EDITORIAL.

NATIONAL CHRISTIAN ACTION MOVEMENT LAUNCHED IN CANADA

Mr. Ron Gostick, publisher of "The Canadian Intelligence Service", and one of the most competent opponents of International Communism on the North American Continent today, is at the moment working across Canada with Mr. Eric Butler. At Mr. Butler's first meeting in Canada, at Montreal on Sunday, June 16, Mr. Gostick reported on the progress of the development of one of the most significant movements in the British Commonwealth today, the Christian Action Movement. The following statement concerning this Movement was read to the meeting by Mr. Gostick:

PREAMBLE

We believe that man's apostasy from God has resulted in the disintegration of true community among men in the progressive diminution of freedom, and in the emergence of the totalitarian state. We recognize the spiritual nature of the life-and-death struggle throughout the world today.

Strong in our faith in our Lord Jesus Christ as God the Son, and King of all Life, we pledge ourselves to fight under His banner for a Christ-centered Canada in which every phase of our national life will be responsive to His Divine Law.

Conscious of our Christian responsibilities, and strengthened by worship and prayer, we shall strive for the following policy:

STATEMENT OF POLICY

THE CROWN:

We stand for the preservation of Canada as a constitutional monarchy, and as a member of the British Commonwealth of Nations; and we pledge our allegiance to our Sovereign, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, Her Heirs and Successors.

NATIONAL SOVEREIGNTY:

We stand for the preservation of Canada's national sovereignty as a sacred trust from Almighty God. We are implacably opposed to the surrender of any part of our national sovereignty to persons or institutions not subject to the Crown.

NATIONAL DEFENCE:

We believe it is the responsibility of the Federal Government to maintain defence forces adequate to discourage or repel any would-be aggressor, and to ensure that such forces of the Crown are equipped with effective weapons to discharge their obligations and to maintain peace with justice.

EXTERNAL AFFAIRS:

We declare that Canadian foreign policy must recognize the menace of the ideology, objectives, policy, and strategy of Communism in all its aspects, and of all other totalitarian doctrines.

We advocate close co-operation with other members of our Commonwealth family and with other free nations for collective security. We favour encouragement and support for all captive peoples in their struggle for independence, and for those who are defending freedom and resisting aggression.

We are implacably opposed to the support of any policy which will further the cause of Communism and other mancentred ideologies.

GOVERNMENT:

We acknowledge that all authority belongs to Almighty God and that this must be recognized in every aspect of national life by obedience to His Divine Law.

We proclaim that the office of Government should be recognized as a ministry responsible to Almighty God, and should function to safeguard freedom, to maintain justice, and to protect the sovereign integrity of the nation.

We reject completely the heresies that Parliament is supreme and that either elections or majority votes can determine principles, or should interfere with the Godgiven right and freedom of citizens.

We maintain that the various spheres of national life each has its distinctive function and should not impinge upon each other.

Therefore, we proclaim our belief in the limitation of the powers of government, which should operate strictly within the confines of its legitimate sphere. Independence from government should be assured to those spheres required to function within their respective domains with responsibility to God.

ECONOMICS — **FINANCE**:

We believe that Government and Industry, in accordance with their respective natures, have their own particular roles to play in the economy of the nation. It is the Government's function to create and maintain general conditions, which encourage personal initiative and responsibility, and further the national well being, with personal freedom.

Private enterprise, provided it is accompanied by a sense of Christian responsibility, generally offers the best guarantee to meet the needs of the nation.

We welcome the responsible application of science and technology, and we maintain that the resulting abundance and the leisure rendered possible should be made available for the benefit of all.

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NEWS COMMENTARY SELWYN LLOYD URGES "BOOST EMPIRE" PLAN

Readers will recall that they were recently urged in a confidential memorandum to support with letters Mr. Selwyn Lloyd, former British Chancellor of the Exchequer, who has been advocating a revived British Commonwealth. The following report, which appeared in the Daily Express London, of July 1, under the heading, "LLOYD HAS 'BOOST EMPIRE' PLAN" may be of significance.

"Mr. Selwyn Lloyd urged the Government at the weekend to show 'a new initiative' in its attitude to Commonwealth trading. He wants a Commonwealth export council set up on the lines of similar organisations formed to improve trade with North America and Europe. And he told his audience at a garden fete at Heswall Chesshire . . . that he had already put the idea up to 'that very great Commonwealth statesman, Sir Robert Menzies . . . He said he would warmly welcome it and give it every support within his power', said the former Chancellor."

