THE STATE OF THE 21st CENTURY CHRISTIAN CHURCH by Betty Luks

The newspapers are reporting that Pope Francis has warned in his first mass that the Catholic Church risks becoming little more than a charity with no spiritual foundations if it fails to undergo renewal. Addressing the cardinals who elected him as Latin America's first pope, the 76-year-old Argentinian said the church could "end up a compassionate NGO", using an Italian word that can also mean "pitiful".

"I would like all of us after these days of grace to have the courage to walk in the presence of the Lord," Francis said, amid the splendour of the Sistine Chapel. He warned the cardinals against "the worldliness of the Devil". "Walking, building and confessing are not so easy. Sometimes there are tremors," the Pope said, in a homily that will be scrutinised for clues to the style of his leadership.

On the afternoon on the first full day of his pontificate, Pope Francis celebrated the "pro Ecclesia" Mass in the Sistine Chapel with the 114 Cardinal electors who participated in the Conclave and those who assisted with its functions. The first reading was a canticle from the Prophet Isaiah that begins with the words:

"In days to come, the mountain of the Lord's house shall be established as the highest mountain" and

continues with the celebrated verses: "He shall judge between the nations, and set terms for many peoples. They shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks; One nation shall not raise the sword against another, nor shall they train for war again." It is important that Pope Francis has acknowledged the sorry state of the Church at this time of its history. But it is not the Roman Catholic Church alone that is in deep trouble. In 1948 – over sixty years ago - whilst writing of the sorry state of the Church of England at that time (it is worse now), Clifford Hugh Douglas noted in "The Realistic Position of the Church of England":

"With some hesitation, I suggest that the question arising out of the Christian Church, is not the same, either in nature or degree, as that involved in the acceptance of what is vaguely called Christianity which for the most part is merely Liberal Judaism. It is the Doctrine of the Incarnation".

In the same paper he wrote of a Christian civilization and the qualities of a Christian Knight: "The civilization

of Christianity was incompletely embodied in the culture of mediaeval Europe, and is exemplified in Magna Carta. Its essential characteristic is courage, allied to 'love', cf. "Perfect love casteth out fear" (a rather unsatisfactory translation). The knight of chivalry, the militant Christian ideal, watched his armour alone in the chapel through the night, and then went out to do battle alone for love against fear and oppression — a very complete allegory.

The mass is unsaveable, just as a mob is insane ("without health"); the object of Anti-Christ is to keep mankind in ever larger mobs, thus defeating the object of Christ, to permit the emergence of self-governing, self-conscious individuals, exercising free will, and choosing good because it is good..."

I once made notes from a paper that 'quickened my interest' at the time about St. John's Gospel, but I didn't record the source:

I like what Rudolf Steiner once wrote about the dynamics of 'organics'. "Organic life is not the product of matter but is the constant expression of spirit, as life and form, in the medium of matter."

HUMAN WRONGS by Ian Wilson LL.B.

According to Professor Gillian Triggs, president of the Australian Human Rights Commission "The right to speak freely needs to be balanced against other freedoms" (*The Australian* 25 February 2013, p.12). The article goes on to defend the <u>Racial Discrimination Act</u> which applies to conduct likely to "offend, insult, humiliate or intimidate" a person on grounds of race. Triggs says that this seems to set the "bar" low at the level of merely offending and insulting, but Triggs says that in race vilification cases courts have set the "bar" high. She mentions <u>Jones v Toben</u> but doesn't consider the Bolt case which more clearly illustrates the absurdity of this law. The threshold of "offence" is ridiculously low and courts don't even seem to have a "bar" anymore. No one has ever successfully defended themselves against the race vilification thought police. The law of probability alone says that something must be wrong.

Freedom of speech is a more basic political right than the new class rights of not treating people offensively, insulting them, humiliating them, and even intimidating them. In the present racial-ethno-cultural war, Anglo-Australians who are being dispossessed and demographically replaced are frequently offended, insulted, humiliated and intimidated by the new class. The right of self-protection demands that they have free speech as a defence. Clearly race vilification laws are really designed to silence critics of the politically correct regime. Such laws are political weapons and have little to do with human rights.

