### THE SIGNIFICANCE OF ERIC BUTLER'S CANADIAN TOUR

In a report forwarded to us from New Zealand, where he is at present engaged in yet one more nation-wide tour, Mr. Eric Butler states that one of the highlights of his intensive Canadian tour with Mr. Ron Gostick, editor of "The Canadian Intelligence Service", was the final event, a Seminar in Vancouver which was conducted over a whole afternoon and evening, with a break for dinner at the Seminar, during which informal discussion was possible between students. The Vancouver Seminar was not only the first of its kind held in Canada; those wishing to attend were required to enrol in advance at five dollars per person.

Three students travelled hundreds of miles from the U.S.A. to attend. Those responsible for this Seminar agreed that it was a major "break-through" in evolving the type of technique necessary to advance in the recently launched Canadian Christian Action Movement. The Vancouver Seminar was under the exclusive control of Mr. Butler, who said that he was most impressed with both attendance and results achieved.

During the four weeks he was in Canada, Mr. Butler travelled right across the nation from Montreal to Vancouver, and during that period gave no less than 26 separate addresses. Some of these addresses were to Service organisations meeting at lunchtime. Mr. Butler reports that the responses to his addresses on the British Commonwealth were one of the most encouraging features of the Canadian tour. "I am satisfied that there is such a deeply-rooted feeling that the British Commonwealth should not be permitted to disintegrate, that if this feeling can be properly tapped and channelled in support of constructive policies, the British world could be on the eve of its greatest era," writes Mr. Butler.

In spite of his heavy lecture programme, Mr. Butler made a short visit to the United States to meet Mr. Robert Welch of the John Birch Society, and spent four days at Ottawa meeting political leaders and members of all the political parties except the Socialists. Taped interviews were done with Dr. Robert Thompson, leader of the Social Credit group, and Senator Grattan O'Leary, a prominent Canadian newspaperman. A full report on the Canadian political situation will be provided later. Mr. Butler writes of Mr. Robert Welch, "Here is beyond doubt a most remarkable man. And he and his colleagues have built a movement which I now know must be causing the enemies of Western Civilization the gravest concern. Just prior to leaving San Francisco to fly to New Zealand, I read with great interest the vicious attack upon the John Birch Society by Rockefeller, who, significantly, claims that the John Birch Society and other 'right-wing extremists' are now threatening to dominate the American Republican Party". Rockefeller claims that the

John Birch Society is more dangerous than the Communists. During a short stay in Seattle, U.S.A., Mr. Butler had a long interview with Dr. F. Exner, an expert on fluoridation.

Mr. Butler states that his previous high opinion of the significance of Mr. Ron Gostick's work was confirmed by his recent tour. "I was most impressed with the response right across Canada as Mr. Gostick followed me at meetings and outlined the Christian Action Movement, what it stood for, and how it proposed to move forward. Mr. Gostick indicated how this new Movement was going to start bringing home to Canadians the importance of relating politics, economics and financial policies to fundamental Christian values and principles."

Mr. Gostick's work is not only significant because of what it is accomplishing in Canada; his *Canadian Intelligence Service* now reaches deep into the U.S.A., thus bringing many Americans in touch with the stream of ideas which this journal exists to advance.

Although the Canadian tour was held during the summer holiday season, meetings were well attended. Mr. Butler is most impressed with the fact that many young people showed a keen desire to come to grips with fundamental issues. "There is a great ferment," he writes, "and night after night we were up until the early hours of the morning discussing issues arising out of the meetings."

In spite of the tremendous strain of the Canadian tour, Mr. Butler arrived in New Zealand on July 17 ready for a heavy four weeks' campaign in this country. The brief report we have given of the Canadian tour gives but a bare outline of what was accomplished by Mr. Gostick and Mr. Butler. The full significance of the Canadian tour will not be evident until some time in the future. Already certain developments arising out of this tour are of the greatest significance, and we hope to be reporting to supporters about these some time later this year. Upon his return to Australia Mr. Butler will be reporting fully to supporters concerning the deeper implications of the Canadian tour. We can assure them that they will be most encouraged.

## VOTING CIVILIZATION TO DEATH

Having accepted internally the perversion of democracy, which claims that rights and values are decided by the unrestricted majority vote principle, the Western nations now find themselves in the process of acquiescing in the destruction of their Civilization by majority voting in the "United" Nations. As the "United" Nations becomes dominated by the Communists, who specifically repudiate the very foundations of traditional society, and the less civilized peoples of the world, some of whom are little better than primitive barbarians, then the extension of the majority vote principle can be used to destroy the more civilized nations, who are in a minority.

