FREEDOM TO RAPE

One of the most incredible aspects of the current international situation, is the widespread acceptance of the view that the future of a Civilisation which was slowly evolved over 2,000 years, should be decided by counting heads in the "United" Nations, where an increasing number of the members are supposed to be representatives of the "newly emerging African nations." The bigger becomes the Afro-Asian bloc in the "United" Nations, the greater the power of the Communists to manipulate this bloc to further the objective of World Government.

Not only are the nations of Western Civilization being destroyed by the surrender of power to the "United" Nations; they are actually financing their own destruction by making finance available to enable the organisation to continue. The overwhelming majority of the members of the "United" Nations are behind in their subscriptions, the worst offenders being the Communists. One of Mr. U. Thant's right-hand advisers, Mr. Ralph Bunch, has recently stated that there was no fear of the "United" Nations collapsing through lack of finance, that its credit was good and that its creditors "were not pressing." Those who understand the mechanisms of International Finance will appreciate the significance of this statement. And the issue of "United" Nations bonds now being bought by the Western nations, including Australia, have deeper implications than most people realise. The activities of the "United" Nations are clearly to be brought under more direct control by International Finance. Which provides further evidence of the association between International Finance and world revolution.

The "United" Nations has become the chief instrument of world revolution today. But only because many people in the Western nations, particularly the U.S.A., have accepted uncritically the persistent propaganda concerning "revolutionary" and "emerging" Africa. "The new nations are craving freedom and independence," the propaganda claims. And of course large numbers of naive Church spokesmen have been persuaded that it is the Christian's duty to work for "self-government" for the oppressed natives, and to ensure that they take their places in the "United" Nations as quickly as possible. It is true that the realities of the Congo, even though not fully-publicised, have shaken some misled Christians, but many still persist in supporting unrestricted freedom for the African, as witnessed by their support of the campaign again South Africa.

"Self-determination of territories without intellectual political and social preparation is a myth, and we can only conclude in the face of present-day circumstances that the world is living on falsehood. There are, unfortunately, even Christians who allow themselves to be carried away by these winds of history."

The Cardinal warned, "We are in a kind of phase of spiritual decomposition of civilisation. Words no longer mean the same thing, and many cannot distinguish goodness and truth."

Many can no longer distinguish the truth because truth has been blotted out by highly financed propaganda, most of it emanating from the U.S.A. The truth is that freedom in Africa has not resulted in any of the developments promised by those advocating it. Freedom in the Congo has meant freedom to rape, to murder, to practise cannibalism. A Belgian Priest who escaped from the Kivu Province in the Congo said that even in his most frightful visions of hell he could not imagine the frightful things done to Europeans. There was the 75-year-old nun who had both her arms and pelvis broken when thrown from a truck, and was then raped by eleven Congolese soldiers as she lay helpless. Nuns and priests were forced to dance naked on sharp stones and to blaspheme. Portugal is viciously attacked in the "United" Nations on Angola, with the U.S.A. voting with the Communists, but little publicity has been given to the terrible crimes committed in Angola by Congolese invaders. The world's press has, for example, never featured the dreadful massacre in the Angola town of Madimba, where every woman and child was murdered after an orgy of rape.

However, some Church leaders have had the courage to draw attention to some necessary truths. One of these is Cardinal Concalves Cerejeira, Patriarch of Lisbon, who recently said that it was a "myth" that backward peoples can govern themselves without long and careful preparation. These truths are brushed aside by the advocates of freedom for people who are still largely under the control of witch doctors. The advocates of freedom will, of course, point to men like Tom Mboya of Kenya, claiming they are both educated and moderate. Mboya was recently married in a Christian Church, but the same Mboya campaigned for political power in Kenya with a picture of Jomo Kenyatta on his shirtfront. He is a Kenyatta man. Every African who voted for Mboya was in fact supporting Kenyatta and endorsing what was done during the

Rabbi Feinberg's Activities in Canada: We recently commented on the fact that although Soviet Russia is supposed to be "anti-Semitic", a majority of Jewish leaders and journals in the U.S.A. are pro-Communist. A special article by Mr. Pat Walsh, former Royal Canadian Mounted Police undercover agent for many years, in the December issue of *The Canadian Intelligence Service* reveals that the Soviet's leading fellow traveller in Canada is Rabbi Abraham L. Feinberg. Mr. Walsh traces Feinberg's history of pro-Communist activities over 20 years. Although he has now lived in Canada for 18 years, he has been denied citizenship rights.

It is true that there are a few Jewish spokesmen in both Canada and the U.S.A. expressing opposition to Communism, but they are a very small minority. And it may be significant that most of these are not political Zionists.