We need a society without UN-inspired entities such as Human Rights Commissions. Australia, and all western countries need to leave the UN and repeal all UN-inspired law such as the <u>Racial Discrimination Act.</u>



Frances was influential in having Eimar O'Duffy's 1933 science fiction fantasy "Asses in Clover" republished in 2003. As debt-finance-led production and consumption devour field and forest across the globe, rendering soils, seas, lakes, rivers and the very air itself stale and unwholesome, the human race is well on its way to the end as foretold by Eimar O'Duffy in Asses in Clover (1933).

The book is the final book of O'Duffy's Cuanduine Trilogy of satirical fantasy. The first volume, King Goshawk and the Birds (1926), is set in a future world devastated by 'progress' and ruled by King Capitalists. King Goshawk, the supreme King Capitalist,

decides to buy up all the flowers and birds, placing them in the theme parks for which an entrance fee is charged. Enraged at this desecration of nature and human rights, an ancient Dublin philosopher calls the mythical Cuchulain back to earth. He sires a son, Cuanduine, whose task is to right the wrongs perpetrated by the capitalists.

In "Asses in Clover", O'Duffy continues his humorous tirade at the follies of twentieth-century politics and economics. After destroying King Goshawk's International Air Force before it can devastate Ireland with deadly weapons of mass destruction, the demi-god Cuanduine is outflanked by Goshawk's economic advisor, the real power on earth. Finally despairing at the folly and wickedness of humanity, Cuanduine departs from this world.

In the final chapters world depression followed by a great war destroys civilization.

Iranian President Mahmoud

fertility rate of Iran is now below

Iran and Turkey see this rapid drop in

LOCAL GOVERNMENT AND THE PROPOSED REFERENDUM

One should be extremely skeptical of any proposal from the present Government – it is likely to cost more and reduce freedom. So it was with great concern that I noted Simon Crean plans to hold a referendum for the Constitutional recognition of local government with the September 14 election. This follows a letter from Queensland Premier, Campbell Newman, requesting a referendum on the topic.

Before going further, though, it should be noted that local government already has Constitutional recognition: see section 51 of the NSW Constitution; chapter 7 of the Queensland Constitution, Part IIA of the Victorian Constitution, Part 2A of the South Australian Constitution, Part IVA of the Tasmanian Constitution and Part IIIB of the Western Australian Constitution. We are, after all, a Federation. That is, a union of self-governing states with their own sovereignty (hence each has a Governor representing the Queen). It is entirely appropriate for local government to be recognised in the Constitutions of each State and not in the Australian Constitution. The United States Constitution does not mention local government. Yes, for example, Article XI of the Constitution of California covers local government. The Constitution of Canada does not mention local government (Canadian provinces have unwritten constitutions except British Columbia which is simply an Act of its Parliament). By contrast, the non-federal and highly centralised structure of France means that local government is part of La

In other words, without re-examining the federal nature of Australia, why is there a *prima facie* case for local government to be recognised in the Australian Constitution? The desire for such recognition has long been an aim of the Australian Local Government Association, and was covered in the 'expert panel' report of September 2011.

That report gave the following reasons for the proposed change:

Including a reference to local government in the Constitution would formally recognise the role it plays in the Australian federal system as the third tier of government. This recognition would enhance the status of local government, in the community and in its dealings with the other two levels of government.

Local government would be better able to attract the support and resources it needs, and to develop the new capacities to fulfil its increasingly important role in our system of government. For example, a wider range of people might stand for election as councillors or apply for professional and management positions within local government, and career, trade, training, employment and retention opportunities at all levels might open up.

Recognition could also enhance the ability of local councils to advocate the interests of their communities through collaboration with other levels of government. It could thus make a practical difference to local government's ability to deliver local services and infrastructure, and to its future development as an integral part of the Australian Federation.

These are weasel words. Local government is formally recognised in the Australian federal system in every State Constitution. Do we really want 'enhanced' recognition to give our councillors a bigger ego, or to encourage them to ever higher salaries and conditions? Did we all agree to the expansion in the types of activities conducted by local government? Then in March 2013, the Joint Select Committee on Constitutional Recognition of Local Government handed down its final report. It is notable that it includes a section 'the case for recognition' but no section on the case against recognition. It argues that the recognition would 'remove uncertainty' in the funding of local government. Yet I haven't observed any difficulty in local governments ripping off rate holders.

