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# DINNER AND SEMINAR LOOKS AHEAD

Although the Dinner and Seminar weekend was held at the same time as the federal election, and concluded before election results were finalised, there was a strong feeling among those attending that little would change. There was a general agreement that the major contenders in the two-party system offered little in the way of differences. The only interest was in the size of the revolt against the major parties; which, as it happened, was the largest for half a century, although this did not appear in the form of seats gained.

Rather than depressing the audience it confirmed, if confirmation was needed, that a change in direction for the world, from its present course of corruption and convulsion to a path of creativity and harmony is not going to be achieved through the election process. The theme came through more than one address over the weekend. It showed a deepening understanding of the profundity of what Douglas discerned so many years before the rest of us. Nobody has summed it up better than L.D. Byrne:

"These matters have a stupendous significance for Social Crediters in the present critical situation - a situation which continues to develop with increasing momentum towards its shattering climax. The plight of humanity is of its own making. It is the inevitable outcome of a progressive violation of the Canon - of shutting off the outward looking, fear-dominated Mind from reality. The resulting conflict in the sphere of human affairs is fundamentally a conflict between the spiritual concept of Life and the "materialistic" concept of Life - between the power of Faith and the forces generated by fear - between the power of God and the forces of Mammon - between Christ and anti-Christ..."

#### **OUTCOME NOT IN DOUBT**

L.D. Byrne continued:

"Upon the outcome of the conflict there can be no doubt, for the forces of evil having no Absolute Reality cannot prevail against the power of Faith stemming from a realisation of Reality. It is not simply a case of the forces of evil ultimately bringing destruction upon themselves, but in terms of reality they are defeated now.

Put in another form, the havoc which is being wreaked upon the material world around us by the unleashed forces of evil of destruction - is merely evidence of the self-annihilation of those forces and the materialistic concept they engender,

Once this fact is grasped it becomes plain that it is merely futile to attempt to combat the forces of evil manifesting themselves in an orgy of destruction by means, which confer upon them any semblance of Reality. Major Douglas once stated that the only way to deal with Black Magic - the cult of evil - was to treat it as if it did not exist. To do otherwise would confer upon it Reality and thereby give the forces of evil power over the Mind.

The stark folly of attempting to fight money with money, the party system by organising a new party, the strangling hypnotism of material gain by appeals for social security measures - and so forth, should be evident. All they can achieve is to strengthen the very forces they seek to combat . . ." (L.D. Byrne, "Faith, Power and Action").

#### **VOLUNTEER SPIRIT**

This theme came through strongly in the reply to the toast to *The New Times* by National Director, David Thompson. He pointed to the volunteer spirit in which the League of Rights was administered, and the sacrificial nature of the contribution from those who ran offices and bookshops, organised meetings,




National Director David Thompson replies to toast to the New Times

offered transport and so on. The volunteer spirit was hated and feared by the power-hungry, and was impervious to manipulation.

He spoke forcefully on the dangers in the 'cult of bigness'-pointing to the gas crisis in Victoria as one example, making the community needlessly vulnerable. As more of this type of centralisation became a feature of society, it did two things; it made the majority more helpless, but at the same time honed the independence of freedom-lovers, who were forced to rely increasingly on their own resources.

David Thompson was ably backed up in a rueful and humorous address by the Hon. Neil Robson, a former

Tasmanian Member of Parliament. Although a party member, Neil Robson had caused bewilderment among his colleagues by insisting on taking an independent line, issue by issue. He had tried to steer both the concept of citizens' referenda and changes to the financial system through the Tasmanian parliament. He was thwarted at every turn by members of his own party, who were never motivated by the merits or otherwise of the Bills but simply on the effect it would have on future electoral results. This is not to say the approval of electors, but how the party could manipulate future elections. Neil Robson found it virtually impossible to interest fellowmembers in matters of finance - even though the State was struggling with massive debts and the difficulty of funding essential commitments. Their ignorance on such matters as the source and origin of money was, Mr. Robson emphasised, colossal.

The Dinner was concluded by another relaxed and humorous address from Eric Butler. He went back in history, quoting noted scientist and former State Governor Sir Mark Oliphant, who had seen right through the charade of the two-party system, pointing out that Australia in reality suffered an elected dictatorship.

One of his most telling examples came from a visit to the former Rhodesia, where a tribal chief had discussed the process of "ndabas" - the decision-making process in the tribe, where everyone of responsible age had a say, from the local kraal to the paramount gathering of chiefs and headmen. "It seems in your western system," the chief remarked wryly, "You all have a vote but no say. We don't use your voting system, but each has a say. Wouldn't you say our system might be better?"

Reflecting on the present system prevailing in western democracies, where a growing number of people felt their vote held little value as a mechanism of choice, Mr. Butler said the African chief had a point.

