Henry Parkes Oration By Ted Mack

extract...Political parties as they have developed over the last century seem like two Mafia families seeking control of the public purse for distribution to themselves, supporters, the special interests who fund them and for buying votes at the next election. Political parties are not mentioned in the Constitution. They are effectively unregulated private organisations but they now control government treasuries. When they unite with common interests, for example funding themselves, the public are mostly powerless except on the rare occasions when public outrage is too great. For example the attempted 60 million dollar virtually secret increase in public funding for the parties earlier this year (2013).

Both parties have rightly suffered huge reductions in membership over the last few years almost in direct proportion to the centralisation of power in their organisations.

Public election funding and huge allowances have reduced the party's need for workers for elections. Candidates now can rely on direct mail, general advertising and paid help.

By centralising power as Tony Fitzgerald puts it: The public interest is subordinated to the pursuit of power, party objectives and personal ambitions, sometimes including the corrupt acquisition of financial benefit. Branch stacking has become endemic and as Fitzgerald says "The parties gift electorates to family connections, malleable party hacks and mediocre apparatchiks"...end

Soviet dissident Yuri Bezmenov warned the West, as did Whittaker Chambers and Aleksandr Solzhenitsyn 30 to 50 years ago. Push Back - Australia's Fight For Freedom -The Keys to Unlocking Democracy

• Hare-Clarke voting method for all lower house seats (being converted into voting regions)

• CIR - The Peoples Law introduced to all levels of government

Anti-Monopoly Laws, especially all forms of media ownership and inordinate cartel influence over our media
Repatriation of all our national assets and primary inductors to Acetralia with Acetralian companying assets and primary

industry to Australia with Australian ownership restored
Rehabilitation of the People's Bank to all levels of government, and the repatriation of all personal and private debt as a legitimate function of national security
Rehabilitation of all our learning institutions - civics and our rich cultural heritage, the three Rs and Classical education :- grammar, logic and rhetoric

• Open, Accountable and Responsible Vote – an open and full record of responsibility and accountability of the voter

• A full Constitutional Review through a series of open public conventions attended by popularly elected representatives. Originating at the local government level, then the state and working through to conclusion at the federal level.

Is there a Statesman or Stateswoman who will stand on this platform?

Will those who claim themselves statesman and stateswomen initiate their own campaign of educational service for the community? And will they continue on this campaign of service until these objectives are achieved?

Will voters also commit to placing the sitting member last for every election and only vote in order of priority for those candidates who will implement the 'Keys to Unlocking Democracy' policies? This is a longterm strategy for the restoration of democracy within Australia.

Hare-Clarke

Within the 'Keys to Unlocking Democracy' is the Hare-Clarke voting method. The purpose behind this existing electoral work-practice for both the ACT and Tasmania, is the reduction of the dominating influence of the two major political parties. The existing single-seatelectorate system barely achieves 50% representation from the voters except through the flow of preferences. By having lower house "regions" of 5 or 7 seats allows a clearer reflection of the people's choices for representation.

Under Hare-Clarke in a five-seat-electorate region, there is the potential for 5/6ths of the voting public finding first preference representation within the parliament.

Under Hare-Clarke in a seven-seat-electorate region, there is the potential for 7/8ths of the voting public finding first preference representation within the parliament.

What is Hare-Clark?

The Hare-Clark counting system is used in Tasmania (and in a form in the ACT-ed) to elect five Members to each division (region-ed) of the Tasmanian House of Assembly.

Hare-Clark is a Single Transferable Vote (STV) method of proportional representation. STV means that a ballot paper moves between candidates as determined by the elector's marked preferences. The Australian Senate also uses a proportional representation counting system, although their counting system has some significant differences to Hare-Clark.

Hare-Clark enables parties, groups and independents to be elected to the House of Assembly in proportion to their support in the division (region-ed). In other words, compared to other counting systems, the composition of the Lower House more closely reflects the proportion of primary votes for each party on a state-wide (and regionwide-ed) basis.

Where does the name Hare-Clark come from?

Thomas **Hare** was an Englishman who, in 1856, proposed the idea of a proportional representation election system which was further developed and became known as the Hare system.

Andrew Inglis **Clark**, Tasmania's Attorney-General from 1887-92 and 1894-97, proposed a modified version of the Hare system which became Tasmanian law in 1896. This is now known as the **Hare-Clark** electoral system and it has been used statewide since 1907.

The ballot paper displays multiple columns of candidate names. Each registered political party can nominate candidates to appear in a single column under the party name. A group of other candidates can nominate to run together in a column however without a column title. The order of these columns across the ballot paper is determined by a draw. All ungrouped candidates are listed in the final column.

Under Hare-Clark, electors must mark preferences for individual candidates unlike the Australian Senate ballot papers which include above-the-line voting where electors can choose a specific party or other column of candidates.

While the term Hare-Clark was originally given to just the process of counting votes, more recently it has taken on a broader meaning to also include a specific ballot paper configuration and rotation of candidate names (Robson Rotation).

Robson Rotation is a process of rotating candidate names within each column so that the advantage of appearing at the top of the column or directly below another popular candidate are shared equally between candidates. Neil Robson, a former member of the House of Assembly, introduced the process to the Tasmanian Parliament in 1979.

Note: In Victoria and WA, their modified constitutions have sneakily placed their Upper House elections into regions in order to stifle any view for the benefit of the 'state as a whole', similar to our Senate at the federal level. This needs to be reviewed for their Upper House to better reflect the view of 'benefit for the state as a whole'.

More than half of US households paid no federal income tax last year

Australian family situations would be little different. Combined with the "No Jab, No Work" corporate initiative places compounding pressures upon all Australians. In a healthy development, originating naturally from the grassroots, is a marked increase in informative newsworthy emails. Perhaps the Internet does hold this key to the dissolution of the mainstream media monopolies and censorship by omission.