If anyone had suggested before the last war that the time would come when the Communist-dominated countries, in which millions of human beings have been liquidated, would be able to join with "countries" like Ghana to expel Portugal from an international body because of alleged "genocide" in her African territories, he would have been laughed at. But some frightening developments are taking place today. And one of the most frightening of these developments is that in the "United" Nations. Western nations like Britain, France and the U.S.A. are practically supporting the enemies of Civilization by merely abstaining when a vital vote is taken.

Unless the unrestricted majority vote principle can be exposed for the menace that it is, then for the first time in the recorded history of man, a Civilization could permit itself to be voted out of existence.

## FOR THE RECORD

It has been said that the capacity of the human mind for self-delusion is unlimited. Having read the worldwide comments on the nuclear test-ban agreement, we would agree with this observation. The non-Communist world has now had over 40 years of experience of "agreements" with Communists. The overwhelming majority of these have been blatantly broken by the Communists after they had served their purpose. Any "agreement" made with Communists must be assessed against Communist dialectics. As dialectics is a foreign subject to most Western politicians, they continue to make fools of themselves, and to lead the West closer to final disaster.

So far from sharing the current views concerning "better relations" and "peaceful co-existence" with the Communists, we believe that the West is on the eve of the most critical period in the real war for the world. We will be dealing with this matter more exhaustively in the near future. But we are going on record immediately in order that there is no question of being wise after the events to come.

## AUSTRALIA AND "HOME RULE" FOR FIJI

The demand on Britain, by the UN Special Committee on Colonialism, that it immediately grant "home-

rule" to Fiji, brings the world revolution just another step closer to Australia and New Zealand. We suggest that Australians carefully note that, although this move was initiated by the Communists in the UN Committee, the original draft resolution being prepared by Soviet Russia, the Australian Government UN representative did not stand with the British representative in rejecting this proposal. Australia joined the four nations, which merely abstained from voting on the issue. This attitude is not good enough. Needless to say, the U.S.A. also joined the abstaining.

The Australian Government should know (or does it?) that to introduce "fully-representative" Government in Fiji under present conditions would mean anarchy. Every informed person knows that the indigenous Fijians are openly and actively opposed to home-rule. They are in fact demanding the right to retain the British protection promised their forefathers with the Deed of Cession, which was negotiated with Queen Victoria. A general franchise to all Fijians at present would in fact mean handing over control of the indigenous natives to the Indian immigrants. The demand for such a franchise increases the danger of an increase in racial tensions. Those responsible for the UN resolution know this. The fostering and exploiting of racial tensions is part of the revolutionary programme. We suggest that Australians should immediately take this issue up with their Canberra representatives and suggest that they urge that, if Australia is to continue in the "United" Nations, its representatives should be instructed to vote against all revolutionary policies.

## INFLATION IN THE COMMON MARKET

A recent report in the South African press dealt with the increasing number of immigrants from the Common Market countries to South Africa. When asked why they were leaving their homes to settle in South Africa, several of the immigrants said that they had become increasingly concerned about growing economic and political instability in Western Europe. Several stressed the problem of rising prices in the Common Market countries, particularly West Germany and France.

Ever since this journal's inception we have demonstrated, both theoretically and by reference to concrete examples, that the progressive expansion of new financial credits, created by the banking system, must, under present financial rules, inevitably result in a continuous rise in the general price level. Attempts to offset the reduction of purchasing power by wage increases merely aggravate the problem, as increased wage costs must be recovered by further price increases. The faster the rate of economic expansion under present credit policies, the greater impetus towards the disastrous results of inflation.

General de Gaulle's France provides striking (in more ways than one!) confirmation of what we say. May we have the attention for a moment of all those who have been claiming that political and economic stability has been achieved in the Common Market?

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## EDUCATION. TO WHAT END?

"Too much education is what's wrong with the world, Son." The speaker, just after World War I, was ageing. The struggle to survive had started very early, so he could barely read and write. He had lost two sons in the war, and declined compensation because "the Government would find it hard enough to pay for the war as it was." He spoke from his own experience of the difficulty of getting money: didn't know that money for war was so easily created that it was not even a problem to be solved. Seven years after reaching the pensioner's age the Government he had served so loyally rejected his claim because, although he had no money, he was the registered owner of a liability in the form of a small block of un-saleable land. To him, life was something that ought to be simple: unnecessary complications had been introduced and for this, "education" must be to blame.