# WALL STREET AND "ANTI-CULTURE"

The following controversial and thought-provoking message to the New Times dinner came from the brilliant iconoclastic editor of the Quarterly letter "Triumph of the Past", Michael Lane:

"In Programme for the Third World War (1943) C.H. Douglas called for the public trial and punishment of the conspirators of 1915-1940, those responsible for World Wars I and II. As we are still seeing war crimes trials fifty-some years after the fact, it may not be too late for some of these. One of the most powerful briefs in our arsenal is Wall Street and the Rise of Hitler, by Antony Sutton.

The power of Wall Street in this century is easy to demonstrate both circumstantially and, now, practically. All serious revolutions are financed, and all financing comes directly or indirectly from Western banks, and Wall Street is well known to be the capital of western banking. That's the circumstantial case. For the practical case, Sutton set it out in black-and-white for Hitler's revolution, and other researchers have done the same for other world crises. As with a witness in the courtroom, it's the wealth of detail that convinces.

This gives us a useful tool for analysing current events. Wall Street has leverage over debtor nations. What can Wall Street do if its debtor refuses to do what it is told? Cut credit; if necessary, finance the opposition; if necessary, finance a revolution. And come to think of it, all nations are debtor nations. There's no essential difference between the "internal" debt of the United States and the "external" debt of a third-world country. And Wall Street's methods of dealing with recalcitrance are exactly the same in both cases.

Of course, when Wall Street creates a political crisis in the third world, the crisis is ostensibly about local issues and party ideologies. But with our new tool for analysing current events, we see that local issues and party ideologies are really no help to understanding what is going on. From the point of view of Wall Street, local issues and party ideologies are just things to exploit as convenient. Take Wall Street and the Rise of Hitler again. A nti-Semitism was a piece of ideology. The way to prevent another Hitler is not to combat anti-Semitism, because anti-Semitism was not the cause of anything. Wall Street was the cause, and the way to prevent another Hitler is to combat Wall Street.

If Wall Street is indifferent to ideology, it helps us in one respect. By disregarding ideology, we are better able to look for an underlying consistency in Wall Street's actions at different times and in different places. All modern revolutions bring in their wake more Byzantine systems for people to master and more global interdependence. If Wall Street's actions are thus consistent at different times and in different places, it proves the existence of a powerful and enduring conspiracy.

But this leads to big questions. If Wall Street is engaged in a conspiracy and Wall Street is ideology-free, what is the conspiracy about? It is much easier to say what the conspiracy is against than what it is for. The West was a Christian social order, so the conspiracy to destroy that order must be anti-Christian. But what is the conspiracy for? What holds it together? What enables one person to be "in," another "out"? How does it act as a unit? Do the conspirators think of themselves as conspirators or as something else, perhaps

benefactors? Is the conspiracy about getting rich, pure materialism? Is it about power? Is it about culture?

Money and power as motives would really be the same thing. Even at a humble level, money is only good to buy things with, and so have power over them. If you command a little money, you can maybe buy a home. If you command a lot of money, you can maybe buy a nation. One person employs his creativity improving his home or garden, another employs his creativity "improving" an entire nation. A part from the fact that the latter "owns" other people, the basic impetus is the same. It's the difference Douglas noted between a small-p plan and a capital-P Plan.

Is that enough of an explanation? A purely secular, material quest for power? Perhaps it is.

Douglas's claim that the attack on Christian culture was itself the manifestation of a culture - Jewish culture - is the one thing above all that makes him difficult to present to the public today. Antony Sutton, in an appendix to his book on the Bolshevik Revolution, states that according to statistical evidence, it cannot be said that Jews were in charge of the revolution either in its personnel in Russia or in its Wall Street backers. I have read statistical evidence to the contrary in regard to the personnel in Russia, but Sutton's statement should certainly be accorded a great deal of respect. If correct, it doesn't repudiate Douglas's claim once for all, but it does mean that the matter turns on something more s ubtle than mere numbers. It turns on whether there is a Jew-gentile divide on Wall Street and, if there is, what it signifies.

The problem is compounded by the difficulty of defining exactly what is a Jew and what is a gentile. A "Jew-gentile divide" would be an "ethnic" divide with the ancient savor of a religious divide. But if that ancient savor is weak on both sides, why not stick to the "secular, materialist" thesis and leave that notoriously fuzzy concept "ethnicity" alone? And wouldn't Jews be justified in denying the "Jewish" conspirators the dignity of the name just as we would deny the gentile conspirators the name of "Christian"? Why not indeed say that the materialist conspiracy is anti-culture, be it Jewish or Christian? Or if Douglas was right and there is some sort of significant Jewgentile divide on Wall Street and Wall Street nevertheless acts in a consistent manner, how do we determine who is using whom? How do we determine the power structure of a conspiracy? We need open discussion of this subject.