Most disturbingly, the report recommends:

The Preliminary Report supported the continued practice of Parliamentarians drafting and approving the 'Yes' and 'No' cases for the official referendum pamphlet for financial recognition of local government. It further recommended that, in the event that there is no requirement for a 'No' case – that is, if no Parliamentarians vote against a Constitution Alteration bill – there should be an official 'Yes' case only.

In other words, the Committee would like the Referendum to be conducted without a 'no' case. Lobby your MP – and vote NO to this proposed referendum. Don't give the bastards yet another option for taking more of your money.

POLLUTED USA: GMO MANMADE BIOLOGICAL THREATS, GERM WARFARE

In the United States everything is polluted. Democracy is polluted with special interests and corrupt politicians.

Accountability is polluted with executive branch exemptions from law and the Constitution and with special legal privileges for corporations, such as the Supreme Court given right to corporations to purchase American elections.

The Constitution is polluted with corrupt

The Constitution is polluted with corrupt legal interpretations from the Bush and Obama regimes that have turned constitutional prohibitions into executive branch rights, transforming law from a shield of the people into a weapon in the hands of government.

Waters are polluted with toxic waste spills, oil spills, chemical fertilizer run-off with resulting red tides and dead zones, acid discharges from mining with resulting destructive algae such as prymnesium parvum, from toxic chemicals used in fracking and with methane that fracking releases into wells and aquifers, resulting in warnings to homeowners near to fracking operations to open their windows when showering.

The soil's fertility is damaged, and crops require large quantities of chemical fertilizers. The soil is polluted with an endless array of toxic substances and now with glyphosate, the main element in Monsanto's Roundup herbicide with which GMO crops are sprayed.

Glyphosate now shows up in wells, streams and in rain.

Air is polluted with a variety of substances, and there are many large cities in which there are days when the young, the elderly, and those suffering with asthma are warned to remain indoors.

All of these costs are costs imposed on society and ordinary people by corporations that banked profits by not having to take the costs into account. This is the way in which unregulated capitalism works.

Our food itself is polluted with antibiotics, growth hormones, pesticides, and glyphosate.

Glyphosate might be the most dangerous development to date. Some scientists believe that glyphosate has the potential to wipe out our main grain crops and now that Obama's Secretary of Agriculture, Thomas Vilsack, has approved genetically modified Roundup Ready alfalfa, maintaining sustainable animal herds for milk and meat could become impossible.

Alfalfa is the main forage crop for dairy and beef herds. Genetically modified alfalfa could be unsafe for animal feed, and animal products such as milk and meat could become unsafe for human consumption.

On January 17, 2011, Dr. Don Huber outlined the dangers of approving Roundup Ready alfalfa in a letter to Secretary of Agriculture Vilsack. Huber requested that approval be delayed until independent research could evaluate the risks. Vilsack ignored the letter and accommodated Monsanto's desire for monopoly profits that come from the company's drive to control the seed supply of US and world agriculture by approving Roundup Ready alfalfa.

Who is Don Huber, and why is his letter important?

Huber is professor emeritus at Purdue University. He has been a plant pathologist and soil microbiologist for a half century. He has an international reputation as a leading authority. In the US military, he evaluated natural and manmade biological threats, such as germ warfare and disease outbreaks and retired with the rank of Colonel. For the USDA he coordinates the Emergent Diseases and Pathogens Committee. In other words, he is high up in his scientific profession. You can read online what Huber told the Secretary of Agriculture. Briefly, the outcome of many years of Roundup Ready GMO corn and soybeans has been a decline in nutritional value, the outbreak of new plant diseases resulting in widespread crop failures, and severe reproductive problems in livestock, with some herds having a spontaneous abortion rate that is too high to maintain a profitable business.

