THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK: "What is truth? For the multitude, that which it continually reads and hears... Three weeks of Press work and the truth is acknowledged by everybody... Unleash the people as reader-mass and it will storm through the streets and hurl itself upon the target indicated, terrifying and breaking windows; a hint by the Press staff and it will become quiet and go home." – **Oswald Spengler** in *"The Decline of the West"*, 1928.

Geoffrey Dobbs in "Responsible Government in a Free Society" reminded his readers of the need for a mechanism whereby the people can control their governments – not the other way round. [<http://www.alor.org/PoliticalDemocracy/ResponsibleGovernmentinaFreeSociety.htm>]

He suggested some constructive proposals:

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OF VICTORIA

1. The first step is to get our thinking clear about the two conceptions of democracy, that which stems from (traditional) Christianity, and that which stems from atheism.

2. The second is to defend, with passion and conviction, those Powers in our Constitution which check or limit the dictatorship of the Government; and particularly to defend those elements in their origin which provide alternatives to the "mandate" of the popular vote, which has degenerated into a forced choice between detested alternatives, performed under psychological pressure from the mass-media...

3. The third step is to realise and defend the proper place of the ballot in the operation of a democratic society, and to take the initiative in developing it towards this. The first virtue of the ballot is that it eliminates violence; and it is this aspect which is being side-tracked and attacked by our revolutionaries (who at the same time claim to be acting "democratically"). The second (virtue) is that, if properly used, it can provide an opportunity for the

negative vote, the Voters' Veto on the unwanted alternatives offered by those seeking power over us. Finally, it might be used as a basis for the responsible vote, as suggested earlier.

4. The Fourth Step is to look, with confident imagination, into the potentialities for the future of a real democracy, including Constitutional changes to strengthen and revitalise the Powers which revise and, if necessary, limit, the power of the Executive.

Whatever the basis of the Revising Chamber, or Upper House, it must be such as to ensure the quality of its members, and also that it is free of the pressure of the mass-majority-vote, so that it is free to present without bias the claims of minorities, such as the rural people, or the vital professions, or any person or group whose oppression, in the name of the majority, should be vetoed by the Upper House.

Ultimate objective is power over our own affairs: Ultimately, we should have as our objective the dispersal of such power over their own affairs to the individual citizens as to enable them to control their political and economic servants. When this happens we shall, at least, be on the road, not only to political, but to the even more important economic, democracy; which will imply, of course, decentralised financial control, in the pockets of the people, over the vast productive potential of our civilisation, which at present is being so appallingly misused, and squandered.

One reason why the progress of Monopoly appears irresistible is that it has a clear idea where it is going and so can formulate its objectives. So far it has never had to face a body of people with equally clear, but opposite, objectives, which have the invincible advantage of being in keeping with "the 'warp and woof of the Universe". Is not this an adventure worth trying?"

Wallace Klink of Canada has reminded us that C.H. Douglas said "the present financial system would bring itself to an impasse because of the intensifying problems of distribution and debt which would ensue from the rapid displacement of labour by advancing technology. He said when the historical moment of inevitable and obviously unresolvable financial/ economic and social crisis occurred that Social Crediters must be qualified and prepared to give leadership in order to prevent humanity from slipping into chaos and a new repressive age of tyranny".

While it is good to see others entering this long-term battle and seeking to deal with the powers of banks we must be on our guard that the proposed moves are in the right direction. You can be sure the Money Power is also looking at ways and means to resolve the dilemma "of the intensifying problems" but it will be from their philosophical base of Monopoly – not Freedom.

ON STARVING OUR OBESE AND CORRUPT UNIVERSITIES by James Reed: Our decadent, corrupt and evil universities are squawking at the prospects of possible immigration cuts: "Immigration Cuts Would Hit University Funds", *The Age*, September 4, 2010. They fear that a "cash flow crisis" would occur with less revenue from fee-paying students. Surprise, surprise: if this is true then here is a clear admission that the international student cash cow system is just about immigration – Asian

immigration. One would have thought that the immigration cuts would have produced no effect since the cuts are about permanents, not visas. Of course this is not so and never has been so.

The Australian education export industry is said to have generated revenue of \$18.4 billion last year – even if this is true, it is a drop in the ocean compared to the infrastructure and opportunity costs of migrants who take university positions away from Australians. But the real problem here is the universities themselves. Closing down the arts, humanities and social sciences in all Australian universities and renting out the buildings to business will generate more funds than our existing education export industry.