THE ALBERTAN FABLE

The recent re-election of the Manning Government in Alberta for yet another term, with yet another overwhelming Parliamentary majority, (the majority of total votes cast is not nearly so substantial), will no doubt, provide a new stimulus to those money reformers who believe that Social Credit or what they think is Social Credit, can only be advanced through the support of party politics. There is little doubt that the people of the province of Alberta enjoy what is termed "good government." The Premier, Mr. Ernest Manning, is a first class political manager with an excellent sense of good public relations. But the Albertan Government which calls itself a Social Credit Government, does not even pretend to be advancing Social Credit - - unless it is indirectly by supporting the On-to-Ottawa movement. However, the voting for candidates calling themselves

Social Crediters at the last Federal Elections, does not suggest that Mr. Manning's Government is assisting much in this direction.

It is an unfortunate truth that Alberta has become to many Social Crediters around the world, what Soviet Russia is to the dupes of Communism. Loose reference is made to "debt-free Alberta" without any mention of the debt structure of municipal government. The Australian Federal Government is doing basically what the Albertan Government has done: using current financial revenue gained from taxation to finance capital works. Substantial oil revenues have enabled the Albertan Government to do much of which it mentions in its publicity. We are not denying that the Government has handled the development of oil and the revenues gained from oil, in a most competent manner. It has established Mr. Manning in the eyes of Conservative businessmen as a sound administrator, and there may be some truth in the rumour in Canada that Mr. Manning could be invited to take over the leadership of the Progressive Conservatives of Ottawa. But good administration in Alberta is not Social Credit, and those who use Alberta as an argument for Social Credit in other parts of the world, are deluding both themselves and other people.

We have before us one of the main pieces of recent preelection propaganda material put out in Alberta by the Canadian Social Crediter. It is a first-class public relations effort, but it can be read from beginning to end without learning anything about Social Credit. The tremendous material development of Alberta from the hungry thirties to the present day is brilliantly outlined. But every country in the world can boast the same type of developments over the same period. Alberta has shared in the tremendous expansion of credit, which started during the war, when previously unheard-of industrial achievements were realised, and has been continued in the post-war industrial revolution. We repeat: the Manning Government has taken advantage of the general postwar economic expansion, the result of a general credit policy which it no longer directly concerns itself about, and in particular the development of an excellent oil industry reasonably close to markets requiring it.

It is possible to give the Albertan Government full marks for many of its achievements without fostering the fable that these achievements are the results of Social Credit policies. The last time that the Manning Government took even a small step towards implementing a Social Credit principle was when a small dividend was declared against royalties from oil. But even this was soon discontinued, no doubt because of pressure. The Manning Government finds it much more comfortable to continue with a reputation for sound administration than to subject itself to criticism by attempting to take even a small step towards Social Credit principles. We state this, not in any spirit of criticism, but merely to try to help ensure that well-meaning people do not publicise fables at the expense of fact.

EDUCATIONISTS CONFORM TO A LIE

In the S.A. Teachers' Journal of June 1963, prominence is given to a "request for an amendment to income tax procedure" in certain cases where teachers are adversely affected. The Editorial in the same issue asks whether education policy puts the same accent on self-reliance and originality as it does on obedience and conformity. Yet, it says, stereotyped non-conformity ("pop" records, etc.) is several stages worse than stereotyped conformity.

Most Social Crediters are in sympathy with the above ideas. For over 40 years the oldest among us have directed attention to the truth that the basis of all taxation is wrong, and doing so "dared to stand alone". By the way, that knowledge is not obtainable from any "official" educational course; it can come only from individual initiative in the search for truth about finance. There is no stronger indictment of "official" education policy. It is ironical that educationists protest against taxation which affects themselves; yet all of their campaign propaganda to date attempts to brainwash other taxpayers into acceptance of sacrifices in service to the educational institution.

Conformity to truth is right, e.g. agreed rules of games, traffic, general conduct, etc. Conformity to fallacy is dead wrong, and among the most dangerous offenders are educationists who conform to the lie that the only way to finance education is by increasing taxation and debt. Can't they see that is the Policy of Domination: enslavement of the individual to the institution, or the State? Protagonists of Freedom cannot support the Campaign unless executives absorb some of the wisdom of the young woman teacher who wrote to the Student's Representative Council as follows:

"I agree with your aims to publicise defects in our educational system. However, I am surprised that most of you accept as a fact the idea that the only possible way of providing money is by taxation, and the inevitable outcome therefore will be increased taxation. There is no need to compare our expenditure with that of other countries. Our concern is what we can do with our own resources. If these were all employed, that is, no unused manpower, factories and farms etc., working at full capacity to provide our material needs, then, education could not be expanded except by transfer of resources from industry: we should have to reduce our consumption of food, clothing and gadgets by means of taxation.

"Obviously, that is not the situation. We have vast potential productivity in our unused manpower and factory and farm capacity. If 'full employment' is a worthy objective we need to increase consumption, the opposite of taxation. Taxation in all forms now takes approximately half a man's wages; no wonder there is interest in Communism. Now money is the means for inducing potential effort to become actual. Money is the easiest thing in the world to create; it is merely a matter of writing the figures in the authorised place. The limit is the amount that will induce the desired result WITHOUT OVER TAXING OUR RESOURCES, and that is pretty

considerable. War effort reversed for creativeness.