Australia's Trade Surplus with Communists: Australia had a trade surplus of £25.829.000 with Communist countries in three months ending on September 30, 1961. This was the second largest trade surplus for any of the groups to which Australia exports. Exports from Australia to the Communist countries rose from £5.363.000 in the September quarter of 1960 to £28,159.000 in the September quarter of 1961.

From a realistic point of view Australia's favourable balance of trade with the Communist countries is a loss. Australia has sent more production to the Communist countries than has been received in exchange.

Mr. Brian Fitzpatrick's Pro-Communist Line: In a recent letter in The Herald, Melbourne. Mr. Brian Fitzpatrick, general Secretary of the Australian Council for Civil Liberties, cleverly uses the case of the three Portuguese seamen seeking political asylum in Australia to work in a little pro-Communist propaganda. Mr. Fitzpatrick says that the three Portuguese "seem to be at least as well qualified as Erwin Viks, whom our Government has refused to extradite to the Soviet Union." Mr. Fitzpatrick then goes on to say that "according" to the Soviet Ambassador," Viks is wanted in connection with the killing of 12,000 innocent people. No sane person would take any notice of the claims of a Communist representative. As Mr. Fitzpatrick is certainly not insane, then why does he help spread Communist claims? A study of his pro-Communist activities provides the answer to this question.

The manipulation of an unrestrained majority vote can and is leading to the destruction of individual rights and freedoms everywhere. A majority vote should not enable a Government to do as it likes for its term of office. Only constitutional principles rooted in reality can protect the natural rights of the individual.

Confused Thinking on Automation at Vatican: If the true purpose of production is consumption, and if required production should be carried out in the shortest possible time, then automation should be regarded as the means of freeing the individual from the demands of production so that he has more time for self-development. It is the means for lifting the old curse of Adam. But in an eight-point proposal in a programme outlined in a letter written in Pope John's name by his Secretary of State, Cardinal Cicognani, to a Canadian Social Week assembly, it is stated "that social justice demands that immediate negative results of automation should not be borne exclusively by the workers or by certain groups of workers. Rather should such negative results weigh equally, or even more heavily, on investors or capital and, when opportune, even upon all members of the political community."

But why should the introduction of labour-saving automatic machinery, a logical development of the industrial arts, weigh upon anyone? Why should not all benefit from the development? And the only answer to this is the Marxist claim that as "labour produces all wealth"; no individual is entitled to get claims to wealth—money except through some form of economic activity. Unless the truth is faced that the true purpose of labour-saving machinery is to save labour, and that financial rules must be modified to provide the individual with a financial dividend in one form or another, and increasing free time, then automation can only hasten the development of the Slave State.

Mr. Tshombe Names the Enemy: It is not surprising that the Katanga leader, Mr. Tshombe, is being smeared in the world's press. He fights for independence against Communist domination. He is prepared to keep the Europeans, particularly the Belgians, in Katanga because he knows that they are essential for the development of the country. But he has now committed an even worse crime; he has attacked financial interests in the U.S.A. "Behind the mask of the United Nations we find the methods of the Americans who have financed and who still finance war and disorder in Katanga . . . the State Department is in the hands of greedy financiers who will not stop their activities until the Congo is a colony under their economic domination and until Katanga's copper has been eliminated from world competition."

The Limitations of the Majority Vote: Visiting British astronomer Professor Bondi had some sensible things to say in a recent interview with the Sydney *Daily Telegraph*. He said that while it was essential for people in a democracy to be politically conscious, it was equally important to have some restraint on majority rule. "Democracy gives you the right to do some things—but not all things. In democracy, as in science, truth cannot be ascertained

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Mr. Tshombe also said that last December he was refused a visa to go to America because it was feared that "my presence there will enlighten the American people." Those financial interests in the U.S.A. are prepared to destroy the Tshombe regime even if it means a Communist-

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dominated Congo. But undoubtedly these groups feel that this is preferable to Mr. Tshombe and his Belgian supporters continuing to develop successfully at least one part of Africa. Here once again is the close relationship between Big Finance in the U.S.A. and International Communism.

Big Finance Behind Pro-Common Market Campaign

The League of Rights has received a letter from "The Commonwealth Movement" in Britain, which is one of the organisations opposing Britain's entry into the European Common Market, in which the following revealing information is provided:

"Here in Britain we are fighting an uphill fight, not so much against apathy, but against the vast propaganda which is being put out by the U.K. Branch of the European Movement. This organisation, which is financed by some of the Common Market countries (Germany in particular and also by many of the international financial concerns, has already spent between £250,090 and £400,000 on propaganda in this country. For instance, it has circularised every Member of Parliament and Member of the House of Lords with expensive sets of books on the Common Market (estimated cost $\pounds 6$ per set). It has organised dinners and luncheons for (1) Bankers, 2 Industrialists, (3) Professional people, etc. All free, in order that such persons may hear speeches and lectures by pro-Common Market speakers. Then it has sent out speakers" among them some Labour and Conservative M.P.'s) to organisations all over the country. In addition it has influenced the policy of a number of newspapers. Several large newspapers have recently been acquired by a big newspaper syndicate, and the firm that has conducted the financial side of such takeovers is the principal financial supporter of the U.K. Branch of the European Movement."