Conservative journalist Paul Johnson is right in observing: "Universities are the most overrated institutions of our age. Of all the calamities that have befallen the 20th century, apart from the two World Wars, the expansion of higher education in the 1950's and 1960's was the most enduring. It is a myth that universities are nurseries of reason. They are hot houses for every kind of extremism, irrationality; intolerance and prejudice, where intellectual and social snobbery is almost deliberately installed and where dons attempt to pass on to their students their own sins of pride. The wonder is that so many people emerge from these dens still employable, although a significant minority – as we have learnt to our cost - goes forth well equipped for a lifetime of public mischief making!" DID HITLER HAVE "JEWISH GENES"? – DOES IT MATTER? by Peter Ewer: An article in *The Telegraph* of August 24, 2010, reports that saliva samples from relatives of Hitler show that he may have had "Jewish genes". A chromosome called Haplogroup E1b1b1 is commonly found in Ashkenazi and Sephardic Jews, but is rare in Western Europe. This is an interesting development because racial nihilists may argue that it is absurd to suppose that race exists when the "Aryan" Hitler was probably part Jewish. But this is nonsense because the very debate presupposes the reality of racial concepts. Further, Hitler never claimed to be of "pure blood" and indeed said that he was not a "pure" Aryan. Looks like he was right.

My question is: if Hitler really was part Jewish, what philosophical significance, if any, does this have for the Holocaust.

ZAP GOES MORALITY! by Brian Simpson: Piers Paul Read, "Has Guilt Gone Out of Fashion?" (*The Weekend Australian*, August 28-29, 2010, magazine, pp.18-19) wonders where guilt has gone in modern culture, guilt being that inner voice of conscience telling one that one has done wrong. We have, he says "cut ourselves adrift from a coherent ethic, whether it is that of Aristotle or Aquinas". But perhaps there is another possibility.

Researchers at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology have published research which shows that people's assessment of right and wrong can be disrupted by an electromagnetic pulse to the brain: L. Young (et. al.), "Disruption of the Right Temporoparietal Injunction with Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation Reduces the Role of Beliefs in Moral Judgements", *Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences*, April 13, 2010. Here it is simply: moral behaviour can be changed merely by zapping the brain.

So could it be that the state of our world, the stupidity of people, the lack of morals and so on, is a product of the electromagnetic sea our brains now swim in? It is enough to make one want to become a Greenie and go back to the trees – but sorry, there's no parking spot for the Volvo in the branches!

THE INDEPENDENTS AND A DIVIDED AUSTRALIA by James Reed: The Independents are certainly proving to be "colourful" and appear to be having as much fun as a fox in a chook house. There's Rob Oakeshott who suggested that he wanted a "unity government" made up by independents (*The Australian*, August 25, 2010, p.3) Political parties weren't involved in the original Constitutional concept, he rightly pointed out. Great stuff! But then later on we have Oakeshott lamenting about "racism" in the Nationals: he was "stung" by a "racist" remark "that seemed to be a pointed reference to his girlfriend's proud Aboriginal and South Sea Islander heritage" (*The Australian*, September 2, 2010, p.1). Oh dear, one remark and its...curtains. Perhaps Rob will feel more at home with the Greens who want a referendum recognising local government and indigenous constitutional recognition. Yes, according to the Greens, the planet is in peril – but time can be taken out to waste on politically correct issues. IS TECHNO-MEDICINE JUST PLAIN BUNK? by Chris Knight: Reported in *Natural News* (August 18, 2010 at <http://www.naturalnews.com>) is a new study which found, astonishingly, that 85% of new drugs by pharmaceutical companies are duds and pose health risks. The research is by Professor Donald Light at the University of Medicine and Dentistry, New Jersey, who presented his findings to a meeting of the American Sociological Association. He said: "Sometimes drug companies hide or downplay information about serious side effects of new drugs and overstate the drugs' benefits...Then, they spend two to three times more on marketing than on research to persuade doctors to prescribe these new drugs. Doctors may get misleading information and then misinform patients about the risks of a new drug. It is really a two-tier market for lemons." Indeed; techno-medicine is enough to make one sick!