"Section 51 of the Constitution gives the Federal Government full power over money in all its forms. Section 504 in the report of the 1937 Royal Commission on Money and Banking states that the Commonwealth Bank (now Reserve Bank) 'can make money available to Governments and others free of any charge'. Obviously, our proper course is to urge the Government to use this power for financing the urgent increasing needs of education. Historian T. H. Buckle found that nothing of benefit to the people ever ORIGINATED from Government: it was started from outside and electors had to apply persistent pressure. I believe that public men with no confidence in their own judgment are easily bluffed by 'leave it to the "experts" ' in all matters of public finance. If a departure from economic fallacy is proposed they dare not break with 'conformity'. In this instance, however, the evidence of the Royal Commission, quoted above, clearly shows that in Australia's circumstances, further taxation is quite unwarranted. It is not 'Federal Aid' we want, but merely that our politicians do the job they are paid for."

FLUORIDATION NEWS

As the fluoridationists now have their guns trained on Melbourne's water supply it is felt that a Victorian anti-Fluoridation Association should be constituted, not necessarily under this name, but without delay. All those interested should contact the New Times office.

The anti-Fluoridation sub-committee of the Australian League of Rights has provided the following items of relevance and interest: —

- 1. Each Council of metropolitan Melbourne has one councillor (total of 50) with voting rights on the Melbourne Metropolitan Board of Works. These councillors should be contacted by anti-fluoridation actionists who live within the jurisdiction of the respective councils. The sub-committee reports that it will supply the names of the councillors in question to enquirers.
- 2. George Town (Tas.), which lies just across the Tamar River from Beaconsfield, which introduced fluoridation of its water supplies some time ago, rejected fluoridation by a poll recently. The wonders of fluoridation, it would seem, were unable to ford the noble Tamar.
- 3. A Western Australian dentist has relinquished his practice to become a full-time officer of the Western Australian Dental School, which promotes Fluoridation. His salary is to be £3000 per annum.
- 4. The Sydney Water Board voted against fluoridation of Sydney's water supplies by 4 votes to 2 (29/5/63). The Sydney City Council decided against Fluoridation a few weeks previously after consideration of data supplied by Dr. P. Sutton of Melbourne, and by Sir Arthur Amies, of Melbourne University. Sir Stanton Hicks, of Adelaide University, and the anti-Fluoridation Campaign of N.S.W. also supplied data. Professor Martin, of Sydney University supplied evidence in support of Fluoridation. 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- 5. Tenterfield (N.S.W.) Council rejected Fluoridation (26/5/63) of its water supplies after holding a referendum (voting 999 to 407). This Council had purchased equipment some years before and also some of its councillors were in favour of Fluoridation. Nevertheless, the ratepayers were afforded their democratic right to settle this issue by the vote. The ever-busy Professor Martin had visited Tenterfield on more than one occasion to put his case.
 - The Government of N.S.W. has agreed to pay half the cost of Fluoridation in that State.
- 6. Dr. G. L. Waldbott, M.D., F.A.C.P., F.A.C.A., F.A.A.A., F.A.C.C.P. of Detroit, U.S.A., has issued the following statement:—

"Damage to the brain is one of the adverse effects of drinking fluoridated water. Patients afflicted with chronic fluoride intoxication suffer loss of memory and inability to concentrate. Neurological manifestations of the kind encountered in acute fluoride poisoning, spastic paralysis and convulsions, migraine-like headaches and loss of co-ordination of muscular power in arms and legs have been described likewise in chronic poisoning."

EDITORIAL

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We stand for the individual's right to own property. We recognize that this right carries with it the responsibility of every person to use his property to the glory of God and as a trust for the benefit of the nation.

We advocate a monetary system, which, while conserving our national resources, will serve such an economic policy, and stimulate the optimum production and the just distribution of goods and services.

EDUCATION:

We believe that all parents are responsible for the education of their children, and should have an opportunity to provide the education of their choice without financial penalty. And, specifically, we proclaim the right of Christian parents to ensure that their children receive a Christ-centered education.

LABOUR:

We believe that Christian principles require the application of justice, co-operation and consultation in employeremployee relations; and that these principles condemn the use of violence, intimidation or coercion.

We recognize the individual's fundamental right to be free to enter into association with others to gain lawful objectives, which they desire in common, and to be free to contract out of any such association.

Therefore, in the field of labour relations, we favour the abolition of any law or practice, which compels citizens to join or support financially any organization as a condition of employment.

COMMUNICATIONS:

We assert that one of the functions of Government is to uphold the freedom and independence of the press and other mass media of communication against monopoly control, and to establish and maintain appropriate standards.

We do not deem it the Government's responsibility to provide citizens with their news, political commentaries or cultural entertainment.