The campaign of opposition is rapidly mounting in Britain, but those promoting it appeal for the greatest possible co-operation from Commonwealth countries. The League of Rights brochure continues to be hailed throughout the British world as the finest publication on the issue. One group of Loyalists in New Zealand is seeking 5,000 copies for distribution. 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Mau Mau terror. This was the period when African natives tortured their victims to death and ate their brains, mutilated European men and women and forced them to eat their own eyes and genitals. 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Has Macmillan Government Already Committed Britain?

On August 10th last, Britain formally applied for membership of the European Economic Community. The Government has repeatedly emphasised that the decision was the first step towards discovering whether suitable terms could be negotiated. But in reality, is this the case?

On that fateful day, the Chairman of the Community's Council of Ministers, the West German Minister of Economics, Professor Ludwig Erhard, gave this toast: "From this point onwards there is no way back."

Mr. Gunnar Heckscher, the leader of the Conservative Party, in neutralist Sweden, has expressed the view that "having entered negotiations, neither the Six nor the British Government could afford to let them fail, though there were no illusions about the problems involved."

Then the Chairman of Imperial Chemical Industries, ex-Civil Servant Mr. Paul Chambers, has declared that "the opening of formal negotiations is of great significance, because failure to agree on conditions of entry would be interpreted all over the world as evidence of a deep and serious rift between Britain and her allies."

The great danger is that the negotiations will become, in point of fact, a long-term softening-up process. In this respect, the following comments are significant: —

Reporting from Paris, *Daily Telegraph* political observer Walter Farr has suggested, "the consensus of opinion among senior officials of the E.E.C. and their staffs is that Britain's eventual entry is inevitable, but they believe the conditions set by the Six will be severe. They expect that a somewhat shaken Mr. Macmillan will go before the House of Commons towards the end of 1962 and plead that although the terms offered by the Six fall far short of those proposed by the British Government, he must recommend them in order to prevent a lasting division in Europe."

During the House of Commons debate on the Common Market in early August, former party whip Sir Robert Grimston warned: "I have been long enough in politics and in this House to know that once we start off, the momentum is such that we are very likely to find ourselves being taken far further afield than we originally intended, unless we lay down fairly stringent conditions at the beginning. It is a well-known technique — the softening-up process. The House is told, 'You have not got to agree to it now; you just say, "Let us have talks" '. That goes on for a bit and a little later on the Government say, 'This has turned out rather differently to what we thought; it is a very serious matter'. A three-line whip is put on and they go still further." In the Government, Britain's Minister of Aviation, Mr. Peter Thorneycroft, would be most conversant with this "softening-up process" to which Sir Robert refers. Mr. Thorneycroft is a leading advocate of Free Trade and of British membership of the Common Market. In addition, he has long-standing views on the unification of Europe.

In a pamphlet entitled "Design for Europe" and published in 1947, Mr. Thorneycroft as the principal author publicised this opinion: "No Government dependent upon a democratic vote, could possibly agree in advance to the sacrifices which any adequate plan must involve. The people must be led slowly and unconsciously into the abandonment of their traditional economic defences."

Referring to the proposed Treaty of Rome negotiations in the House of Commons on August 2, the Prime Minister, Mr. Harold Macmillan, asked "the House to give Ministers the authority—not to sign a treaty—but to find out on what honourable basis such a treaty could be put forward for the decision of the House."

The Prime Minister must be held to this statement. Parliament must not be presented with a *fait accompli* or some form of Hobson's choice; it must be allowed to consider the results of the negotiations in the light of Britain's sovereignty and traditions of independence, and the future development of the British Commonwealth and Britain's economy, particularly in the agricultural sector. No other factor should be allowed to affect the decision. Parliament must be prepared and able, if necessary, to repudiate the Treaty of Rome.

HAS HEATH GONE TOO FAR?

When Britain's Lord Privy Seal, Mr. Edward Heath, formally opened negotiations with the Six in Paris on October 10th last, his statement—the very basis of negotiation—commenced:

"In saying that we wish to join the European Economic Community we mean that we desire to become full, wholehearted active members in building the new Europe...

"Her Majesty's Government are ready to subscribe fully to the aims you have set."

It is not at all surprising that the Macmillan Government was particularly anxious to safeguard the secrecy of this speech by Mr. Heath. In those opening paragraphs, the Government committed Britain to considerably more than Parliament allowed on the 3rd August when the Commons merely authorised the Government to discover whether satisfactory arrangements could be made to meet the special interests of the United Kingdom, the Commonwealth and the European Free Trade Association.
