## THE ENVIRONMENTALIST ROOTS OF ANTI-IMMIGRANT BIGOTRY By Charles Taylor

On this freezing cold Melbournian Sunday morning, there was nothing much to refute until I came across this beauty from the Leftoid *The Guardian*, and the eternally poetic, politically correct *New York Times*. https://www.theguardian.com/environment/2019/aug/15/anti

"Recent mass shootings have been linked to 'eco-xenophobia' – part of a tradition that dates to America's first conservationists. The environmentalist, white nationalist, and influential anti-immigration activist John Tanton died less than three weeks before the El Paso shooting. Tanton lived to see his movement shape much of modern US immigration policy, but not this latest violent turn. A hate-filled document allegedly linked to the man suspected of killing 22 people in El Paso on 3 August echoed the kind of rhetoric generally favored by the far right – and also had a decidedly environmentalist, Tanton-like bent. The document praised the Dr Seuss character the Lorax, who says he speaks for the trees, and complained about the unsustainable overuse of paper towels. It concluded that the best course of environmental action would be mass murder. A week prior, on an Instagram account reportedly linked to the alleged Gilroy, California, garlic festival shooter, he complained about migrant-driven sprawl. Months before, the Christchurch, New Zealand, shooter called himself an "eco-fascist". Long before this violence, researchers warned of "the greening of hate". From Tanton's anti-immigration nonprofit network to some of today's avowed environmentalists, across the political spectrum, overpopulation and immigration in particular has been blamed for environmental collapse for over 50 years. Anti-immigrant ideology has been part and parcel of the whole of American conservationism since the first national park was founded, in part to protect wild yet white-owned nature from Mexicans and Native Americans. National purity and natural purity were inextricably linked. The current rise of eco-minded white supremacy follows a direct line from the powerful attorney, conservationist and eugenicist Madison Grant – a friend of trees, Teddy Roosevelt, and the colonial superiority of white land stewardship. Grant, along with the influential naturalist John Muir and other early Anglo-Saxon conservationists, was critical in preserving the country's wildlands for white enjoyment. Muir, who founded the Sierra Club environmental group in 1892, was disturbed by the "uncleanliness" of the Native Americans, whom he wanted removed from Yosemite. Grant successfully lobbied, in equal measure, for the creation of protected national parks and the restriction of immigration by non-whites.

"Environmentalists were hardcore eugenicists. They were as committed to racial thinking as they were to protecting the great redwoods in California," said Heidi Beirich, intelligence project director at the Southern Poverty Law Center. That eco-xenophobia resurfaced in the 1970s as overpopulation and resource depletion was deemed the pre-eminent challenge facing the planet at the dawn of the anthropocene. Published in 1968, The Population Bomb, by the Stanford University biology professor Paul Ehrlich, predicted that overpopulation would fuel worldwide famine and global upheaval. Much of what Ehrlich predicted did not come to pass, but the book proved hugely influential in the nascent environmental movement. Global population growth was soon conflated with US immigration growth, and both were blamed for the coming collapse of Spaceship Earth.

This argument inspired generations of eco-nativists, and the most influential anti-immigration advocacy network currently operating in the US."

In actual fact, Ehrlich was a strong anti-racist and wrote a book called *The Race Bomb* attacking racism, but don't let that ruin the story. I knew of John Tanton, meeting him three times, and he was not any sort of white nationalist as I saw it. The Left has had far more ecoterrorists than the Right, but no mention of them. The Dali Lama has also supported immigration restriction, and he is not white.

"The plan sounds like science fiction — but could be fact within a decade; every day more than 800 giant aircraft would lift millions of tonnes of chalk dust to a height of 12 miles above the Earth's surface and then sprinkle the lot high around the stratosphere. In theory, the airborne dust would create a gigantic sunshade, reflecting some of the Sun's rays and heat back into space, dimming those that get through and so protecting Earth from the worsening ravages of climate warming. This is not the crackpot plan of a garden-shed inventor. The project is being funded by billionaire and Microsoft founder Bill Gates and pioneered by scientists at Harvard University. Indeed, the plans are so well advanced that the initial 'sky-clouding' experiments were meant to have begun months ago. This initial \$3 million test, known as Stratospheric Controlled Perturbation Experiment (SCoPEx) would use a high-altitude scientific balloon to raise around 2kg of calcium carbonate dust — the size of a bag of flour — into the atmosphere 12 miles above the desert of New Mexico. This would seed a tube-shaped area of sky half a mile long and 100 yards in diameter. For the ensuing 24 hours, the balloon would be steered by propellers back through this artificial cloud, its onboard sensors monitoring both the dust's sun-reflecting abilities and its effects on the thin surrounding air. SCoPEx is, however, on hold, amid fears that it could trigger a disastrous series of chain reactions, creating climate havoc in the form of serious droughts and hurricanes, and bring death to millions of people around the world."

