First World War to destroy the economic independence of the British peoples everywhere. Mr. Biggs-Davidson reveals how American "aid", both during and after the war, was in reality designed to further the economic domination of the British.

The author frankly discusses the contribution, which American financial and economic policy made towards starting the Second World War, the hatred of President Roosevelt for the British Empire, how Roosevelt forced the Japanese into the war, and thus provided Roosevelt and his backers with the opportunity to bring America in at a suitable time. Some revealing factual material concerning the relative contributions made by the British and Americans during the last war is given. Mr. Biggs-Davidson shows that the American policy-makers have consistently worked to undermine the British in the Middle East, robbed them of their Persian oil industry, and used the threat of economic sanctions to defeat the British attempt to retake Suez.

Reference is made to Mr. Bernard Baruch's plan for international control of all atomic power; also to other policies for centralising power. In many ways this book leaves much to be desired, and with some of the conclusions we would disagree. But within the framework the author has decided to write this book, he has revealed the major vital aspect of the real international politics of 1917 until the present time. Needless to say, "The Uncertain Ally" has received no press references in Australia—as far as we know—good or bad.

But Picasso himself would not admit that he was trying to depict the essence of this disintegrated age. He would say he was searching for beauty.

We will produce nothing great in art or literature until we re-integrate the scattered features of creation, until we realize that modern literature, as well as art, is not constructive, but destructive. We must find a synthesis . . . something that unites. And Christianity gives this and Social Credit flows from that faith.

Linking and merging what is right and true in the machine age with what was so satisfying and good in the ages that went before it, we could produce a generation that was clear-sighted where the generation of the Virginia Woolfes and Hemingways was dim-sighted and short-sighted; a generation that was sound and integrated where the generation of Picasso and his imitators is destructive and disintegrated.

Possible? Impossible? In a recent issue of that bright and so very sane little English paper, "Housewives Today", I found just the answer to questions like that. An old Korean quoted in this paper was asked how he proposed to deal with impossibilities. He replied:

"BETWEEN THE POSSIBLE AND THE IMPOSSIBLE LIES THE MEASURE OF MAN'S WILL."

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The Meaning of the Increased British Bank Rate

Even the worldwide terror-propaganda concerning the Russian satellite has not taken people's minds off a problem much more threatening than any scientific achievement. Finding "Real Reason for Excessive Taxation"

Under the above heading, the following excellent letter from Mr. James Guthrie was featured in "The Mercury" of September 11:

Sir Arthur Fadden defended his appropriation of a surplus of £119 million above the need for revenue by the statement:

"We raised every penny we could from loans within Australia and overseas . . . We had to get money from revenue . . . The only alternative source was Central Bank Credit . . . The Government refused this kind of finance because the inevitable result would be to accentuate inflation."

This is a typical example of the specious mixture of truths, half-truths and falsehoods used in a deliberate attempt to mislead the people.

It would be interesting to know why it should be necessary for the Treasurer of Australia to hide from the people these facts:

(1) That practically every business and Government is financed from day to day by bank credit.

(2) That neither the great Snowy River scheme nor the latest Hydro-Electric scheme in Tasmania were financed out of the savings of the people.

(3) That the skill and resources of a country, and the ability to build capital equipment have got nothing whatever to do with the number of pennies I or my neighbours save.

"The Mercury" says "the outlay on capital works is a legitimate charge against the future." I would like to ask why we are asked to pay for capital works (railways, built by people long since dead, and also to pay for capital works for people not yet born. It cannot be right both ways.

I suggest that there is only one way to find the real reason for excessive taxation, and that is to realise that the policy-makers behind that tax-collecting department are not fools, and that the results they are obtaining are what they plan to obtain — that is, to rob every individual of any chance to accumulate a reserve.

Seen in this light, Sir Arthur Fadden is one of the most dangerous and successful Communists in Australia, and it is time the Liberal Party told us its policy—if any.

WITNESS

It was the evidence of ex-Communist secret agent, Whittaker Chambers, before the House Committee on Un-American Activities, which caused top Communist espionage agent in the U.S.A., Alger Hiss, to be indicted and convicted on a charge of perjury. Not only the American people but many people in other countries were startled by the disclosure that the official who advised President Roosevelt, helped draft the disastrous Yalta Agreement in 1945, and who was the first Secretary-General of the United Nations Organisation, was a Communist agent.

Before being finally convicted, Alger Hiss, aided by some of the most influential people in America, fought back against Chambers, who was subjected to a whispering campaign described by one prominent American writer as "one of the most repellent in modern history". Chambers replies to this campaign in one of the most important autobiographies of our times. Not only does this book deal exhaustively with the Hiss-Chambers battle before the Committee on Un-American Activities and the Courts; it is a moving human document which explains how Chambers first became a Communist, his work in the secret Communist apparatus, how he met Alger Hiss and worked with him, and how eventually he came to repudiate Communism.

Near the conclusion of his book, Chambers makes one of the most important observations yet made on the Hiss-Chambers case: "No feature of the Hiss case is more obvious, or more troubling as history, than the jagged fissure, which it did not so much open as reveal, between the plain men and women of the nation, and those who affected to act, think and speak for them. It was, not invariably, but in general, the 'best people' who were for Alger Hiss and who were prepared to go to almost any length to protect and defend him. It was the enlightened and the powerful, the clamorous proponents of the open-mind and the common man, who kept their minds shut in a pro-Hiss psychosis, of a kind which, in an individual patient, means the simple failure of the ability to distinguish between reality and unreality, and, in a nation, is a warning of the end."

"Witness" must be read and studied by those who want to know the truth about Alger Hiss and his part in the Communist conspiracy in the U.S.A. Every student of Communism and international affairs must have this work on his shelves. No one with an unbiassed mind can read it without realising that Hiss was undoubtedly guilty of the charges made against him.

It has a will to live, to enjoy, to adorn and to beautify. It loves life. It is a gracious thing, endearing itself to us by intimate associations. It is far from what we might at first suppose it to be. And it is sympathy and spiritual outlook ("No Pagan ever saw the same tree as Wordsworth") that makes all the difference. Reflection finds its organic life near to ours. So living is the tree that we may regard it as personal. Typical of things on Earth with purpose and meaning, it becomes an object of affection. So, love of Nature advances in us a truer knowledge of ourselves, of the higher forms of life, and of the reality beyond all symbols. Error thus

gives place to truth as we cross the golden bridge that stretches from the finite to the infinite. Indifference glows into sympathy; while, in the semblance of beauty there miraculously appears an unearthly loveliness. Potential good reaches towards its fulfilment, as the imprisoned mind discovers its freedom. In the environment of its liberty it welcomes "Heaven in earth, and God in man".