Educationally, "Son" had a slightly better start than Dad, but his schooling too was interrupted by periods of seasonal employment to reduce the family budget deficit. At 13 he had to leave and take a job at 6/- per week. He did not inherit Dad's physique, so mental exercise was more satisfying to him than the physical. He noticed that the people who did the hardest work got the least for it. Dad's week of hard labour was a regular 78 hours; he had no appetite for drugs, yet never had any spare cash, so Son reasoned there must be something wrong with the running of the money system. Money ought to come into existence as goods are produced and go out as they are consumed, he thought, because the only use for the stuff was to claim goods, or transfer to a purveyor of service, who got the goods. He felt sorry for the bankers, because there were so few people with money to borrow from that it would be hard to make a living re-lending it at 3 percent, more than they paid. Whereas Dad thought it quite natural to have to spend all of his energy struggling to exist, Son could see ways of lightening the burden if only some extra money could be got for the purchase of equipment. So his reply to Dad's pronouncement was: "Oh, no Dad we need more and more education". At that time he had not realised that much that passed for education was later to become known as "mental conditioning" or "brainwashing", for the purpose of imposing more readily on the people by "Authority" false conceptions of politics, economics and finance.

Son now retired, is disillusioned about his faith in education. He says that people are trained to do the difficult things well, but the principles of human association, which give meaning and purpose to doing things, and involve politics, economics, finance, are not part of authoritative education. This charge is borne out by 200,000 leaflets distributed by 600 students in Adelaide on June 22nd.

Writers of the leaflet seem to be unanimous about lack of finance as the "basic problem", but the subject matter is in the main an attempt to "brainwash" the public into acceptance of increased taxation. Not one understood that

builders, teachers, etc., are induced to serve by "claims to goods" (money) and that the Government can use its Reserve Bank powers to issue claims to unused productive resources and goods not represented by existing purchasing power. By this means education can be financed free of interest, and without increased taxation. Lack of this knowledge, which is acquired only through one's own initiative, largely neutralises any benefit that should have resulted from education. If educationists cannot remedy the defect, their campaign is not worth supporting.

### "THE GENTLEMEN, PAST AND PRESENT"

The gentlemen from Indonesia, of whom do they remind you?

To those of you who can recall the years before World War II, I would suggest that there is a similarity between these smiling visitors of today and those other friendly little men with their cameras who seemed to find such a wealth of photographic material in this country.

Of course, by now you have realised where all this is leading, and so before I go any further, I must say that not for a moment do I believe that every Indonesian is a Communist, any more than I believe that every German was a Nazi or every Japanese was guilty of the atrocities committed by some of his countrymen.

We in Australia are constantly being told that we must get to know our Asian neighbours; we must learn to understand each other. This is all very commendable, and I am all for it, up to a point.

We don't have to be told that our neighbours are Asians, we only have to look at the map to see this, neither do we as Christians have to be told that we should love our neighbours, however, I have never found anything in our Lord's teachings to suggest that the best way to be a loving neighbour is to commit suicide.

Instead of wasting time in telling ourselves what Indonesia's intentions ought to be, we should face the truth and admit that they aren't "honorable" as the saying goes. This must surely be obvious to all but those who will not see.

Behind every smiling, hand-shaking visitor from Indonesia, there stands that very noisy man, Dr. Soekarno. Haven't you heard him? You should have! Like all dictators or would be dictators, he is an extremely vocal individual and he is singing the same tune as the gentleman from Moscow, Mr. K., and that other gentleman from Peking, Mao Tse-tung.

It is worth noting at this point that the last Indonesian visitor who honored us, came at the invitation of the Communist Party of Australia. Perhaps they too are learning to love their neighbour.

Most of us have I suppose, wondered a little uneasily about Communist China's intentions in relation to Australia, but how many of us have given any serious thought to Indonesia being a part of Comrade Mao's plan for our conquest. If we haven't, we should start thinking about it now.

## Inflation and The Common Market

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A few weeks after de Gaulle declared against immediate British entry into the Common Market, and his politicians were expressing contented views about the state of France, the longest coal strike since 1953 was launched. De Gaulle tried desperately for five weeks to block the miners' demands for increased wages. But, backed by the clergy, the press and increasing public opinion, the miners have obtained a wage increase even greater than they originally demanded. Other unions have now demanded increased wages, while the farmers' union has announced that if industrial prices are going to increase, farm prices must also be raised. And so the price spiral grows and confounds de Gaulle's prediction that his 1958 devaluation policy would solve the inflation problem. There is no solution to the inflation problem under financial and economic policies, which inevitably foster inflation. And inflation is one of the most dangerous of the revolutionary developments sweeping Western Civilization towards the abyss. Clearly the creation of "Common Markets" will not halt the revolution. Only the scientific relating of credit and price policies to economic realities, and the re-orientation of the economic system to serve the true purpose of the individual, can achieve anything of value.