Glyphosate is a powerful biocide. It harms beneficial soil organisms, altering the natural balance in the soil and reducing the disease resistance of crops, thus unleashing diseases that devastate corn, soybean, and wheat crops, and giving rise to a new pathogen associated with premature animal aging and infertility. These developments, Huber told the Agriculture Secretary, "are threatening the economic viability of both crop and animal producers." The evidence seems to be real that genetically modified crops have lost their genetic resistance to diseases that never previously were threats. There is evidence that the new pathogen is

related to a rise in human infertility and is likely having adverse effects on human health of which we are still uninformed. Like fluoride, glyphosate might enter our diet in a variety of ways. For example, the label on a bottle of Vitamin D says, "Other ingredients: soybean oil, corn oil." Monsanto disputes Huber's claims and got support for its position from the agricultural extension services of Iowa State and Ohio State universities. However, the question is whether these are independently funded services or corporate supported, and there is always the element of professional rivalry, especially for funding, which comes mainly from agribusiness.

The Purdue University extension service

was more circumspect. On the one hand it admits that there is evidence that supports Huber's claims: "The claim that herbicides, such as glyphosate, can make plants more susceptible to disease is not entirely without merit. Research has indicated that plants sprayed with glyphosate or other herbicides are more susceptible to many biological and physiological disorders (Babiker et al., 2011; Descalzo et al., 1996; Johal and Rahe, 1984; Larson et al., 2006; Means and Kremer, 2007; Sanogo et al., 2000; Smiley et al., 1992). . . . Although some research indicates there is an increase in disease severity on plants in the presence of glyphosate, it does NOT necessarily mean that there is an impact on yield." On the other hand, the Purdue extension service maintains its recommendation for "judicious glyphosate use for weed control." However, one of Huber's points is that weeds are developing Roundup resistance. Use has gone beyond the "judicious" level and as glyphosate builds up in soil, its adverse effects increase. A submission to the Environmental Protection Agency by 26 university entomologists describes the constraints that agribusiness has put on the ability of independent scientists to conduct objective research. The submission, in which the scientists are afraid to reveal their names because of the threat of funding cutoffs, is included as an item in one of the bibliographical references below. Here is the statement:

"The names of the scientists have been withheld from the public docket because virtually all of us require cooperation from

industry at some level to conduct our research. Statement: Technology/ stewardship agreements required for the purchase of genetically modified seed explicitly prohibit research. These agreements inhibit public scientists from pursuing their mandated role on behalf of the public good unless the research is approved by industry. As a result of restricted access, no truly independent

research can be legally conducted on many critical questions regarding the technology, its performance, its management implications, IRM, and its interactions with insect biology. Consequently, data flowing to an EPA Scientific Advisory Panel from the public sector is unduly limited." Monsanto is not only sufficiently powerful to prevent any research other than that which it purchases with its funding, but also Monsanto succeeded last year in blocking with money and propaganda the GMO

labeling law in California. I would tell you to be careful what you eat as it can make you ill and infertile, but you can't even find out what you are eating.

You live in America, which has "freedom and democracy" and "accountable" government and "accountable" corporations. You don't need to worry. The government and responsible corporations are taking good care of you. Especially Obama, Vilsack, and Monsanto. Short bibliography:

The way we farm conventionally is to plow the soil every year. This results in 1.9 billion tons of eroded topsoil annually. We have in fact consumed half the topsoil on the North American continent since we started plowing, 200-400 years ago. The means the ground is literally washing away and not being regenerated. It's not able to retain even water distribution. The land becomes parched if there is too little rain, because moisture and nutrients are not retained, or flooded during heavy rains, also because the soil is turning to dust. "That's our precious resource. That's the

birthright of future generations and we're losing it because of the way we do annual agriculture which is turning the soil every year," says Bill Wilson of Midwest Permaculture.

The Permaculture philosophy does not include plowing (neither does Biodynamics...ed). The beauty of that system is that the topsoil stays where it belongs, nourishing the crops and distributing water evenly instead of being stripped by wind and rainfall. Not to mention no chemicals or pesticides are used to further bankrupt the soil.

One thing we can all do right now to put nutrients back into our ground wherever we are is to compost all organic matter, and at least create healthy soil in our own backyards or community gardens.