However that goes, I think putting the problem in that way will be more acceptable to both ethnic Jews and religious Jews, who are not, after all, the enemy. Jews stand everything to gain from a Christian social order in Christian countries and everything to lose (and they have already lost much) from an anti-Christian order, no matter who sponsors it. So far, however, we've done a poor job of convincing them of this. Not that those who purport to speak for Jews have made it particularly easy. It's almost as if someone wanted to keep us apart. But they are potential allies, we deserve their support, and we should ask it.

Let us also keep in mind that we are not alone, that in the final analysis the battle is the Lord's; and that Faith is the very foundation and battery out of which comes great power and action.



# PEDIGREE OF OUR CULTURAL HERITAGE

# CIVILISATION ROOTED IN CHRISTIANITY

"Christian greetings to all attending the New Times Dinner and the League of Rights Seminar.

Southern Queensland supporters and our committee send the following message written some 50 years ago by Eric D. Butler, who is one of the great Australians of the 20th century. We believe what he had to say still applies today:

The Christian philosophy is one of genuine freedom. Those people who term themselves Christians and who at the same time support socialist policies clearly indicate that their understanding of the fundamental Christian philosophy is either confused or very blurred.

What is termed Western Civilisation was rooted in Christianity. The growth of Christianity in England was synonymous with the growth of the nation. The political structure was directly influenced by the Christian idea of individual freedom, personal responsibility and the subordination of institutions to the requirement of individuals.

The steady destruction of the supremacy of Common Law is a deadly menace to practical Christianity. Common Law was based upon an acceptance of the Christian principle that there are moral laws inherent in human nature and that all human associations, including governments, must conform to these laws. All realistic constitutionalism must conform to the laws of the universe, which obviously transcend human thinking . . . The (continuing) destruction of constitutional safeguards of individual rights, and the steady whittling away of the rule of law are challenges which must be taken up by every person who claims to be a Christian.

Western Civilisation, of which we are a part, is faced with (a continuing) war to the death. The people should have a financial system, which will allow them to produce and consume what they desire without piling up financial debts in so doing. Let us have a policy of Social Credit instead of a

policy of Social Debt . . . There are still far too many Australians who have no understanding of the evil threatening them.'

# **OUTSTANDING TOASTS AT NEW TIMES DINNER**

Giving the Loyal Toast, South Australian Chris Ashton pointed out that people at every level of society and all over the world, instinctively looked for leadership. The cult of sporting heroes and the adulation of media-cult figures - even news-readers - highlighted this.

Australia, he pointed out, had encompassed this need for leadership in our system of constitutional monarchy, whose development over hundreds of years had provided the benefits and eliminated the pitfalls attending good leadership. Each generation, it seemed, had to re-discover the benefits of such an inherited system, rather than the shambles that go with the cost and the partisan divisions of an elected leadership.

It was all the more significant, he said, that this leadership is enthroned in a Christian ceremony, where solemn commitments are made to a number of principles, the most important of which is service. This was obviously seen as a great threat to those who would rule the world - hence the never-ending attack on monarchy

Persistent attack, however, can be counter-productive. It often leads people to look at both sides of issues, which do not seem important until the attack begins. The rising tide of sympathy and popularity for Prince Charles in the face of media 'over-kill' was symptomatic of this.

It was up to those who had grasped this to maintain their loyalty, their objectivity and their commitment.

# BIRDBRAINS ON THE LOOSE

Veteran New Times supporter gave a delightful word-picture, which enchanted his audience in presenting the toast to *The New Times*.

"For more than 50 years I have been a subscriber to the New Times. Nothing brightens my letterbox more than the once-amonth arrival of the New Times. Over 600 times I have picked up the delivery, from which I get more information than any daily paper, with its distortions and omissions," he said.

In recent times, Neil MacDonald told the audience, a carrier pigeon - one of a species with a long and honourable record of service - had been perched on the mailbox on *New Times* days, and gradually the two had learned to communicate.

The pigeon told Neil that the avian world was even more advanced towards a "New Bird Order" than were humans. By the turn of the century, all birds would carry registration numbers on their wings. By 2010 all birds would be required to be grey. Sparrows, for example, were jealous of rosellas and their bright plumage. In the same year all flights of a single species would be banned, and only 'multiflight' journeys permitted - eagles with owls, and falcons with partridges for example.

The carrier pigeon asked Neil for help, and while he had no instant answers, Neil suggested the two should continue to compare notes and exchange wishes.

The pigeon's message for Neil MacDonald to convey to others came in the form of a song, which Neil delivered faithfully:

"Hello, little yellow bird, I'd gladly face the cold On a leafless tree, Than a prisoner be In a cage of gold!"


She drew attention to the spiritual continuity between past, present and future supporters of the New Times - bonds between individuals which made family.


#### **FALLING APART**