"A group of Maori people are calling for valuable land in Sydney's west to be handed over to them, claiming they were gifted the area by Aboriginal people more than 200 years ago. The Rangihou people say their king was handed the land in Parramatta by leaders of the Burramattagal Clan back in 1811 after they were first invited over from New Zealand. The 45-hectare parcel of land lies in an eastern section of central Parramatta. It includes parkland, James Ruse Reserve, Robin Thomas Reserve, Rangihou Reserve and a section of the Parramatta River.

'We are Ngati Rangihou Corrangie Hapu and we are here to reclaim Rangihou land,' the group's leader Lady Crown told *9 News*. 'We want acknowledgement and recognition. "According to the report released by United Kingdombased eye care company Scrivens Opticians, the percentage of 13-16 year olds in the U.K. who need glasses has nearly doubled over the past seven years — from 20% in 2012 to 35% in 2018. Two-thirds of those teens were diagnosed as being myopic, or short-sighted. Researchers theorize that this significant increase in eye problems among young people is likely linked to excessive time spent staring at screens, which can lead to eye strain, shortsightedness, and blurred vision. In fact, the study also found that the average 13-16 year old spends around 26 hours per

## MINING - TO BE OR NOT TO BE? By Ken Grundy

Correspondent Viv Forbes makes valuable contributions to *On Target* but some of his remarks in *On Target* Vol 55 No 32 deserve a comment.

Viv might have a miner's approach to these matters, where any useful mineral should be dug up and used or exported to generate jobs or wealth etc. His claim that solid hydro-carbon resources cannot be used without disturbing other resources such as soils, vegetation and stored water is a valid one but he then complained about destructive laws that give priority to coal seam gas, water and arable land resources. Farmers could be relocated; forests can be replanted and top soils can be set aside, Viv said. As a farmer, I can affirm that farmers have often been on a property for generations and established their own imprint on the place and are reluctant to shift no matter what compensation is offered. Also my particular area enjoys reasonable levels of good quality underground water which supplies townships, industry, stock and domestic drinking water as well as irrigation. We have no reservoirs; no rivers and the soil strata below the surface is generally soft limestone. To potentially risk such important aquifers by 'fracking' is simply out of the question. The other question which seems very important is protecting some resources for the future. Why should we create a future quarry by hastily mining our assets? Again quoting my own location where gas exploration is under way - the gas will not be available to the locals - it goes to the metropolis or more likely overseas. Gas supplies are vast and often in locations where risks involved with mining are minimal. Let us \*\*\* use them and sparingly too!

week staring at a smartphone, playing video games, or watching TV. Overall, optometrists from Scrivens say that much more research is needed to determine what all this screen time is really doing to teens' eyes, especially in the long-term. "Children's eyes continue to grow until early adulthood, and their vision is changing too," comments Sheena Mangat, an optometrist with Scrivens, in a statement. "Because conditions such as short or long sightedness can happen gradually over time, neither children nor parents can 'see the signs', which is why regular eye checks are so important." Additionally, the study found that it is no easy task for parents to pry their kids away from their screens; 73% of surveyed parents said it is a "challenge" to get their children to stop staring at some type of screen for a few hours."

# PELL JUDGMENT By Ian Wilson LL.B

Cardinal George Pell has lost his appeal before the Victorian Court of Appeal, by a 2-1 decision. What is interesting about this, at least to people in the law, is that the dissenting judgment was given by the brilliant jurist, Justice Mark Weinberg, who delivered a truly massive 204 page critique of the prosecution case against Pell, documenting numerous weaknesses, inconsistencies and implausibility's in the witness evidence. The general feeling among some lawyers is that Weinberg's judgment will set the scene for a High Court of Australia challenge, the case being along the lines of the canonical case of M v The Queen (1994) 181 CLR 487, where the High Court quashed a conviction because it was "unsafe." \*\*\*
